Mr. VAN HORNE. Mr. Speaker, just to give you some background, I believe in committee we discussed whether it was the Department of Health or DER, and counsel for Urban Affairs thought it was the Department of Health. I have no problem holding this until we get a clarification on that.

Mr. RYAN. Mr. Speaker, under the circumstances, I wonder if HB 2243 can be put on hold and if I can put in a reconsideration motion on HB 2242 until this question is answered by our respective staffs.
