AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4 laws relating thereto," in preliminary provisions, further 5 providing for definitions; in pupils and attendance, 6 providing for educational oversight for students in 7 facilities, further providing for possession of weapons 8 prohibited and providing for school stability for certain 9 students; in safe schools, further providing for definitions 10 and for reporting and establishing the School-Based Diversion 11 Programs Fund; in school security, further providing for 12 powers and duties and providing for limitations on 13 proceedings and arrest; and, in school districts of the first 14 class, repealing provisions relating to placement of certain 15 adjudicated students. 16

- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 17
- hereby enacts as follows: 18
- Section 1. Section 102 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, 1.9
- No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by 20
- adding a definition to read: 21
- Section 102. Definitions. -- When used in this act, the 22
- following words and phrases shall have the following meanings: 23
- * * * 24

- 1 "Weapon." A firearm which is designed to, or may readily be
- 2 converted to, expel a projectile capable of a lethal outcome by
- 3 the action of an explosive. The term includes a firearm which is
- 4 not loaded or lacks a clip or other component required to render
- 5 the firearm immediately operable and components which can
- 6 readily be assembled into a weapon, including the frame or
- 7 receiver of a firearm.
- 8 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 9 Section 1306.3. Educational Oversight for Students in
- 10 Facilities. -- (a) No later than January 1, 2025, the department
- 11 shall develop a licensing, oversight and monitoring process for
- 12 education programs in facilities to ensure that students
- 13 receiving education services in a facility receive the same
- 14 academic instruction required for public schools under 22 Pa.
- 15 Code Ch. 4 (relating to academic standards and assessment). The
- 16 licensing process shall include:
- 17 (1) Annual site visits to all providers of educational
- 18 services in facilities.
- 19 (2) Data collection and annual reporting requirements for
- 20 all providers of educational services in facilities. Reporting
- 21 shall include documentation of all educational programming
- 22 provided and relevant student outcomes by race and ethnicity,
- 23 gender and disability status.
- 24 (3) An annual report sent to the General Assembly and posted
- 25 on a publicly accessible Internet website that aggregates
- 26 relevant student outcomes and makes recommendations for
- 27 improvements to educational programming in facilities.
- 28 (b) The department shall provide support to a student who
- 29 is:
- 30 (i) transitioning from the student's school of origin to a

- 1 facility;
- 2 (ii) not enrolled in the student's school of origin as a
- 3 result of placement in a facility; and
- 4 (iii) transitioning from a facility back to the student's
- 5 school of origin or to another school.
- 6 (c) The Department of Human Services, as a component of its
- 7 licensing obligations of residential placements, shall adopt a
- 8 process to promptly refer any complaints or concerns regarding
- 9 education in facilities to the department.
- 10 (d) For purposes of this section:
- 11 "Department" shall mean the Department of Education of the
- 12 Commonwealth.
- 13 "Facility" shall mean a setting, including a children's
- 14 institution, youth development center, camp or other facility at
- 15 which a child is held as a result of the child's alleged or
- 16 actual dependency or delinquency under 42 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63
- 17 (relating to juvenile matters).
- 18 "Relevant student outcomes" shall include:
- 19 (1) For students receiving educational services in
- 20 <u>facilities</u>, total credits earned, credits earned in areas
- 21 necessary for graduation, assessment tests in reading and
- 22 mathematics, grade-level promotion and graduation rates.
- 23 (2) For students exiting facilities, prompt enrollment,
- 24 appropriate school placement, including the percentage of
- 25 students returned to the students' school of origin, transfer of
- 26 credits earned and on-time graduation rates.
- 27 "Support" shall mean the requirements for a school entity
- 28 <u>under section 1331.1.</u>
- 29 Section 3. Section 1317.2(g) of the act is amended to read:
- 30 Section 1317.2. Possession of Weapons Prohibited. --* * *

- 1 [(g) As used in this section, the term "weapon" shall
- 2 include, but not be limited to, any knife, cutting instrument,
- 3 cutting tool, nunchaku, firearm, shotgun, rifle and any other
- 4 tool, instrument or implement capable of inflicting serious
- 5 bodily injury.]
- 6 Section 4. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 7 Section 1318.2. School Stability for Certain Students.--(a)
- 8 Before the court makes an order under 42 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63
- 9 (relating to juvenile matters) or because the student has been
- 10 adjudged to have committed a crime under an adult criminal
- 11 proceeding that is likely to affect the student's school
- 12 placement, the court shall consider the student's educational
- 13 needs and stability. The court shall determine on the record the
- 14 school placement that is in the student's best interest and
- 15 protective of the community, prioritizing in order:
- 16 (1) The student remaining in the student's school of origin
- 17 in the community.
- 18 (2) The student attending the least restrictive school
- 19 setting that is in the student's best interest and protective of
- 20 the community.
- 21 (3) The student participating virtually in the student's
- 22 school of origin if the student is able to make meaningful
- 23 progress through virtual learning.
- 24 (b) In making the best interest determination under
- 25 subsection (a), the court shall consider how the school
- 26 placement will address the student's needs, including any needs
- 27 identified as part of an agreement under section 504 of the
- 28 Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Public Law 93-112, 29 U.S.C. § 701
- 29 et seg.) or an individualized education plan developed in 20
- 30 U.S.C. Ch. 33 (relating to education of individuals with

- 1 disabilities).
- 2 (c) Except as provided in subsection (d), at least 14 days
- 3 prior to a student who is in out-of-home placement as a result
- 4 of being adjudicated delinguent under 42 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63 or
- 5 adjudged to have committed a crime under an adult criminal
- 6 proceeding is released from such placement, the following shall
- 7 <u>occur:</u>
- 8 (1) The student, the student's parent, quardian, caregiver
- 9 or educational decision maker, the student's attorney, a
- 10 representative of the student's school of origin and a
- 11 representative of probation shall participate in a best interest
- 12 determination meeting to discuss school placement options and
- 13 make a recommendation to the court that prioritizes education in
- 14 the least restrictive setting with appropriate support.
- 15 Additional interested parties to the student's case, including,
- 16 if applicable, a victim or victim's representative and any other
- 17 advocates for the student, may also provide input.
- 18 (2) The student's school of origin shall develop a
- 19 transition and graduation plan for the student, subject to the
- 20 requirements of section 1331.1 and any individualized education
- 21 plan developed in accordance with 22 Pa. Code § 14.131 (relating
- 22 to IEP) and 20 U.S.C. Ch. 33, that includes academic goals and
- 23 <u>information on credit transfers</u>, identifies school and community
- 24 <u>services appropriate to the needs of the student and establishes</u>
- 25 remaining graduation requirements.
- 26 (3) The court shall hold a hearing to determine the
- 27 appropriate educational placement for the student upon the
- 28 student's release from out-of-home placement, subject to the
- 29 <u>requirements under subsection (e).</u>
- 30 (d) The inability to complete the requirements under

- 1 subsection (c) shall not delay the release of a student from
- 2 out-of-home placement. If such requirements cannot be met at
- 3 least fourteen (14) days prior to release, the requirements must
- 4 be completed as soon as practical but no later than seven (7)
- 5 days after release from placement.
- 6 (e) Except as provided under section 1318.1, a student
- 7 returning from placement as a result of being adjudicated
- 8 delinquent under 42 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63 or who has been adjudged to
- 9 have committed a crime under an adult criminal proceeding shall
- 10 be returned directly to the student's school of origin unless
- 11 the court finds, by clear and convincing evidence, and enters
- 12 those findings in the record orally and in writing, that
- 13 returning to the school of origin is not in the best interest of
- 14 the student or protective of the community. If the court finds
- 15 that the return of the student to the student's school of origin
- 16 is not in the best interest of the student or protection of the
- 17 community, the court shall order the student to be enrolled in
- 18 the least restrictive school setting that best meets the
- 19 student's needs, prioritizing placement in the school district
- 20 where the student resides. The student is entitled to attend a
- 21 public school if the student so chooses. Factors quiding a
- 22 determination regarding school placement under this section
- 23 shall include:
- 24 (1) The recommendation resulting from the best interest
- 25 determination meeting under subsection (c)(1).
- 26 (2) The transition and graduation plans developed under
- 27 subsection (c)(2).
- 28 (3) The appropriateness of the current educational setting
- 29 considering the student's needs, including any needs identified
- 30 as part of an agreement under section 504 of the Rehabilitation

- 1 Act of 1973 or an individualized education plan developed in
- 2 accordance with 22 Pa. Code § 14.131 and 20 U.S.C. Ch. 33.
- 3 (4) The proximity of the school of origin relative to the
- 4 location of the student's residence after returning from
- 5 placement.
- 6 (5) The protection of the community.
- 7 (f) A student may not be subject to any school disciplinary
- 8 action upon returning to the student's school of origin for any
- 9 conduct that occurred prior to the student entering placement.
- 10 Section 5. The definition of "weapon" in section 1301-A of
- 11 the act is amended to read:
- 12 Section 1301-A. Definitions.--* * *
- ["Weapon" shall include, but not be limited to, any knife,

- 17 Section 6. Section 1303-A(b)(3.1), (4.1)(i) and (ii) and
- 18 (4.2) of the act are amended to read:
- 19 Section 1303-A. Reporting.--* * *
- 20 (b) Each chief school administrator shall report to the
- 21 office by July 31 of each year all new incidents involving acts
- 22 of violence, possession of a weapon or possession, use or sale
- 23 of controlled substances as defined in the act of April 14, 1972
- 24 (P.L.233, No.64), known as "The Controlled Substance, Drug,
- 25 Device and Cosmetic Act," or possession, use or sale of alcohol
- 26 or tobacco by any person on school property. The incidents to be
- 27 reported to the office shall include all incidents involving
- 28 conduct that constitutes a criminal offense listed under
- 29 paragraphs (4.1) and (4.2). Reports on a form to be developed
- 30 and provided by the office shall include:

- 1 Section 7. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 2 Section 1314-A. School-Based Diversion Programs Fund. -- (a)
- 3 The School-Based Diversion Programs Fund is established as a
- 4 separate fund in the State Treasury.
- 5 (b) The sources of money for the fund are as follows:
- 6 (1) Appropriations.
- 7 (2) Money from any other source.
- 8 (3) Return on the money in the fund.
- 9 (c) The money in the fund shall be appropriated on a
- 10 continuing basis to the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and
- 11 Delinquency for the purposes under subsection (d).
- 12 (d) The fund shall be administered by the Pennsylvania
- 13 Commission on Crime and Delinquency as follows:

- 23 (2) The information shall be updated by the court with
- 24 information pertaining to treatment reports and supervision
- 25 plans or any other information deemed necessary by the
- 26 transition plan and assure appropriate placement of the
- 27 student.]
- 28 Section 11. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
