SIGNS OF OVERDOSE

- Small, constricted "pinpoint pupils."
- Falling asleep or losing consciousness.
- · Slow, weak, or not breathing.
- · Choking or gurgling sounds.
- . Cold and/or clammy skin.
- Discolored skin, especially lips and nails.
- · Limp body.

A HAT TO DO

- 1. Cati 911 Immediately.
- 2. Administer naloxone, if available.
- 3. Try to keep the person awake and breathing.
- 4. Lay the person on their side to prevent choking.
- 5. Stay with the person until emergency assistance arrives.
