AN ACT

1 Amending the act of May 31, 1893 (P.L.188, No.138), entitled "An
2 act designating the days and half days to be observed as
3 legal holidays, and for the payment, acceptance and
4 protesting of bills, notes, drafts, checks and other
5 negotiable paper on such days," further providing for the
6 designation of legal holidays; and making a repeal.

7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8 hereby enacts as follows:

9 Section 1. Section 1 of the act of May 31, 1893 (P.L.188,
10 No.138), referred to as the Legal Holiday Law, is amended to
11 read:

12 Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the following days and
13 half days, namely: the first day of January, commonly called New
14 Year's Day, the third Monday of January, known as Dr. Martin
15 Luther King, Jr. Day, the third Monday of February, known as
16 Presidents' Day, Good Friday, the last Monday in May, known as
17 Memorial Day, the fourteenth day of June, known as Flag Day, the
18 fourth of July, called Independence Day, the first Monday of
19 September, known as Labor Day, [the second Monday in October,

1 known as Columbus Day,] the first Tuesday after the first Monday
2 of November, Election Day, the eleventh day of November, known
3 as Veterans' Day, the fourth Thursday in November, known as
4 Thanksgiving Day, the twenty-fifth day of December, known as
5 Christmas Day; and every Saturday, after twelve o'clock noon
6 until twelve o'clock midnight, each of which Saturdays is hereby
7 designated a half holiday; and any day appointed or recommended
8 by the Governor of this State or the President of the United
9 States as a day of thanksgiving or fastings and prayer, or other
10 religious observance; and in the event of a financial crisis in
11 the State or Nation, any day or days appointed by the Governor
12 of this State or the President of the United States as a bank
13 holiday; and in the event of public calamity in any part of the
14 State through fire, flood, famine, violence, riot, insurrection,
15 or enemy action, any day or days appointed by the Governor of
16 this State as a bank holiday for banking institutions affected
17 by such public calamity shall, for all purposes whatever as
18 regards the presenting for payment or acceptance, and as regards
19 the protesting and giving notice of the dishonor of bills of
20 exchange, checks, drafts, and promissory notes, made after the
21 passage of this act, be treated and considered as the first day
22 of the week, commonly called Sunday, and as public holidays and
23 half holidays; and all such bills, checks, drafts, and notes
24 otherwise presentable for acceptance or payment on any of the
25 said days, shall be deemed to be payable and be presentable for
26 acceptance or payment on the secular or business day next
27 succeeding such holiday or half holiday; except checks, drafts,
28 bills of exchange, and promissory notes, payable at sight or on
29 demand, which would otherwise be payable on any half holiday
30 Saturday, shall be deemed to be payable at or before twelve

1 o'clock noon of such half holiday: Provided, however, That for
2 the purpose of protesting or otherwise holding liable any party
3 to any bill of exchange, check, draft, or promissory note, and
4 which shall not have been paid before twelve o'clock noon of any
5 Saturday designated a half holiday as aforesaid, a demand for
6 acceptance or payment thereof shall not be made, and notice of
7 protest or dishonor thereof shall not be given, until the next
8 succeeding secular or business day: And provided further, That
9 when any person, firm, corporation or company shall, on any
10 Saturday designated a half holiday, receive for collection any
11 check, bill of exchange, draft, or promissory note, such person,
12 firm, corporation, or company shall not be deemed guilty of any
13 neglect or omission of duty, nor incur any liability, in not
14 presenting for payment or acceptance or collection such check,
15 bill of exchange, draft or promissory note, on that day: And
16 provided further, That, in construing this section, every
17 Saturday designated a half holiday shall, until twelve o'clock
18 noon, be deemed a secular or business day; and the days and half
19 days aforesaid, so designated as holidays and half holidays,
20 shall be considered as public holidays and half holidays for all
21 purposes whatsoever as regards the transaction of business,
22 except that any day or days appointed as a bank holiday shall be
23 regarded as secular or business days for all other purposes than
24 those mentioned in this act: And provided further, That nothing
25 herein contained shall be construed to prevent or invalidate the
26 entry, issuance, service, or execution of any writ, summons,
27 confession of judgment, or other legal process whatever, on any
28 of the holidays or half holidays herein designated as holidays;
29 nor to prevent any banking institution from keeping its doors
30 open or transacting its business, on any Saturday afternoon, if

1 by a vote of its directors it shall elect to do so, unless such
2 Saturday is appointed as a bank holiday under the provisions of
3 this act: And provided further, That any banking institution
4 may, by a vote of its directors, or in the case of a private
5 bank by action of the private banker or bankers, notice of which
6 shall have been posted in its banking house for not less than
7 fifteen days before the taking effect thereof, observe any
8 Saturday throughout the year as a full holiday with like effect
9 hereunder as though such day had been designated as a full
10 holiday by the provisions of this act, and may in the same
11 manner, observe as a full holiday any Monday next following the
12 first day of January, the fourth day of July or the twenty-fifth
13 day of December whenever any of such holidays shall occur on a
14 Saturday with like effect hereunder as though such day had been
15 designated as a full holiday by the provisions of this act.

16 Section 2. Repeals are as follows:

17 (1) The General Assembly declares that the repeal under
18 paragraph (2) is necessary to effectuate the amendment of
19 section 1 of the act.

20 (2) The act of August 13, 1963 (P.L.660, No.345),
21 entitled "An act providing for the observance of October 12
22 of each year as Columbus Day," is repealed.

23 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
