

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AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 1

provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3

schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4

laws relating thereto," in school health services, providing 5

for Menstrual Hygiene Products Accessibility Grant Program;

and making an appropriation. 7

- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8
- hereby enacts as follows: 9
- Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known 10
- as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 11
- section to read: 12

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- Section 1426. Menstrual Hygiene Products Accessibility Grant 13
- Program. -- (a) The Menstrual Hygiene Products Accessibility 14
- Grant Program is established. 15
- 16 (b) A grant recipient shall:
- (1) Use the grant award to acquire and distribute menstrual 17
- hygiene products at no expense to students, including installing 18
- and maintaining a dispensing machine or disposal receptacle for 19
- menstrual hygiene products. 20

- 1 (2) Ensure that menstrual hygiene products are accessible to
- 2 <u>a student regardless of the student's gender identity.</u>
- 3 (c) A public school entity shall be eligible to receive a
- 4 grant under the program if the public school entity has fifty
- 5 percent or more students enrolled who are eligible for free or
- 6 reduced-cost lunch under 42 U.S.C. Ch. 13 (relating to school
- 7 <u>lunch programs</u>).
- 8 (d) The department shall develop annual grant application
- 9 forms for eligible public school entities that seek a grant
- 10 under the program. At a minimum, the forms shall contain the
- 11 <u>following information:</u>
- 12 (1) The number of students enrolled at the eligible public
- 13 school entity.
- 14 (2) The number of restrooms, including gender-neutral
- 15 restrooms, on the property of the eligible public school entity.
- 16 (e) The following shall apply:
- 17 (1) The department shall implement and administer the
- 18 program and award grants to eligible public school entities that
- 19 apply in an amount that is proportionate to the number of
- 20 students and restrooms as provided in the eligible public school
- 21 entity's application.
- 22 (2) The department may promulgate rules and regulations
- 23 necessary to implement the program.
- 24 (f) After review of the information provided in each
- 25 eligible public school entity's submitted application form, the
- 26 <u>department shall determine whether to award money from the</u>
- 27 program to the eligible public school entity and, if so, the
- 28 <u>amount of the program money awarded.</u>
- 29 (q) The following shall apply:
- 30 (1) Within one year of being awarded a grant, each eligible

- 1 public school entity that received a grant shall submit a report
- 2 to the department. The report shall include information
- 3 concerning the amount of money spent on the acquisition and
- 4 distribution of menstrual hygiene products and the amount of
- 5 money spent on the installation and maintenance of a dispensing
- 6 machine or disposal receptacle for menstrual hygiene products.
- 7 (2) Within one year of receiving reports from eligible
- 8 public school entities that received a grant, the department
- 9 shall submit a summarized report of the information received
- 10 under paragraph (1) to the Education Committee of the Senate and
- 11 the Education Committee of the House of Representatives.
- 12 (h) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 13 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 14 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 15 "Department" means the Department of Education of the
- 16 <u>Commonwealth</u>.

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- 17 "Program" means the Menstrual Hygiene Products Accessibility
- 18 Grant Program established under subsection (a).
- "Menstrual hygiene products" means tampons, sanitary napkins
- 20 or pads, pantyliners and similar menstrual hygiene products.
- 21 "Public school entity" means any public school, including a
- 22 school district, charter school, regional charter school,
- 23 intermediate unit or area career and technical school operating
- 24 within this Commonwealth.
- 25 Section 2. The sum of \$100,000 is appropriated from the
- 26 General Fund to the Department of Education for the Menstrual
- 27 Hygiene Products Accessibility Grant Program.
- 28 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
