REORGANIZATION PLAN NO. 2 PRESENTED

The Secretary to the Governor presented the following communication from His Excellency, the Governor:

REORGANIZATION PLAN No. 2.

TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA:

By the authority vested in me by the Act of April 7, 1955 (P. L. 23, No. 8), known as the "Reorganization Act of 1955", I transmit herewith Reorganization Plan No. 2 of 1980. The purpose of this proposed plan is to transfer to the Department of Community Affairs from the Department of Labor and Industry the Pennsylvania State Fire Commissioner and the functions, powers and duties vested in the Office of the Pennsylvania State Fire Commissioner.

The responsibility of the Department of Community Affairs is to coordinate grants, subsidies, consultive services, technical assistance, and state and federal programs affecting political subdivisions. The Office of the State Fire Commissioner is an important part of the network of programs and services provided by the Commonwealth for the benefit of local governments. The Fire Commissioner coordinates the activities of State and community organizations engaged in fire prevention and control. The Fire Commissioner is responsible for the collection of data relative to fires, property damage injuries and loss of life. Through the Office of Fire Commissioner, programs are designed to create a public awareness of the incidence and ravages of fire and the methods individuals can take to prevent fire and minimize loss when it occurs.

This Reorganization Plan, together with Reorganization Plan No. 3 of 1980, will effectively centralize state efforts in support of local fire prevention and control activities in the Department of Community Affairs. The Department currently administers the Volunteer Fire Company Loan Fund, and Reorganization Plan No. 2 proposes the transfer of the State Fire Commissioner to the Department by centralizing programs in support of local fire prevention and control in a department dedicated to assisting political subdivisions. I hope to better coordinate these fire control programs and better integrate them with other Commonwealth programs administered for the benefit of local governments.

I, therefore, transmit to you and urge your approval of Reorganization Plan No. 2 of 1980.

REORGANIZATION PLAN NO. 2

Section 1. The Pennsylvania State Fire Commissioner and the functions, powers and duties invested in the Office of the Pennsylvania State Fire Commissioner, said functions, powers

and duties being to coordinate the activities of State and local community interests engaged in fire prevention and control activities; to serve as focal point for information relative to fires, property damage, injuries and the loss of life; to disseminate through periodic reports information about fire prevention efforts and fire control techniques; to develop and participate in a program of public information and education designed to create a public awareness of the incidence and the ravages of fire and methods the individual can take to prevent them and to minimize loss when they occur; and to serve as central point to support local interests and their efforts in all manners pertinent to fire prevention and control, are hereby transferred from the Department of Labor and Industry to the Department of Community Affairs.

Section 2. There are hereby transferred to the Department of Community Affairs, to be used, employed and expended in connection with the functions, powers and duties transferred by section 1, the position of the State Fire Commissioner, contract obligations, if any, records, files, property, supplies and equipment now being used or held in connection with such functions, powers and duties, and the unexpended balance of appropriations, allocations, Federal grants and other funds available or to be made available for use in connection with such functions, powers and duties.

TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA:

By the authority vested in me by the Act of April 7, 1955 (P. L. 23, No. 8), known as the "Reorganization Act of 1955", I transmit herewith Reorganization Plan No. 3 of 1980. The purpose of this proposed plan is to transfer the Pennsylvania State Firemen's Training School from the Department of Education to the Department of Community Affairs.

The responsibility of the Department of Community Affairs is to coordinate grants, subsidies, consultive services, technical assistance, and state and federal programs affecting political subdivisions. The Firemen's Training School is an important part of the network of programs and services provided by the Commonwealth for the benefit of local government. The School trains instructors, fire department officers, advanced firefighters and provides specialized courses in new methods of fire suppression. The 1,400 individuals trained at the Fire School annually are responsible for the local training of over 12,000 local volunteer firemen each year.

This Reorganization Plan, together with Reorganization Plan No. 2 of 1980 will effectively centralize state efforts in support of local fire prevention and control activities in the Department of Community Affairs. The Department currently administers the Volunteer Fire Company Loan Fund, and Reorganization Plan No. 2 proposes the transfer of the State Fire Commissioner to the Department. By centralizing programs in support of local fire prevention and control in a department dedicated to assisting political subdivisions, I hope to better coordinate these fire control programs, and better integrate them with other Commonwealth programs administered for the benefit of local governments.

I, therefore, transmit to you and urge your approval of Reorganization Plan No. 3 of 1980.

REORGANIZATION PLAN NO. 3

Section 1. The Pennsylvania State Firemen's Training School and the powers and duties of the Department of Education and the Public Service Institute Board pertaining thereto, as set forth in the act of May 26, 1949 (P. L. 1844, No. 547), entitled "An act establishing the Pennsylvania State Firemen's Training School in or adjacent to the borough of Lewistown; providing for its operation and maintenance by the Department of Public Instruction; authorizing the acquisition of a site either by gift or purchase by the Commonwealth or by The General State Authority, or the use of land now owned by the Commonwealth; providing for the election or construction and the furnishing and equipping of the buildings and structures by The General State Authority, and the leasing thereof by the Commonwealth; and conferring powers and imposing duties upon the Department of Public Instruction and the Public Service Institute Board," heretofore transferred to the Bureau of Vocation Education in the Department of Education pursuant to Reorganization Plan No. 1 of 1973, are hereby transferred from the Bureau of Vocational Education in the Department of Education to the Department of Community Affairs.

Section 2. There are hereby transferred to the Department of Community Affairs, to be used, employed and expended in connection with the functions, powers and duties transferred by section 1 of this Reorganization Plan, personnel, contract obligations, if any, records, files, property, supplies and equipment now being used or held in connection with such functions, powers and duties, and the unexpended balance of appropriations, allocations, Federal grants and other funds available or to be made available for use in connection with such functions, powers and duties.

Section 3. The following acts and parts of acts are suspended insofar as they conflict with this Reorganization Plan:

Sections 202 and 1313, act of April 9, 1929 (P.L. 177, No. 175), known as "The Administrative Code of 1929."

The second paragraph of section 1804, act of March 10, 1949 (P. L. 30, No. 14), known as the "Public School Code of 1949," relating to the election by the State Board for Vocational Education of principals, instructors and lecturers for the Public Service Institute.

Act of May 26, 1949 (P. L. 1844, No. 547), entitled "An act establishing the Pennsylvania State Firemen's Training School in or adjacent to the borough of Lewistown; providing for its operation and maintenance by the Department of Public Instruction; authorizing the acquisition of a site either by gift or purchase by the Commonwealth or by The General State Authority, or the use of land now owned by the Commonwealth; providing for the erection or construction and the furnishing and equipping of the buildings and structures by The General State Authority, and the leasing thereof by the Commonwealth; and conferring powers and imposing duties upon the Department of Public Instruction and the Public Service Institute Board."

Mr. IRVIS. For the information of the members on this side, Mr. Speaker, I would like to interrogate the gentleman, Mr. McClatchy. I am sorry. Does the gentleman, Mr. McClatchy, have the answers as to what the amendments are to the Senate bill or does the gentleman, Mr. Ryan, have it?

The SPEAKER. Will the gentleman, Mr. McClatchy, permit himself to be interrogated? The gentleman indicates that he will. The gentleman, Mr. Irvis, may proceed.

Mr. IRVIS. Mr. Speaker, will the gentleman, Mr. McClatchy, explain briefly to the House what the Senate amendments are which were inserted for concurrence?

Mr. McCLATCHY. Yes, Mr. Speaker. The Senate put in a provision whereby all the rules and regulations for the Department of Occupational Affairs have to appear on our calendar for approval or disapproval. It is a legislative oversight.

Mr. IRVIS. That was the original purpose of the bill. Is that correct?

Mr. McCLATCHY. That is correct.

Mr. IRVIS. Were there any additional amendments inserted by the Senate?

Mr. McCLATCHY. I suspect you are talking about the entire new subject.

Mr. IRVIS. The 60-day extension.

Mr. McCLATCHY. All right, the 60 days, yes. Originally we wanted to only open up the revenue estimate or give the Budget Secretary 45 days, and they changed it to make it 60 days.

Mr. IRVIS. I thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I find no objection and I will support the motion of the majority leader.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Lancaster, Mr. Miller.

Mr. MILLER. Very briefly, to share with my colleagues, the appropriation for the Lancaster Cleft Palate Clinic, that institution that treats our Commonwealth citizens afflicted with maxillofacial abnormalities and congenital birth defects, was originally passed by this House at the appropriation level of \$40,000. It was cut by \$10,000 in the Governor's office by virtue of his bright little pencil, and I

seek to raise it back to its original level of \$40,000. I earnestly encourage your support. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Montgomery, Mr. McClatchy.

Mr. McCLATCHY. Mr. Speaker, I reluctantly support it, not because I discriminate against any cleft palate clinic, especially Mr. Miller's, but I still think the Governor will probably blue-line it down to what he originally passed it for.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Miller.

Mr. MILLER. Not to belabor the House, Mr. Speaker, but would the majority Appropriations Committee chairman kindly repeat his last comment? I failed to catch it.

Mr. McCLATCHY. It is my belief that the Governor will blue-line the amount, despite your amendment, back down to what he originally had it at, the \$30,000 figure.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Miller.

Mr. MILLER. Mr. Speaker, I thank the Appropriations Committee chairman.

This institution has been at the \$30,000 level for the past 9 years. I need not remind the members what the ravages of inflation have done in those few years. A \$10,000 increase has already passed by this House. I suggest we send an additional message to the Governor that we are interested in these issues no matter how small and that this Commonwealth recognize the fine work they are doing on behalf of all our Commonwealth citizenry. I thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. ITKIN. Would Mr. Miller stand for interrogation?

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The gentleman indicates that he will.

Mr. ITKIN. Do you have any other amendments to bills in the nonpreferred category?

Mr. MILLER. Yes, sir, Mr. Speaker. I have a similar amendment to the Pittsburgh Cleft Palate Clinic that is identical to this one except to the following bill, SB 1563.

Mr. ITKIN. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. PIEVSKY. Mr. Speaker, I urge support for Mr. Miller's amendment. We have visited this cleft palate. It does wonderful work. It gets most of its funding from private funds, and I think that we should give cleft palate the \$10,000 that is much needed for the institution to continue to work. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.
