An Act to provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1991, to June 30, 1992, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1991; to provide appropriations from the State Lottery Fund, the Pennsylvania Economic Revitalization Fund, the Energy Conservation and Assistance Fund, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The State Stores Fund and the Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund to the Executive Department; to provide appropriations from the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account to the Judicial Department; to provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 1991, to June 30, 1992, for the proper opera-

tion of the several departments of the Commonwealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor License Fund moneys; to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth and for the establishment of restricted receipts accounts for the fiscal year July 1, 1991, to June 30, 1992, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1991.

Mr. EVANS. Mr. Speaker, the plan that we have here today gives us an opportunity not only to resolve some of our short-term fiscal challenges—

**PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY**

Mr. RYAN. Mr. Speaker?

The SPEAKER. For what purpose does the gentleman rise?

Mr. RYAN. Point of parliamentary inquiry.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman will state his point.

Mr. RYAN. Mr. Speaker, would it be appropriate for me to ask the Chair or ask the gentleman, Mr. Evans, if he concludes his remarks by moving the previous question, if he would be courteous enough to at least let me have as much time as he did, prior to the time he moves the previous question, to address the issue.

The SPEAKER. That is the inclination of the Chair.

Mr. RYAN. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Evans, may continue.

Mr. EVANS. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I indicated, Mr. Speaker, that the plan that we have here today deals with dealing with short-term in laying the foundation for the future of this Commonwealth. No, we know that this is not necessarily a complete plan. We know that there are some other things that basically have to be done, and we as a Democratic Caucus are prepared to do those things, but in the meantime, some of the things that we have suggested, Mr. Speaker, are some things that we think that this House and the Senate and the Governor should adhere to.

Like number one, controlling government spending. We mentioned, Mr. Speaker, over a reduction of \$300 million in control of government spending. We mentioned also certain elimination of legislative perks. We also mentioned, Mr. Speaker, a return of legislative funds and a portion of our salaries and reducing legislative overhead. But we mentioned those things, Mr. Speaker, because we believe that we are a part of trying to solve this problem. We do not believe, Mr. Speaker, that this problem can be solved on the backs of any one particular group. We believe, in laying the foundation for the future, that we must make some investments, and some of the investments we have made are in our young people for the future, like education. We believe, Mr. Speaker, if Pennsylvania is to be competitive and move forward in the future, we must continue to invest in our young people, and we do that through this plan.



Mr. RYAN. Mr. Speaker, I challenge the vote and ask that the names be spread upon the record of those people who would cut off debate on the budget of this Commonwealth.

The SPEAKER. For the information of the gentleman, the names that were recited added exactly to 20 and are in the record. The Chair was just noting for the record the presence of an additional number of members, including the Representative, Mr. Evans, and a significant number of other members in excess of 20. The record now includes the parliamentarily sufficient number.

The motion for the previous question having been made and seconded, those in favor of the motion for the previous question will vote "aye"; those opposed will vote "no." An "aye" vote is a vote to end all debate and bring the House to an immediate vote on the substantive matter.
