GERMAN LEGISLATORS WELCOMED

The SPEAKER pro tempore. At this time the Chair recognizes the minority caucus chairman, the gentleman from Perry, Mr. Noye.

Mr. NOYE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Ladies and gentlemen of the House, it is my honor and privilege to introduce to you today 12 distinguished visitors from the Federal Republic of Germany. These gentlemen share with us a common heritage in that they, too, are State legislators from the 11 States that comprise the Federal Republic of Germany. These people serve in their landtag, or State legislature, representing their constituents. There are 12 with us, two from the Berlin Landtag and one from each of the other States.

They are here really in conjunction with the celebration of 300 years of German immigration to the United States. This is the week in Philadelphia where the tercentenary celebration is occurring. They came into Harrisburg last night and they will be here today. Tomorrow they will be in Philadelphia, and Friday they will tour sections of Lancaster County.

At this time I would like to introduce to you their spokesman, Alexander Longolius, who is a member of the Berlin Landtag. Alex.

Mr. LONGOLIUS. Mr. Speaker, honorable ladies and gentlemen let me say "dear colleagues," it is a great privilege for my friends and myself to be here with you to visit in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and to be in your beautiful Capitol, and it is a great honor to be with you at this meeting of your parliament. Let me say certainly it is a great privilege for me personally to get the chance to express some of the feelings that we have at this moment.

It is friendship that we bring. It is the memory of the common heritage that we have, of the common beliefs, and the wisdom of our political systems; the fact that German-American friendship is a long tradition in my country, that it is not dependent on agreeing on one issue or agreeing to one person, that there are many more sound, stable, and longlasting foundations for this friendship, and we are here to renew them.

To stress the importance of State parliaments certainly is not important and is not possible. I think we will agree on that. We will agree that we are closer to the people and their needs and their wishes than the Federal level. Is that not true?

People in parliaments on the Federal level have long told us that international relations are their business. Well, we broke that. A year ago in Berlin we had a meeting of State legislators from your country and from mine in my hometown of Berlin, let me say, and we discovered that many of the fields that are important to carry on good relations between two nations, be they educational, be they economic, or be they other fields, are going to be handled or should be handled on the State level anyway, so we are here to continue this tradition, to build it up. The two Berlin participants of the meeting last year started what we called the Partnership of Parliaments, and we mean State parliaments. We also want to renew this partnership and invite you to join us.

I do not want to take too much of your time. You have been very patient. Let me say that the friendship between our two countries is something that is much more stable than you may sometimes feel when you look at television or read some of the papers. I am not talking about your papers, of course, but only about ours. I am not going to say anything against the press while I am over here.

We share a political system; we share the belief that tolerance is important to live together peacefully, be that among people, individuals, or nations. We share the feeling that pursuit of happiness for all is something that we should work for today and not promise to future generations, and this is something we represent—as Fred Noye mentioned, 11 States, and that is 100 percent for us—and we represent the three traditional parties that we have in my country, so when I say this, I talk for the citizens of the Federal Republic. And this is the spirit that we came in; this is the message we want to bring you.

Again, let me thank you very much for the friendship that we have enjoyed in your country and for the hospitality that we are enjoying today, and I thank you for your patience.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair would ask Mr. Longolius to introduce his colleagues in his delegation.

Mr. LONGOLIUS. Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker.

I will do this starting with Berlin, my hometown. Juergen Adler, will he please rise. He is accompanied by Mrs. Adler, who tells him how to vote and so on. From Nordrhein-Westfalen, North Rhine-Westphalia, we have Leo Dautzenberg; from Niedersachsen, Lower Saxony, Peter Dehn; from Baden-Wurttemberg—that is such a bad word in German it cannot be translated into English, I think—Juergen Eisele; from Hessen, Volker Bouffier; from Rheinland-Pfalz, Rhineland-Palatinate, we have Karl Geimer; from the Saarland, Leo Petry; from Schleswig-Holstein up north, we have Guenther Neugebauer; from Bremen, Manfred Richter; from Bavaria, Jakob Mittermeier; and from Hamburg, we have Paul Busse.

Let me say one more thing about this delegation. It is sponsored by the American Council of Young Political Leaders, which is highly embarrassing to myself. Let me tell you, in a State where you can hold the clock to pass bills on time, they should be able to find something to include you and myself in the future as young political leaders. Right?

The Chair takes great pleasure in introducing two gentlemen of German descent. I refer to Mr. Manderino and Mr. Ryan.

The Chair introduces at this time, for remarks, the majority leader.

Mr. MANDERINO. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, on behalf of the General Assembly and the Democratic Party, we want to welcome all of the German legislators to Pennsylvania and to our Capitol. We would hope that this bond of friendship that they are encouraging grows, grows to the extent that we can visit them next year. I know all of you would like to be candidates to represent this body.

We are happy that the Federal Republic of Germany has seen fit to send you on the mission that you are on. We would hope that your stay here is pleasant. We would hope that your stay here is informative and that the friendships and the contacts that you make here will be long enduring. Thank you for the kind words that you spoke to us this morning, and thank you for the extension of your friendship to all of our people. Thank you.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the minority leader.

Mr. RYAN. Mr. Speaker, for a number of years now we have heard you utter remarks that none of us understood. You have held yourself out as somewhat of an expert in the German language, and none of us were able to pass on that. My new friends from the legislatures of Germany inform me they have no idea what you just said.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The art of diplomacy.

Mr. RYAN. Like Mr. Manderino, I, too, would like to express our thanks for the visit, our feelings of flattery that you would come to Pennsylvania, a State that is rich in tradition of the German people. The folks who came to this country and to Pennsylvania particularly of German heritage have really made this country and this State in particular grow.

I am pleased that you are taking the opportunity to visit the county of Lancaster, where I think you will find many folks now living who share your heritage. It is certainly one of the most pleasant and prettiest counties of Pennsylvania, and I say that not being from Lancaster County.

Like Mr. Manderino, I, too, share the hope but unfortunately not the expectation that we will be sent to Germany on a like mission. It is my understanding—and the younger members have told me this—that the trips sponsored by our State Department are limited to members of the legislature between the ages of 25 and 40. For that reason, Mr. Manderino cannot make the trip. Mr. Fryer and I will make it.

Once again, thank you very much for honoring us by your presence, and I, too, hope that you enjoy your stay here in the United States.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair has received an inquiry: In the event there is a visit to the Federal Republic of Germany, how would the mileage be computed? This matter will be turned over to the Rules Committee, unless the minority leader has a suggestion.

Mr. RYAN. In one word, favorably.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair certainly joins in the welcome to our visitors with the hope that they will return soon and that they leave with many pleasant memories of their visit to our great country.

BILLS ON THIRD CONSIDERATION CONTINUED

The House proceeded to third consideration of **HB 982**, **PN 1135**, entitled:

An Act amending the "Housing Finance Agency Law," approved December 3, 1959 (P. L. 1688, No. 621), providing for the issuance of qualified veterans' mortgage bonds.

On the question,

Will the House agree to the bill on third consideration?

Mr. LUCYK offered the following amendments No. A2878:

Amend Sec. 1 (Sec. 403-B), page 2, line 7, by inserting after "Program.—"
(a)

Amend Sec. 1 (Sec. 403-B), page 2, line 14, by inserting after 'restrictions''

applicable to qualified veterans mortgage bonds

Amend Sec. 1 (Sec. 403-B), page 2, line 15, by striking out <u>, 26</u> U.S.C. §§103 and 103A,"

Amend Sec. 1 (Sec. 403-B), page 2, by inserting between lines 16 and 17

(b) The proceeds of the veterans mortgage bonds shall be allocated to counties or groups of counties in a manner proportionate to the number of qualified veterans of the Vietnam conflict residing in the county or groups of counties.

(c) The price ceiling for new and existing residences for the veterans mortgage program shall comply with the same limitations imposed by the Mortgage Subsidy Bond Tax Act of 1980.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Schuylkill, Mr. Lucyk.

Mr. LUCYK. Mr. Speaker, this amendment does several things. First, it clarifies language in HB 982 as we did previously in HB 981. It removes certain restrictions that would have existed as applied to this program, and it defines how the proceeds of the sales of mortgage bonds would be spread across the counties of Pennsylvania. Also, it defines, under limitations imposed by the Mortgage Subsidy Bond Tax Act of 1980, certain price ceilings for the purchases of properties under the act.

Section 2201-A. Definitions.—As used in this article the following words and phrases shall have, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the meanings given to them in this section:

"Area." A census tract or block group. * * *

Section 2. Section 2205-A of the act is amended by adding a subsection to read:

Bonds.—* * * Section 2205-A.

(c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act, seventyfive per centum (75%) of the proceeds of any mortgage bonds issued after the effective date of this amendatory act shall, for a period of six (6) weeks following the date the proceeds are available to the authority, be used solely and exclusively to make loans to enable persons to acquire single-family dwellings located in communities or areas within the authority's field of operation where there exists an owner-occupied housing rate of at least fifty per centum (50%) and in which the median income of the community or area does not exceed ninety per centum (90%) of the median income of the county. Following the six (6) week period, said proceeds may be used to make loans to persons to enable them to acquire residences located anywhere within the authority's field of operation.

Section 3. The act is amended by adding a section to read:

Amend Sec. 2, page 2, line 3, by striking out "2" and inserting

Amend Sec. 3, page 2, line 14, by striking out "3" and inserting 5

HB 501 deals with renewing the authority to renew bond issues in Allegheny County. My amendment would target the funds of those bond issues to what we call impact areas, which are census tract areas with low-income minorities with a certain amount of housing deterioration that qualifies in Allegheny County under a repair and restoration program currently. The amendment essentially requires that this targeting take place for a 6-week period, and if all the funds are not

used in the impact areas, then the remaining moneys may be used countywide. Basically it gives a preference for those targeted areas. I believe that both the Republican and Democratic members in the Allegheny County delegation have agreed to it, and I ask for the approval of the House. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

(7) The methodology used in this study shall follow, wherever possible, the recommended method used by the most recent study of the United States Department of Transportation;
