On the question, Will the House agree to the amendment?

The SPEAKER. The gentleman will yield.

Please. Members, please take your seats.

On the question of the Leh amendment, the gentleman is recognized.

Mr. LEH. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Amendment No. 1119 makes this bill population specific to the 2000 census to a population within a third-class county of 371,000 people or more but not more than 380,000 people. Also, the amendment allows a jury commissioner, which this bill is designed to deal with, the office of jury commissioner, would allow the jury commissioner to serve out his full length of term.

I would ask that the members of this body support this amendment, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. On the question of the adoption of the amendment, Mr. Vitali.

Mr. VITALI. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Would the maker of the amendment stand for brief interrogation?

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Leh, will stand for interrogation. However, I ask him to yield.

Please. There is a debate on the floor and the members deserve your attention. Take your seats, please. Discontinue conferences. Mr. Vitali.

Mr. VITALI. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I just want to be clear about what this does. Am I understanding this correct, that in counties whose population is between 371,000 and 380,000, the amendment just applies to those counties?

Mr. LEH. Third-class counties within that population.

Mr. VITALI. And I am just guessing that that is just going to be one county?

Mr. LEH. I am not sure. I know one county that is within that population limit.

Mr. VITALI. Okay. And with regard to that county, the office of jury commissioner is eliminated?

Mr. LEH. No; this bill does not eliminate, and I realize, Mr. Speaker, I do not want to go beyond the latitude of the Speaker's bench; however, this bill would allow the county commissioners to vote to eliminate the jury commissioner's office. However, this amendment does not do that. This amendment just specifies that should the county commissioners decide to do that and should they by a majority vote of the county commissioners eliminate the office, the jury commissioner would be allowed to serve out his present term. Under the present language of the bill, the jury commissioner could either resign or finish out his term. There was a member of this body that felt that we should not even allow a jury commissioner to resign under that language, and his request was that we allow the jury commissioner to finish out his term, which is what the amendment does.

Mr. VITALI. Okay. So this simply gives an option to that at least one-

Mr. LEH. Yes; this is nothing mandatory. It is not a "shall"; it is a "may" provision, which will be revealed in the bill when we get to that.

Mr. VITALI. Okay. That concludes my interrogation. Thank you.

STATEMENT BY DEMOCRATIC LEADER

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the minority leader, Mr. DeWeese.

Mr. DeWEESE. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

May I have some order, please?

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The gentleman, Mr. DeWeese, deserves to be heard. Could we please have some order in the hall.

I thought I would take advantage of a comparatively slow day relative to legislative traffic to commend the Republican Caucus on their new leadership team. I would simultaneously like to use this afternoon as a fulcrum to further propel the idea of campaign finance reform.

There is not a man or woman in this hall who has not been buffeted over the past many months by unwholesome rumors about fundraising mechanisms within our own process, and I do not have to be specific; it certainly is not necessary and not appropriate. But one of the campaigns engendered on the Republican side of the aisle for Appropriations chairman was spearheaded by an ethos, Madam Speaker, that wanted to divide the appropriations process from a bald and unmitigated fundraising engine. I think that was a worthy pursuit.

I do not think that it can be said enough on this floor, Madam Speaker, that Representative Vitali, Representative Levdansky, and a squad of other members on the Democratic side of the aisle and some people, former Representative Al Masland and others, on the Republican side have tried desperately to pursue a campaign finance bill. My good friend and worthy colleague from the beautiful county of Jefferson, the honorable whip on the Republican side of the aisle, thank goodness, a few weeks earlier joined forces with us when he said we will come back here sometime soon and do a real campaign finance bill. I cannot think of a better time to recommit this chamber, Madam Speaker, to real campaign finance reform.

The former chairman of the House Republican Appropriations Committee vacated that seat recently, and we do not know why, but many of us have heard rumors and allegations of behavior that bordered on impropriety. Whether that was true or not true, we have a chance to have, what the Latins would say, a tabula rasa, a clean slate.

We should start today and commit ourselves to campaign finance reform, and the Republican Party should be way out in front on the issue. There should be no half stepping. We are not going to realize victory unless Mr. Smith's commitment of several weeks ago is crystallized by substantial legislative hearings in the next several weeks.

We have, as this process always has, a lot of spare time while the Appropriations Committee concentrates on the budget. We have essentially all of April, all of May, and part of June. Now is the time for the gentleman from Jefferson, my very good friend, the whip of the Republican side of the aisle, to come through on that campaign promise here on the floor of the House and say, we will have campaign finance reform; we will have a real good bill. Well, I do not want to have to wait until September or October or November. Now is not a time for sloth; now is a time for action.

I would welcome the cooperation and the fraternity that we have always had and ask the gentleman from Jefferson to refocus his caucus now that his elections are over, and I congratulate them, their leadership team, on their success. But nevertheless, at the nub of this whole Appropriations election on the Republican side earlier today was a feeling that we should divorce fundraising from Appropriations chairmen, that we should do something on campaign finance reform, and it will not be done unless the Republican leadership team and their rank and file commit themselves to this process.
