In fact, the moneys of $\$ 25,000$, which is in reaction to a request from the Senate, incidentally, to be introduced here in the House which is where a nonpreferred appropriation must originate, is, in fact, for the Children's Diagnostic Service Center, which happens to be located in the Harrisburg Hospital, but it is, in fact, not a part of Harrisburg Hospital.
Specifically, it services the central Pennsylvania area and services children whose ailments are complicated and frequently unable to be diagnosed by a regular hospital or a regular pediatrician or a clinic. This services more than just Harrisburg and extends far beyond the Dauphin County area, and the moneys, in fact, are going to cover, as I understand it or at least as best as we can determine, the cost of maintenance, equipment leasing, that is to say, inside of Harrisburg Hospital, and so forth, but, in fact, the recipient of the service of the $\$ 25,000$ is, in fact, the Children's Diagnostic Service.

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Lackawanna, Mr. Zitterman.

Mr. ZITTERMAN. Mr. Speaker, I was going to ask for an explanation of this new appropriation, Mr. Speaker, and I thank my colleague, Mr. Reed, for the explanation.

In HB 1287 there is a new appropriation and comes at a time when our Governor had said that we should cut spending and, in the process, to eliminate state hospistals to save the money involved in these losses.

I am going to vote for this appropriation, Mr. Speaker, but I would like everyone to know that in these new appropriations there is no money for funding, and that we should fund whatever hospitals and things that we have right now. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, serving on the board of directors for quite a few years with the blind association in our area and knowing the tremendous program that they do have, I have watched this for years as these various organizations have been added. I see other groups added to this, and I think all of us have blind associations doing a tremendous job in our areas and I think that all of the areas, rather than just a few, should get what I call some of the action. I know that it looks to me like a new one has been added here. Delaware County last year got it, and Rudolphy-I
do not remember hearing that one before.
I am a strong fighter for the blind. I want that known. The only thing is, we have one in the Lehigh Valley that is a very outstanding blind program, and we were always told that they have to go through the regular Department of Health operation, but other people do not have to and that is what bothers me. I think we are being what you call selective here and I think that every group here that has a blind association in their area is doing just as good a job as anybody else, and I think we all should have a chance. They may say, well, why did you not submit an amendment? I was told last year I could not; they were not going to accept it. So here we are, right back where we started from again, and I wish that since there are some passed over, I would like to interrogate the Appropriations Committee chairman if the gentleman does not mind.
The SPEAKER. Does the gentleman, Mr. McClatchy, consent to be interrogated? The gentleman, Mr. Zeller, may proceed.
Mr . ZELLER. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

My problem is this: Last year I asked them, and even before that, about blind associations in various areas. They said some of these, like Pittsburgh and the Greater Pittsburgh Guild for the Blind and some of those we knew about that were in large populous areas, were doing a tremendous job, and we knew that, and Beacon Lodge we all know. We were told at that time that you have to go through the regular department appropriations that are set up. Now here I see more added. I think last session Delaware County was added, now Rudolphy. Is it possible that if I were to send an amendment for the Lehigh Valley Blind Association and the tremendous program they have up there, we could receive any favorable action from the Appropriations Committee for a grant to them?
Mr. McCLATCHY. All the requests presented to the Appropriations Committee are considered, certainly.
Mr. ZELLER. I understand that, but can we get any kind of assurance, if we can show you in black and white what kind of program we have, that we, too, can be included in a grant of, let us say, $\$ 25,000$ ?
Mr. McCLATCHY. I am sure that if you bring it before us, we will consider it.
Mr. ZELLER. I would like to also state at this time that there will be an amendment, becuase I see that there are some held over here. There will be an amendment placed to help our Lehigh Valley Blind Association that will be submitted this coming week. Thank you.
Mr. McCLATCHY. I think that you will need a separate bill though, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. LEVI. Mr. Speaker, on the next series of bills, all relating to cerebral palsy, I am going to vote in the negative, and I would like to explain my reasons why.
I think the program is an excellent program, but they do run fund drives locally; they do run telethons statewide; they do run telethons nationwide to raise their funds. I just think we are getting into an area where the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania should not be subsidizing certain counties and certain local agencies and not the whole Commonwealth in this particular field. This is my reason that I am going to be voting in the negative on this series of bills.

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Northampton, Mr. Schweder.

## Mr. SCHWEDER. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Just maybe as a brief explanation for the gentleman who just spoke, this is the second year that these appropriations have appeared before us as nonpreferreds. If you may recall, we placed this money that was passed last year in the budget, and then it was removed to nonpreferreds. The reason that this money has been placed in here is that this money is merely replacement money for what these facilities should be entitled to from the Department of Welfare, but because of Federal regulations, the clients of these institutions fall through the slats as far as definitions.

These people are afflicted with a physical disability, but they are mentally alert and, in order to qualify for the funds that are needed from the Department of Welfare and the Department of Health, they have to be listed as mentally retarded, which these institutions do not wish to do. That is the reason that this money is placed here. It is merely money that they should be entitled to, the same as all other programs in the Department of Health and the Department of Welfare, and I would hope that all the members would vote in the affirmative. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Lehigh, Mr, Zeller.

Mr. ZELLER. Mr. Speaker, what Mr. Schweder has said is true. One of the problems we have here in the House is the legislature has been very good in providing funds for MH-MR, Mental Health-Mental Retardation - Department of Health and Welfare, but when the money gets over there, that is where the problem lies in regard to allocations.

We had recently where Mr. Taylor and others here went on a drive to help our areas in the mental retardation area; I should say in our areas; and when it went in as a lump sum, you remember just a few months ago, we had to call our areas to be sure it was going to be line-itemed.
I find out now that they are not going to do that. I do not know if Mr. Taylor is aware of it, but I found out that they are not going to do that. I was just told 2 weeks ago.

Our problem lies here when it gets to that department. We mean well here, and I am not spanking the legislature, the leadership, on this. I think our intentions are great, but for the benefit of my good friend, Mr. Levi, this is where our problem lies. We have to go this route, and that is why I was requesting some of the other things. We have to go these routes evidently. They are, in effect, line-item items. In effect, that is what is happening because we are getting lost in the sauce. When they get over there, it is according to who yells the loudest in those various areas - MH-MR, UCP - United Cerebral Palsy - all these areas. They are getting the action, and we are getting hurt. So that is why I say unless we get some kind of accountability or creditability over there in that Department of Health and Welfare, this is going to continue.

So we visited with Mr. Schweder and others a few weeks ago and we saw the conditions in which they are under and the people they help. You have got to go to one of those places and see
the conditions under which they not only operate but the people they are dealing with. They need help, and I mean help.

So this is peanuts, and I mean peanuts, compared to what we send to foreign nations and all over the world and some of the other programs we have. These are people who need it. You are getting money back into the area to help people and you are not letting the bureaucrats play games with you.
So we are legislators. When we tell them what we want, they ought to do it, but they do not. This is why Mr. Schweder and others have worked hard to get some money in there.
Really, I am not spanking anybody. I am saying, please, we need the help. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the lady from Chester, Mrs. Taylor.

Mrs. TAYLOR. Mr. Speaker, I wonder if Mr. Schweder would stand for interrogation?
The SPEAKER. The gentleman indicates that he will, and the lady may proceed.
Mrs. TAYLOR. Mr. Speaker, I notice that on the calendar there are eight bills. Some of them refer to specific counties and some of them refer to maybe a region or group of counties.
I was wondering, Mr. Speaker, if you could inform me as to how many cerebral palsy associations there would be in the entire state?

Mr. SCHWEDER. I do not have an accurate number of how many there are. I am sure that there are more than this listing. These listings are only for the facilities which are used solely for clients afflicted with this. This list came from their state association last year as the facilities that they use strictly in their association and not in conjunction with others. That is why the list only lists these six institutions as those receiving money.

Mrs. TAYLOR. So it is the institution then, Mr. Speaker, that is receiving the money and not the association?

Mr. SCHWEDER. Right. It is not going to the association. It is for the program where they actually have a facility where they bring the patients or clients in there each day, and the funds only go to that. It is not to any association to simply raise money for it; it is where the facilities are located.
Mrs. TAYLOR. Then, Mr. Speaker, would I be correct in concluding that there would be none of these institutions in southeastern Pennsylvania, such as in Delaware County, Montgomery County, Bucks County, Chester County?
Mr. SCHWEDER. Yes. I know that the Lehigh Valley facility provides for upper Bucks and Monroe as well as Lehigh and Northampton Counties. I would assume that the others take clients from outside the county where they are located.

Mrs. TAYLOR. Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker.
The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Clarion, Mr. Wright.

Mr. D. R. WRIGHT. Mr. Speaker, each time I vote on these nonpreferred appropriations, I have some concern. I am going to vote on this series of appropriations, but I think the gentleman, Mr. Levi, has raised a question perhaps not so much relevant to this particular set of appropriations but to nonpreferreds generally.

I think the humanitarian impulse of the General Assembly is commendable, but I would hope at some point that we could establish as a General Assembly some criteria by which we judge these nonpreferred appropriations. It seems to me that we are in grave danger of becoming the community chest of the Commonwealth. We have some difficulty appropriating funds for the legitimate functions of government, so I would hope and I would encourage establishing some standards by which we can judge these appropriations.
There are worthy programs in my own district of a humanitarian nature that deserve additional funds, but I am reluctant to present that as a nonpreferred appropriation. If this trend continues, Mr. Speaker, I suspect that all of us will be obligated, obliged in representing our people to present these kinds of appropriations. I thank you, Mr. Speaker.
