To the Honorable, the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

I have the honor to inform you that I have this day approved and signed House Bill 61, Printer's No. 941, entitled "An act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P. L. 682, No. 284), entitled 'An act relating to insurance; amending, revising, and consolidating the law providing for the incorporation of insurance companies, and the regulation, supervision, and protection of home and foreign insurance companies, Lloyds associations, reciprocal and inter-insurance exchanges, and fire insurance rating bureaus, and the regulation and supervision of insurance carried by such companies, associations, and exchanges, including insurance carried by the State Workmen's Insurance Fund; providing penalties; and repealing existing laws,' prohibiting the issuance of certain assessable policies".

The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Schuylkill, Mr. Lucyk.

Mr. LUCYK. Mr. Speaker, I missed the votes on SB 871 and SB 880. I would like to be recorded in the affirmative.

The SPEAKER. The remarks of the gentleman will be spread upon the record.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Bedford, Mr. Dietz.

Mr. DIETZ. Mr. Speaker, I do not think I am recorded on SB 887, PN 964, and HB 1597, PN 1863. I would like to be recorded in the affirmative.

The SPEAKER. The remarks of the gentleman will be spread upon the record.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Allegheny, Mr. McVerry.

Mr. McVERRY. Mr. Speaker, I would like to be recorded in the affirmative on HB 1597, PN 1863.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Allegheny, Mr. Petrone.

Mr. PETRONE. Mr. Speaker, I would like to be recorded in the affirmative on HB 1598.

BILLS ON THIRD CONSIDERATION CONTINUED

The House proceeded to third consideration of **SB 853, PN 930**, entitled:

A Supplement to the act of April 1, 1863 (P. L. 213, No. 227), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

On the question,

Will the House agree to the bill on third consideration?

Mr. GALLAGHER offered the following amendment No. A2572:

Amend Sec. 1, page 2, by inserting between lines 9 and 10

(8) For tuition supplement to be used solely and exclusively for the purpose of negating tuition increases for the school year 1981-1982.....	10,000,000
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On the question,

Will the House agree to the amendment?

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Bucks, Mr. Gallagher.

Mr. GALLAGHER. Mr. Speaker, this amendment very simply provides an amount of \$10 million for Penn State for a tuition supplement to be used solely and exclusively for the purpose of negating tuition increases for the school year of 1981-82. This is exactly what it does; it provides that the tuition shall not be increased.

There are over 50,000 full-time-equivalent students at Penn State. They are calculating that it would cost at least \$200 for additional tuition increase to maintain the university. So with the manner in which the PHEAA - Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency - appropriation was cut from at least \$8 million that was asked and then \$2 million here, there

is no more money in PHEAA to take care of the increase. I feel the best and proper way of doing it is to put back in what we used to do in the early 1960's, in 1965 and 1966 and 1967, a tuition supplement to maintain tuition at a proper level, and this is what this amendment does. It provides \$200 per student to maintain the present tuition, and I urge the members to support this amendment.

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the majority Appropriations Committee chairman, Mr. McClatchy.

Mr. McCLATCHY. Mr. Speaker, I think this amendment demonstrates or should demonstrate to all of us the fallacy we face year after year in the budget process. We do not have \$10 million and everyone knows it. It means putting feet to the fire, those who honestly feel they have to be fiscally responsible in this tight fiscal year and say no. Those who want to be irresponsible can do the old political dance and say, here Penn State, you students, we will help you out with \$10 million we do not have. I think it reflects on those who say, oh, let us go through the amendment fight on the floor of the House. These are the kinds of games I think we get into which are unfortunate. Mr. Speaker, I urge a "no" vote on this amendment.

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Allegheny, Mr. Itkin.

Mr. ITKIN. Mr. Speaker, I would very much like to support Mr. Gallagher's amendment if, as Mr. McClatchy said, we had the money, but it is obvious that we have spent the money in the General Fund budget. We have now in the process spent the remainder of the money. And I would like to caution the House that if we put this amendment in and it goes to the Senate and they concur in this amendment and it goes to the Governor and he vetoes it and it comes back to this House and Senate and we override his veto, then the only course of action on the Governor is to abate, and what he will probably do is abate across the board all of the nonpreferred appropriations. So if we are talking about \$10 million for this institution and another perhaps \$10 million for the remaining nonpreferred institutions of higher learning, we are talking about \$20 million to be abated across the \$300-million nonpreferreds. That means about a 6-percent abatement in every nonpreferred that we pass today. Because of that, I cannot support the amendment. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Centre, Mr. Cunningham.

Mr. CUNNINGHAM. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

This is an especially anguished moment for me because it is going to be very, very difficult for me to vote in the negative on this amendment. I do, however, intend to vote in the negative.

When I initially learned of the amendment, my first reaction was, of course, this is a good thing; this is something I can support. But it only took a moment's reflection for me to realize that the money simply is not there, and as the gentleman, Mr. Itkin, has noted, the consequences of a positive vote on this amendment could be to throw the entire budgetary process in chaos. The ramifications could keep us here for a very long period of time, all to no avail. I would urge a negative vote on the amendment, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Bucks, Mr. Gallagher.

Mr. GALLAGHER. Mr. Speaker, just to reply to Mr. Itkin, we do not know exactly how much money is yet in front of us. The bill coming up behind all this is the fee bill. We do not know what the fee bill is going to generate in dollars into this treasury. We do not really know, only except what the Budget Secretary says is the amount of money in the State Treasury. I know that there are a lot of estimates by the Budget Secretary, and that is what is accepted, and all of a sudden it might be found that there is enough money to take care of this kind of problem.

This problem has to be faced, and it should be faced now. Later on this year in October under the Reagan administration there will be a lot of block grants coming into Pennsylvania, Federal funds that we will have to redistribute through the General Assembly, and you will find that there will be funds there. There will be funds in education; there will be funds for the universities and the colleges. So it is a proper time to handle this, because when we are not preparing enough funds for PHEAA for grants, the Federal Government is cutting back on basic education opportunity grants and cutting back on student loans, so it is only apropos that we recognize this problem here. There will be funds coming shortly. If you vote in favor of the fee bill, there should be adequate funds in there to handle this kind of appropriation. So I do not think you should be disillusioned by these statements by other members who are a little cautious—and they rightfully can be cautious—but these things are coming down and there is ample time for these things to come to reality.

Let us not forget that Congress will act by October, and there will be a lot of Federal funds coming into this state, to this Governor, to be redistributed through this General Assembly, and it can be handled if the Budget Secretary happens to be right on point as far as money coming into the treasury, which he is not always. So I urge the members to consider it that way and consider these amendments.

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Centre, Mr. Cunningham.

Mr. CUNNINGHAM. Mr. Speaker, if indeed at a future time additional moneys become available, then the appropriate course would be a supplemental appropriation to reallocate that new money. In point of fact, that money is not now available, and the hollow gesture on our parts of amending this kind of a piece of legislation into a nonpreferred appropriation is going to represent a Pyrrhic victory for the institution receiving the money because the money simply is not there. Again I would urge a negative vote.

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the lady from Chester, Mrs. Taylor.

Mrs. TAYLOR. Mr. Speaker, in addition to what has already been said as far as the cuts in the PHEAA loan program and the unstable condition of the guaranteed student loan program, I think we have one other thing to consider other than the fact that, you know, the money really is not there. This is just one state-related college asking for tuition relief for their students. We have, I would remind the

members, three other state-related; we have the state-owned; we have the community colleges, and all of them are facing the same problem, that problem of rising tuition. It is being felt by parents; it is being borne by students. I just suggest that as you are considering your vote for one state-related, that of Penn State, just think what is going to come along the line in the future when everyone else comes, and rightly so, to present their case.

It would be a fine thing for us to be able to help in this tuition problem during the struggling times that our colleges and universities have, but I suggest to you, Mr. Speaker, that it is not just one college you will be facing, but you will be facing that same problem in all of the others, and I urge a negative vote. Thank you.

Mr. Speaker, I oppose this amendment for the same reason we opposed the last one, and I want to congratulate the House, both the Democratic side and the Republican side, for trying to be fiscally responsible. However, no school district's gross allocation under the provisions of the sections referred to herein shall be less for the 1978-1979 [or the], 1979-1980, 1980-1981 or the 1981-1982 school year than its gross allocation under such sections for the previous school year.

Section 3. Section 1 of this act shall take effect in 60 days. Section 2 shall take effect immediately.
