

PUBLIC SAFETY ALERT: FENTANYL KILLS

The State of Florida is responding to an increase in fentanyl overdoses. All Floridians are advised to remain vigilant of current public risk.

SIGNS OF OVERDOSE

- Small, constricted "pinpoint pupils."
- Falling asleep or losing consciousness.
- Slow, weak, or not breathing.
- Choking or gurgling sounds.
- Cold and/or clammy skin.
- Discolored skin, especially lips and nails.
- Limp body.

WHAT TO DO

1. Call 911 Immediately.
2. Administer naloxone, if available.
3. Try to keep the person awake and breathing.
4. Lay the person on their side to prevent choking.
5. Stay with the person until emergency assistance arrives.
