20	Section 1. Section 211(a) introductory paragraph of the act
21	of December 7, 1982 (P.L.784, No.225), known as the Dog Law, is

23	Section 211. Revocation or refusal of kennel licenses.
24	(a) General powers of secretaryThe secretary shall revoke
25	a kennel license, dealer license or out-of-state dealer license

1 if a licensee is convicted of a violation of 18 Pa.C.S. § 5511 2 (relating to cruelty to animals) or of substantially similar conduct pursuant to the Animal Welfare Act (Public Law 89-544, 7 3 U.S.C. § 2131 et seq.), 18 U.S.C. § 48 (relating to animal 4 crushing) or a cruelty law of another state. The secretary shall 5 not issue a kennel license, dealer license or out-of-state 6 7 dealer license to a person that has been convicted of a 8 violation of 18 Pa.C.S. § 5511 within the last ten years. The secretary may revoke or refuse to issue a kennel license, dealer 9 10 license or out-of-state dealer license for any one or more of 11 the following reasons: * * * 12 13 Section 2. The act is amended by adding sections to read: 14 Section 222. Importation or sale of dogs. 15 Notwithstanding the provisions of section 908, a dealer or 16 kennel may not import for sale, sell or offer for sale, including a sale for research purposes, a dog bred by a person 17 who has received any of the following from the United States 18 19 Department of Agriculture as authorized under the Animal Welfare 20 Act (Public Law 89-544, 7 U.S.C. § 2131 et seq.) and its 21 attendant regulations: 22 (1) A citation for a direct or critical violation or citations for three or more indirect or noncritical 23 24 violations during the two-year period before the procurement_ 25 of the dog. 26 (2) Two consecutive citations for no access to a housing 27 facility before the procurement of the dog. Section 909. Whistleblower protection. 28 An employee of a business, nonprofit entity or government 29 entity subject to this act shall be deemed to be an employee 30

6	be deemed to be an employer under the Whistleblower Law with
7	regard to a good faith report of a potential violation of this
8	act or the Animal Welfare Act.
9	Section 3. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
