No one shall be appointed pursuant to this section unless he was a registered voter and enrolled in the same political party or the same affiliation of registration as the person whose place is to be filled at the time that person was elected.

Amend Sec. 2 (Sec. 409), page 2, line 25, by striking out the brackets before and after "suitable"

Amend Sec. 2 (Sec. 409), page 2, lines 25 through 28, by striking out "WHO WAS A REGISTERED VOTER AND ENROLLED IN THE" in line 25; all of lines 26 and 27; and "WAS ELECTED" in line 28

Amend Sec. 2 (Sec. 409), page 3, line 5, by inserting after Senate."

No one shall be appointed pursuant to this section unless he was a registered voter and enrolled in the same political party or the same affiliation of registration as the person whose place is to be filled at the time that person was elected.

On the question,

Will the House agree to the amendments?

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Cumberland, Mr. Broujos.

Mr. BROUJOS. Mr. Speaker, this bill provides for the appointment of acting county row officers in situations where there is no deputy to take over the office. The bill as it is presently drafted provides that whenever a vacancy shall happen in any county office to which the Governor may appoint and there is no deputy, then the commissioners shall appoint, and there are other provisions.

The amendment proposes to require that anyone appointed pursuant to this section be a registered voter and enrolled in the same political party. As it was originally drafted, it had that requirement only for the appointment by the county commissioners. It did not have a provision for the judicial

appointment to be of the same party. This corrects the bill as it stands to be consistent for all appointments.

Mr. KOWALYSHYN called up **HR 87, PN 1042**, entitled:

Providing for the appointment of a special committee to investigate waterborne pollutants.

On the question,

Will the House adopt the resolution?

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Centre, Mr. Letterman.

Mr. LETTERMAN. Mr. Speaker, I would like to question the sponsor, please.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The gentleman, Mr. Kowalyszyn, indicates he will stand for a period of interrogation. The gentleman, Mr. Letterman, is in order and may proceed.

Mr. LETTERMAN. Mr. Speaker, could you tell me why you did not go to the Joint Air and Water Pollution Control and Conservation Committee with this? What I want to know is why do we need a special committee when we already have one assigned to the House to do that?

Mr. KOWALYSHYN. I would like to explain that on April 6 the House by a unanimous vote approved Resolution 47. HR 47 called for five members of the House to serve on this special committee.

This resolution, 87, has only one change, and that is to increase the membership of this committee to nine. There will be five members from the majority party and four members from the minority party to make this study for the House.

Mr. LETTERMAN. Mr. Speaker, I would like to make a statement, please.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The gentleman, Mr. Letterman, is in order and may proceed.

Mr. LETTERMAN. Mr. Speaker, I would think that this is a pure waste since we already have a committee that has expertise in this and everything else. I see no reason for a special committee to be appointed to this at all. We already have the specialists and the expertise to deal with this kind of problem. I would ask for a negative vote on this and have this sent to the Joint Air and Water Committee.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Northampton, Mr. Kowalyszyn.

Mr. KOWALYSHYN. Mr. Speaker, I would like to reply by saying that the committee to which Representative Letterman refers has not taken up this very serious problem in Pennsylvania. The resolution, for example, Resolution 87, begins by saying that Pennsylvania is reputed to have the highest rate of waterborne diseases in the Nation and that there are in excess of 700,000 domestic drinking-water wells in the Commonwealth. It is a serious problem, and the proposal is to have a special committee of this House devote its time and attention to this one specific problem, to assemble the necessary information so that with that information assembled, the General Assembly will be able to consider whether Pennsylvania should join so many other States which have established primacy as far as safe drinking water is concerned. So I am asking for an affirmative vote on HR 87.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Montgomery, Mr. Reber.

Mr. REBER. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I rise in support of HR 87. There is no doubt that facing the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is a serious problem, a singular problem, and that being serious water pollution of our drinking water. I think HR 87 emphasizes the importance of this and hopefully will bring about appropriate remedial legislation and aid and assistance to this problem. I would urge all members of the House to support Representative Kowalyszyn and HR 87. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Letterman, for the second time on the question. The gentleman is in order and may proceed.

Mr. LETTERMAN. Mr. Speaker, you can vote for this resolution, but the information which you are looking for is already gathered. We met just last week with the Chesapeake Bay people to decide what nutrients are coming into the Chesapeake Bay. We have had several meetings about the drinking water with the Joint Air and Water Committee, and if you want the information, just go to them and they will give it to you. Thank you.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes, for the second time, the gentleman, Mr. Kowalyszyn.

Mr. KOWALYSHYN. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I do not want to make this a lengthy response, but I would like to point out that there have been some studies made concerning pollution of drinking water. However, these studies have never been consolidated and coordinated, and that will be one of the purposes of the work of this committee.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Northampton, Mr. Rybak.

Mr. RYBAK. Mr. Speaker, the record will show that it is abundantly clear that our waters are polluted in the private wells across the length and breadth of this Commonwealth. It is getting to the point where the situation is critical and life threatening. Many of our citizens are not able to use their wells for ordinary purposes, for sustenance, and it is creating one hazard after another. If ever there was a situation that should be investigated and promoted, it is the situation of our polluted wells across the Commonwealth. I therefore urge everybody in this House to support HR 87. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.
