My name is Eileen Miller. I hope you are starting off your new year well, healthy, and looking forward to working with your colleagues in preparation for the year's 2023 session. I would like to bring your attention to the Co-Sponsorship emails you received on the ENHANCED DRIVER RESPONSIBILITY (While operating an interactive wireless communication device SB37). I am simply asking you to dedicate 5 minutes to review SB37 and consider sponsoring and working to support its passage.
