Mr. O'BRIEN. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

It is an honor to have this opportunity to take a few moments to remember our dear friend, Otis Littleton, who was a very special person.

Otis was here for nearly 10 years before I was first elected in 1976, when I was about, oh, 23. I was as naive as any legislator possibly could be. For that reason I was particularly grateful to Otis as a mentor who gently guided me away from the potential consequences of some of my legislative ideas and provided me with hopeful suggestions which made me a much better and more effective legislator.

I remember, as many of you do, we did not have the posh offices that we have today. Many of us, George Hasay and others, remember when we were all crowded down in the basement complex where our legal staff is. We must have had 40-some legislators down there at the time, and Otis and the research staff were all the way at the end of that corridor where legal staff is now. Anytime you had a question, you would just follow your heart and your instincts and go down, and Otis and the research staff would guide you in the right direction. And I remember on many an occasion Otis would take me aside and just very gently tell me that this might not be the right idea, that there might be other ways that we can go about considering this, or someone may have done this recently, and for all those reasons, as I sit here today, I remember fondly Otis Littleton.

Otis set the gold standard in terms of competence, loyalty, confidentiality, which are all very important in this legislature. When you have an idea, you want to know that it is going to be held in confidence, and in that way you can work out all the bugs, and he had respect for this institution we know and love as the General Assembly.

Otis knew more about auto insurance in Pennsylvania and eagerly shared it with anyone who asked. In addition to his major contributions in the area of auto insurance reform, Otis's impact could be felt in numerous other laws and State programs because of his leadership as the director of the House Republican research staff for 23 years, until his retirement in 1990.

Residents of Pennsylvania, without knowing it, are the beneficiaries of the ideas and suggestions on insurance reform that Otis so gladly shared with members, both Democrats and

Republicans alike. Otis, or “Oat” or “Oatie,” as he was affectionately known by his colleagues, was a friend to all.

As one of the first directors of research employed by the House, Otis was also a mentor and role model for many of the members of this House and staff and others working in government today.

As a friend, he was kind, generous, humble, and unselfish. As an employee, he was dedicated, honest, hardworking, and loyal. These are the traits and qualities to be respected and admired and which we could use more of in today’s world.

After retirement Otis continued his longtime association with the Coast Guard Auxiliary teaching boating classes and vessel safety.

To Marie and other members of his family here with us today and on behalf of everyone, thank you for sharing the time and talents of your husband, father, grandfather, brother, and uncle with the members of the Pennsylvania House of Representatives and the people of Pennsylvania. Our Commonwealth is a better place today as a result of the contributions made by Otis Littleton. We will all miss you, my friend, and we will not forget you.

With us today we have his wife, Marie, standing over here. His daughter, Dolores, is here – Dolores. His daughter, Linda, could not be with us today, but his son, Paul, is here – Paul. His stepsons, Kenneth and Timothy, are not here, but we would like to say hello to his brothers and sisters: Joan Dickerson, who also hails from Philadelphia; his brother, Lowell; Jane; Alberta; and James. And his grandson, Steven Salvant, is here. Stand up, Steven. And his longtime friend, Natie Carbonaro, is here – Natie.

I know that there are many members, both Democrat and Republican alike. I remember years ago when we were down in that office complex, there was a young legislator like myself by the name of Bill DeWeese, who was orphaned by his caucus at that time because I guess he was not following the direct orders of then House majority leader, Jim Manderino. So Bill did not have an office, he did not have staff, so we were glad to share Otis with him as well. And I just want to thank all the members, both Democrat and Republican, that not only are sharing this day in remembering Otis but also share in the cosponsorship of this resolution.

STATEMENT BY MR. PYLE

The SPEAKER. The Chair at this time would like to welcome back Representative Jeff Pyle. As you all know, he was under some very, very difficult times. We are glad to see you back, and under unanimous consent, the Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Pyle.

Mr. PYLE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Although I do not claim to speak for my other freshman colleagues on the floor of this hallowed chamber, I am sure in the minds of more than one of us is the hope or a dream that at some point our initial entry to speaking on the floor would be some profound statement on significant legislation affecting our future. This, however, will not be my fate.

On the 12th of February this year, I was diagnosed with cancer, cancer that had effectively eradicated the use of my right kidney. On the 23d of February this year, faced with no other alternative but death itself, I underwent a 5-hour procedure under the guidance of the surgeon team of surgeon Dr. Ronald Benoit at Shadyside UPMC (University of Pittsburgh Medical Center) Hospital, and today I stand as testament to his skills, thankfully on behalf of my family and me.

A moment of indulgence, Mr. Speaker. I have kind of made it a cardinal foundation in my life to try to find something positive from every negative experience I have encountered, and from this experience, I have learned this: A man's wealth, or his worth, is not truly measured in bank accounts or stocks or bonds. Although those things are nice, a man's worth, his value, is truly measured by the friends he has, and from my encounter with cancer, what I have learned, Mr. Speaker, is that I am a very, very rich man.

Upon returning home on the 1st of March, my wife, my family, and I encountered an overwhelming outpouring of support, much of which originated on this floor, and I would not be adhering to the gentleman's code if I did not publicly acknowledge my gratitude. I would like to comment, Mr. Speaker, that this outpouring came not from the floor of this House but from every individual member's home district in every corner of this Commonwealth. I have had a long time to think about how to adequately express that which I feel in my heart of hearts, yet not to waste the time of the business of this House, I would like to address you all at once.

Although individually heartfelt and truly from my heart of hearts and from my family and myself, thank you, and may God be with all of you.

The **SPEAKER**. For the information of the membership, maybe many of you do not know this, but both sides of the aisle did provide a book that outlines the amendments that are before us. This is the Democrat book that was sent to all the Democrat members, which I have, and there is also a Republican book.

At this time we will ask the gentleman, Mr. Adolph, to explain the amendment, but it would be the opinion of the Chair that the membership should take the time to look up the amendments in the book prior to asking any questions, but on that question, the Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Adolph.

Mr. **ADOLPH**. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, the Governor proposed to decrease the epilepsy support services appropriation by \$100,000. This amendment simply uses surplus funds and restores the epilepsy support services State appropriation for the fiscal year 2004-2005 funding level back up to the \$600,000 that it was last year rather than the Governor's funding level of \$500,000.

The **SPEAKER**. The gentleman, Mr. Vitali.

Mr. **VITALI**. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

That concludes my questions. If I can just make a brief statement.

The **SPEAKER**. The gentleman is in order and may proceed.

Mr. **VITALI**. Mr. Speaker, I know we have a long day and a lot of amendments, but the problem is, we have 54 pages' worth of amendments. Each page has about 10 or 12 amendments. The challenge here is figuring out what number goes with what subject matter. So that is why we need a little bit of indulgence on a day like this.

So I have a question that I would like to direct to the chair of the Appropriations Committee. What exactly is the amount of the surplus that is going to be used for some of the amendments that are before us? What is that total, the surplus, that we are talking about in the next hour or so?

The **SPEAKER**. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Lycoming, Mr. Feese.

Mr. **FEESE**. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, the Governor's budget proposes spending an additional \$290 million, which would be surplus money. The Appropriations Committee has certified an additional \$110 million, \$55 million of which was allocated to the Democrat Caucus through Chairman Evans' office and \$55 million of which was allocated to the Republican Caucus.

The **SPEAKER**. Mr. Samuelson.

Mr. **SAMUELSON**. Just as a follow-up. The amendments that are before us this afternoon that cite surplus as a source of funding, would they add up to just the \$110 million that the Appropriations Committee has identified or that \$110 million plus the \$290 million?

The **SPEAKER**. Mr. Feese.

Mr. **FEESE**. There are a number of amendments, Mr. Speaker, that draw from the surplus or attempt to draw from the surplus to fund the particular expenditure. BILL PASSED OVER TEMPORARILY

The **SPEAKER**. The Chair temporarily goes over HB 815 and returns to page 4 of today's House calendar.

CONSIDERATION OF HB 855 CONTINUED

On the question recurring,
Shall the bill pass finally?

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Allegheny, Mr. Wheatley.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

May I interrogate the maker, the sponsor of this bill?

The SPEAKER. The gentleman is in order.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Mr. Speaker, could you please explain to me the impact that this bill will have on cities of the second class under distressed status.

Mr. KENNEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, this legislation would require any second-class city that controls a fire department, any municipality, in a decision to close any stations in that city, to provide written notification to the labor unions that represent those companies, complete a study, release the study to the public, hold a public hearing, and then make a local decision.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Mr. Speaker, is this a retroactive piece of legislation?

Mr. KENNEY. No, it is not.

Mr. WHEATLEY. So, Mr. Speaker, under the current situation, a city such as Pittsburgh that we passed legislation to help them come out of their financial circumstance, under their current status, would this impede their process at all as it relates to trying to right-size their budget, trying to right-size their fire deployment and station? Would this have any negative impact to that city?

Mr. KENNEY. I believe the answer is no, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Mr. Speaker, under this proposal, is there any additional funding going towards cities of the first, second, second class A, and third-class cities for helping to support and maintain fire stations?

Mr. KENNEY. No. This legislation does not prevent firehouses from being closed. It just allows for public notification and the impact on those neighborhoods where the stations are closing. That is all I am asking. It does not prevent the local government from making those budgetary decisions, as you mentioned, nor does it bring money back home to local governments to pay for fire companies or emergency services.

Mr. WHEATLEY. So, Mr. Speaker, just for my own clarity purposes, if we were to enact this legislation, pass this legislation today, any city that is under this act that had already started a process of closing or public process for notification and identification of fire stations to be closed, would they have to go back through a process of notification or would those cities then be allowed to continue their course of action that they have already started?

Mr. KENNEY. No. As I answered earlier, the legislation is not retroactive. So I mean, this is moving forward. If that process is completed, I would assume once a decision is made, it is done. This law would not take effect until after that, and it would be with all future closings.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

If I can make a comment, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman is in order and may proceed.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Mr. Speaker, I want to begin by saying I am personally not an advocate of running out and closing or putting people's lives at danger by closing fire stations, and I am a big supporter of firefighters, but at the same time, I am a big supporter of local municipalities' control, and it seems to me that this is an unnecessary step. I believe that we elect local officials to make these types of determinations, and we should allow them to do this.

We have had this bill come through our chamber before, and I supported it the first time it came through, and it identified cities of the first class. The courts have ruled in Boston and Philadelphia that these processes should be allowed to go forth and local municipalities should have the authority to make these types of decisions, and I do not think we as a body should be in the habit of superseding local authority. The Governor vetoed the first bill, and it is my understanding that the Governor, if this were to get to his desk, would veto this bill, and I would just ask us to have a little more patience, a little more regard for local control and local governance, and that we would vote "no" on this bill and allow for local municipalities to make these types of decisions.

So I would encourage my colleagues all across the chamber to vote "no" on HB 855.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Allegheny, Mr. Frankel.

Mr. FRANKEL. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I want to join my colleague from the city of Pittsburgh, Representative Wheatley, in asking members to look very carefully at this. We in the city of Pittsburgh have spent the last couple of years negotiating with this chamber as State government about how we were going to get our house in order, and I have made the point repeatedly that part of the problem of managing municipal finances not just in the city of Pittsburgh but across this State emanates from actions we have taken here in Harrisburg. And today we are again considering a piece of legislation that interferes with the ability of a municipality, whether it is the city of Pittsburgh, Philadelphia, or any other third-class city across the State, to deal with its own fiscal budgetary issues in the way it deems possible.

Voters in our cities vote for council people; they vote for mayors. They should hold those people accountable. Closing fire stations is not something anybody takes lightly. It is a very difficult, heart-wrenching thing for many neighborhoods, and city council people and mayors across the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania have to wrestle with those issues, particularly in a day when many of our cities have shrunk and their resources for managing their finances and providing for public safety have been compromised for many, many reasons.

Why are we again taking away the ability of local elected officials who are closest to this issue and telling them how to run their business? And I do not know, quite frankly, in spite of the assurances by the prime maker of this legislation, how this will impact the city of Pittsburgh, which has already come to the conclusion through the Act 47 process and the Intergovernmental Cooperation Authority, they have agreed to close a number of stations and downsize our fire departments. I am not resting sure that we are not upending that negotiation.

So I think that if we are going to be true to ourselves and the rhetoric that I have been listening to from many of my colleagues, some of which I agree with, let us not interfere with this process. Let us not, let us not go back and undo what has gone on in the city of Pittsburgh to finally get itself fiscally right-sized. This legislation may in fact undo that; I do not know. And when it was first introduced, it just dealt with the city of Philadelphia. For some reason now it has been expanded to include second- and third-class cities. I do not know what is motivating that. If this is something the legislator from Philadelphia and others want done, well, so be it; make that

case, but do not incorporate us, the city of Pittsburgh, and other third-class cities across this State in that bill.

MOTION TO RECOMMIT

Mr. FRANKEL. So, Mr. Speaker, I am going to ask that this bill, which I am hoping the maker of this legislation just was gearing this towards Philadelphia and I would disagree with it for them, but if the impact is that they just want to deal with Philadelphia, so be it. I would love to have the opportunity to take another look at this, and I would move that we recommit this bill until we have the opportunity to really understand what its impact is on other municipalities, particularly our second-class cities.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. It has been moved by the gentleman from Allegheny, Mr. Frankel, that HB 855, along with amendments, be recommitted to the Committee on Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness.

On that question,

Will the House agree to the motion?

The SPEAKER. On that question, the Chair recognizes the majority leader.

Mr. S. SMITH. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I would urge the members to reject this motion to recommit. While this issue is not new, some of the concerns that have been raised by the administration have been further worked out in conjunction with this bill as it is before us now. Clearly, one of the major objections the administration had was the scope of the legislation. This bill now deals with all cities of all sizes. Therefore, we feel that we have made significant steps toward addressing the concerns expressed by the administration, and I would urge the members to vote against the motion to recommit.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The Chair recognizes the minority leader, the gentleman, Mr. DeWeese.

Mr. DeWEESE. Mr. Speaker, would it be acceptable for a brief interrogation of the majority leader?

The SPEAKER. The gentleman seems to indicate he will stand for interrogation. The gentleman, Mr. DeWeese, is in order.

Mr. DeWEESE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The thrust of my question or questions, Mr. Speaker, deals with Pittsburgh. Has the majority leader or his staff or members of his caucus discussed the dynamics of this legislation with William Lieberman? Mr. Lieberman is on the board that we put into motion last year, the oversight board in Pittsburgh, and he is the Republican nominee. I am just curious, because his overview, as one of five people helping to run the city of Pittsburgh right now, would be crucial. We could make a more enlightened vote.

Mr. S. SMITH. Mr. Speaker, quite honestly, I have not had any conversations with the gentleman to whom you refer. To my knowledge, there have been no conversations directly with him relative to this particular legislation, and I think you are getting a little bit off the subject of the bill, quite honestly.

Mr. DeWEESE. You never have to say "quite honestly" with me, sir. You are always honest. That is one of your noble attributes.

The second question – and again, I am not in a court of law; if I were, I would be out of bounds, since I am devoid of legal training – but have you or Mr. Kenney or Mr. O'Brien or any of the Republicans who are advocating this change, this very fundamental change in the way our cities do business, have you talked with Mayor Murphy in Pittsburgh, have you talked with the Act 47 people, the dynamics within the city, and the fire services in Pittsburgh especially? And again, we are only asking for a recommitment. We are not asking to extirpate this legislation; we are only asking for a recommitment. I am just curious whether you have talked to these folks.

Mr. S. SMITH. Mr. Speaker, you know, you can take this either way. On one hand, your question might imply that if we were talking to those people, that that would have been maybe less than forthright in terms of the motivation of this bill. You could also characterize it that if we did not talk to them, we were shirking our duty for not considering their recommendations, especially when you cite specific people involved in the oversight board, the Act 47 group, or the mayor of Pittsburgh. The fact is, while we may— It may be that we should have talked to those people. We have not. We have talked to firemen and those individuals and organizations that are directly impacted by this legislation. But more importantly, the way this bill is currently crafted was driven mostly by the Governor's veto message of July 1, 2004, where he particularly cites that then HB 2758, the bill that went to his desk that was vetoed, the predecessor to this bill, that that bill only applied to the city of Philadelphia, and he went on to say that the bill does not address or constrain other municipalities' actions with respect to fire protection services. Everything that we have done to make this bill better than the bill the Governor vetoed was driven by his veto message and in conjunction with talking to firefighters and those people that are directly involved and not in conjunction with some Murphysque plan for submarining the legislature coming out of Pittsburgh.

Did you catch that last little dig, Mr. Speaker?

Mr. DeWEESE. I catch so many of them that I am impervious.

Mr. S. SMITH. It was not directed at you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. DeWEESE. I believe you.

I have no further questions for the honorable gentleman from Jefferson. I do have a few observations, Mr. Speaker, and I will—

The SPEAKER. The gentleman is in order.

Mr. DeWEESE. Thank you, sir.

The gentleman, Mr. Frankel, is only asking for recommitment, and the thrust behind the recommitment request is that profound alterations are taking place in the golden triangle as we speak. There is a group of five that the Governor and the legislature have appointed and there is also an Act 47 team working with the mayor and city council, and we can get into the overall debate later on relative to the efficacy of the proposal. But for Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, which is a big and dynamic part of our State, what is going to happen if this proposal goes forward is not known. It is not known by my Republican colleagues, and therefore, a recommitment seems appropriate, at least for a few weeks, until we can ascertain what the roadmap looks like.

So I would support the gentleman, Mr. Frankel. I hope to take the microphone later relative to the proposal in general.

But for a recommittal motion, this is not an extreme request. We just want to find out, if we can, what the Republican, Mr. Lieberman, and his team, the team of five in Pittsburgh, the ICA, the oversight board, the Act 47 people, are saying about what we are doing here today. It makes common sense; it makes for a better process. So I would support my colleague from Pittsburgh, Mr. Frankel, and ask that this be recommitted.

I would say as a caveat at the end of my remarks that the recommittal would not last for more than 2 or 3 weeks and that we would come back and vote it on its merits. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Smith.

Mr. S. SMITH. Mr. Speaker, if I thought the gentleman could confirm for me and had the authority to make it happen, that the oversight board's recommendations and thoughts relative to the issues facing the city of Pittsburgh were going to be addressed in a more forthright manner than through the side door of the Act 47 group, I would probably agree. The fact is that the city of Pittsburgh and the Act 47 group have worked as much as they can to sidestep the oversight and the actions and recommendations of the oversight board. So why their opinion and views of this are suddenly so important is a mystery to me.

As I said, Mr. Speaker, this was not done in collaboration with them. The fact is that we were talking to the firemen and the citizens. That is the source of our information, and that is the source that provided us with this legislation, and I would urge the members to vote against the motion to recommit.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The gentleman, Mr. DeWeese?

The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Allegheny, Mr. Frankel.

Mr. FRANKEL. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Well, based on the majority leader's comments just now, it pretty much disputes what the sponsoring member said, that this had no impact on the city of Pittsburgh. Apparently, this is a subterfuge to attack the capacity of the city of Pittsburgh to manage its own expenses and to downsize its public safety department, and I cannot think of a more cynical attempt.

We should recommit this, take a look at it. I want to know before we vote on something what impact it is going to have. We have the sponsoring member saying it has no impact on the city of Pittsburgh retroactively to what it does. By inference, in terms of what the majority leader just said, it will have some impact and probably overturn what the city of Pittsburgh has done. This should be recommitted. It is not ready for prime time, and we should not be taking this casually.

If we are going to be true to ourselves about having our municipalities, and in this case, the city of Pittsburgh, manage their expenses, give them the tools. Do not undermine a process that has been painful and difficult and that people stood on this floor and talked about how inept everybody was managing the city of Pittsburgh's finances. Now is the time that we should take the opportunity to support what the city has had to do very painfully and not undermine it. This is a cynical attempt to do that.

Please vote to recommit this bill so we can clean it up. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Philadelphia, Mr. Taylor.

Mr. TAYLOR. Mr. Speaker, I want to speak on the merits of the bill, and this is on the motion. So I would urge our members

to vote "no" on the motion so that we can vote the merits of this bill. It is our second time around on this bill, and I would appreciate a "no" vote.

Thank you.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The gentleman, Mr. Vitali, did rise. Do you wish to be recognized? No.

The gentleman from Philadelphia, Mr. Kenney. Do you wish to be recognized? No.

Mr. Wheatley.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Mr. Speaker, is it in order if I ask the majority leader if he could be interrogated?

The SPEAKER. If the majority leader wishes to stand. The gentleman does indicate that he will stand for interrogation. The gentleman, Mr. Wheatley.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. This is on the motion to recommit.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Yes, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I think earlier I heard the majority leader speak about talking to the residents about this bill and the need for this bill, and I was wondering, do we have any reports or any written documentation around their need for this bill?

Mr. S. SMITH. Mr. Speaker, there are no written reports. When I made that reference, I am suggesting that members and staff have talked to real people and real firemen out there about this issue. It was not done through some organized committee report or something as formal as that.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Mr. Speaker, the reason why I am going down this line around the recommittal is because I support it, because part of this bill's attempt would be that it will put in a permanent public process, and I am curious to know if there was conversation outside of the firemen, if there was conversation with elected officials who were elected to make these types of decisions, if there were any conversations or documentation from citizens—

The SPEAKER. Mr. Wheatley, we are on the motion to recommit, and I am informed by the Parliamentarian that we are far afield of the motion to recommit. If the gentleman would like to speak on recommittal, that is fine, but not on the merits of the bill itself.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I would like to make a comment on recommittal.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman is in order.

Mr. WHEATLEY. I understand, I think I understand, what the attempts of this bill are trying to accomplish. I do not think we have done enough work to lay out the possibilities of what this may mean to cities in their local control issues and how they manage their local municipalities. I do not think we have done that work yet. At least I have not been exposed to it. Now, I am asking, if that work has been done, can we share the results so we all can have the same information so we all can make good judgment on if we should support this bill or not.

I think Representative Frankel made a good point, that we should be able to answer these questions; we should be able to answer these questions: what the impact will be to third-class cities; what the impact will be to first-class cities; what the impact will be to second-class cities and how it will impact them. We should be able to identify the sources by which our claims are made, and that information should be made available to everyone, and if we do not have that, maybe we should, again, we should recommit this bill so that we can gather that information. This should not be a rushed process.

I am asking all of my colleagues who believe in local control, who believe in making sound policy judgments and decisions, to recommit this. This is not saying that we will not come back and address this issue; this is saying that maybe we are rushing this issue without enough information. So I will again join with Representative Frankel and Representative DeWeese and ask for support on the recommitment.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

On the recommitment, the gentleman, Mr. DeWeese.

Mr. DeWEESE. Just real simply, I can count. We can all count here. We are not going to prevail on this vote. And I am going to say it again later on, but the motion to recommit is emblematic of the very marginal motivations of the conservative elements within the Republican Caucus.

I am going to arrest my impetuosity and leave the word “hypocrisy” on the shelf, but by not allowing this recommitment motion, my conservative brothers and sisters on the Republican side of the aisle are not, are not walking the walk, Mr. Speaker. They just talk the talk at the township supervisors’ meeting. They just talk the talk at the Rotary Club. They just talk the talk on the campaign trail over in Lehigh County or Lancaster County or Armstrong County. But when it comes time to—Local control. We do not want any more State mandates up there in Harrisburg; we believe in local control. Well, what is wrong with a recommitment motion so we can figure out this problem in Pittsburgh, and then maybe we can have the bigger debate. Although, even the bigger debate is on that same fulcrum of local control.

By this vote today, you vitiate that fulcrum of local control. The long arm of Harrisburg is going to come in and run the fire services of Pittsburgh, Philadelphia, Scranton, et cetera, et cetera, et cetera. What is wrong with the city council? What is wrong with the mayors? What is wrong with local control?

You guys talk the talk but you do not walk the walk.

Mr. S. SMITH. What is wrong with the mayors? Mr. Speaker, I know we are getting a little off the subject of recommitment, but what is wrong with the mayors? We would not be here, perhaps, if some mayors were doing their job.

The fact is, on the subject of local control, while this does put a requirement onto a local government entity, in fact the whole purpose of this legislation is to ensure that the citizens at the very local level, at that precinct level, near those fire halls, to allow those people a chance to understand and voice their concerns for how an issue is going to be handled. I think, Mr. Speaker, you can make an argument that this bill, the only thing that could be more local control is if you were to have it be some kind of local referendum on an issue of this sort, which obviously would encumber a lot of problems just in the practicality of dealing with it. But, Mr. Speaker, this bill does not violate any conservative principle relative to local control. In fact, it places more power in the hands of local citizens and allows them to make and be a bigger part of that decisionmaking process.

I note that this bill passed almost unanimously when it dealt with the city of Philadelphia. The Governor had objections to that. It has been broadened to involve the other cities within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. I do not see a need to delay the vote on this any further and urge the members to vote against the motion to recommit.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

On the motion, those in favor of recommitment will vote “aye”; those opposed will vote “no.”

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Vitali.

Mr. VITALI. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Will the maker of the bill stand for brief interrogation?

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Kenney, indicates he will stand for interrogation. The gentleman, Mr. Vitali, is in order and may proceed.

Mr. VITALI. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I want to be clear whether this bill applies to volunteer fire companies also or just paid companies, and I ask that because although in the title I see the word “paid” fire protection, nowhere in the text of this does it seem to make any distinction between paid companies and volunteer companies. So my question is, does this apply only to paid companies?

Mr. KENNEY. Yes, Mr. Speaker, and it does not affect volunteer fire companies, if that is the underlying question. It only affects fire departments that are controlled by the municipality. This would not include volunteer fire companies, which are separate nonprofit chartered companies.

Mr. VITALI. Okay.

And my second question is – I just want to be clear – under current law, right now municipalities, they can do everything this act requires them to do. In other words, under current law, without the passage of your bill, municipalities can conduct the hearings mandated by your bill, do the financial studies, have the public notices. Anything your bill requires, they can do right now on their own should they choose.

Mr. KENNEY. Yes, and I would hope they would actually do that; yes.

Mr. VITALI. Okay. That concludes my interrogation, and I have nothing to say on the bill.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. Frankel.

Mr. FRANKEL. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I will not go into all the arguments that I made previously on the motion to recommit, but I must say I am perplexed. This body and the General Assembly seem to be somewhat schizophrenic with respect to our feelings about the way cities manage themselves, and now we are trying to undermine, by this legislation, the very, very difficult decisions that the city of Pittsburgh and other municipalities across the Commonwealth will be wrestling with in the coming years, because believe me, there is a long list of third-class cities who are going to be in a position to enter Act 47. We should not be interfering with that process.

Everybody knows how difficult it is to close fire stations. It is an impossible task, and it should be left to local officials to do it in their way, and if the citizens of that municipality do not like the way that they did it, they have the power of the vote. They are held accountable. We are not here; we are not held accountable at that level for those decisions, but we are making them. This joins a long list of interferences with local governments that have helped to create the environment that the city of Pittsburgh finds itself in today – between mandates, to balance our budget up here by imposing things like tipping fees to imposing regulations on how cities do their

collective bargaining, right down the line. We have been a partner in the demise of urban Pennsylvania, and you are doing it again here.

The city of Pittsburgh took strong steps under the advice of a professional financial team, Act 47, people who have done this in other cities across the State, who know what they are doing, unlike the ICA, and they agreed with the city, with their collective-bargaining process with the firefighters, of what had to be done. It passed scrutiny, and we are trying to undermine it here, apparently based on what the majority leader had to say in the last debate.

So if we are going to be true to all the rhetoric that we talk about in terms of fiscal management and discipline and getting our houses in order across Pennsylvania’s municipalities, vote “no” on this. I am just absolutely astounded at the schizophrenia of this discussion. Here we are; the city of Pittsburgh has made tough decisions to keep its fiscal house in order, and somebody somewhere has got the ear of somebody, and we are trying to undermine it.

Vote “no,” please. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

Mr. S. SMITH. Mr. Speaker?

The SPEAKER. The Chair recognizes the majority leader, the gentleman, Mr. Smith.

Mr. S. SMITH. Mr. Speaker, the innuendo here is beyond almost the orderly decorum of this House. The suspicions that are being raised are way, way out of line. To imply that this legislation is something that myself or someone on our staff contrived to throw a roadblock in the face of the city of Pittsburgh is simply inaccurate. It may be the type of behavior that someone else involved might want to partake in, but, Mr. Speaker, that simply is not the case here. This legislation is just what we said it was: It was a bill that dealt with the city of Philadelphia last session. The Governor vetoed it. In his veto message of July 21, 2004, he identified some issues. We have worked with him on those issues, and this is one of the ones that he addressed, was that the previous bill only dealt with one city, that it should be equally applied to all the cities.

To suggest that this somehow just came out of thin air to be some kind of encumbrance to the city of Pittsburgh, Mr. Speaker, is just downright offensive, quite frankly, Mr. Speaker, and I would simply like the record to reflect that.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Luzerne, Mr. Tigue.

Mr. TIGUE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I would like to interrogate the sponsor of the bill, please.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Kenney, indicates he will stand for interrogation. The gentleman is in order.

Mr. TIGUE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, a question was asked earlier about the effect on volunteer fire companies, and the response was that it is a negative effect. My question has to do with, there are combinations I know of, for instance, a number in Luzerne County, where there are multiple or singular volunteer fire companies, but the city actually pays firemen to stand by, and they are actually city employees; they benefit from the pension system and other benefits as well as salaries. What effect does it have if the city would decide to do away with the paid drivers?

Mr. KENNEY. Mr. Speaker, I believe if they are paid by the local municipality, then this legislation would impact them.

Mr. TIGUE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I have another question. Earlier someone mentioned that this bill we voted on this last session, and we are back here again today to do it, in fact this bill is significantly different, as the majority leader just said. Last year it affected only first-class cities, that being Philadelphia, and of course, now it includes everyone except townships and the town of Bloomsburg. Why did we exclude townships?

Mr. KENNEY. Mr. Speaker, my understanding is, we excluded them because we were looking at those fire departments controlled by municipalities in which most township fire companies would not be part of.

Mr. TIGUE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. KENNEY. I think as the majority leader mentioned, in the Governor's veto message he referenced municipalities, so we did take it one step further and add second- and third-class municipalities, cities, to this legislation.

Mr. TIGUE. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I would like to make a comment, please, and a motion.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman is in order and may proceed.

Mr. TIGUE. Mr. Speaker, townships, some townships – and I am aware of, for instance, a first-class township in Luzerne County which does have a volunteer fire company as well as paid drivers – they would be affected. They should be affected if you are going to affect a small third-class city. There are a number of questions, not only regarding Pittsburgh and Philadelphia but other municipalities, that I think we have to clarify.

MOTION TO TABLE

Mr. TIGUE. I concur with the concept, and I supported the bill last year when it passed; however, I think we need a little bit more time to do this. Therefore, I would make a motion to table this bill until Wednesday, April 13.

The SPEAKER. It is moved by the gentleman, Mr. Tigue, that HB 855 be postponed until April 13.

Mr. TIGUE. Yes, Mr. Speaker, so we can offer an amendment.

On the question,

Will the House agree to the motion?

The SPEAKER. On that question, that motion is debatable only by the floor leaders.

On that question, the Chair recognizes Mr. Veon, who defers to Mr. Tangretti? I apologize; Mr. Tigue. The leader defers to you, Mr. Tigue. On that question.

Mr. TIGUE. Mr. Speaker, I just think that not being against this at this juncture, I think that it is a legitimate request to ask that this be held over for the chance for people to make changes and get questions answered, which we have been unable to get answered here on the floor or in caucus. So I think just by giving 48 hours' deferment at this point, it would make a lot of sense.

And by the way, the other thing is, townships, boroughs. So most municipalities are not included, but the Governor—I do not know what the Governor's veto said, but based on what

was said here earlier, it included cities, but this affects more than that, so it affects all of us. So I would ask just 48 hours so that we would wait and we would vote on this on Wednesday.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The Chair recognizes the majority leader, the gentleman, Mr. Smith.

Mr. S. SMITH. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, while obviously I respect the argument and the notion by the gentleman who moved to table the bill, I believe that we have answered the questions relative to this bill. I believe we have debated it and discussed it more than what I might have anticipated given the time of day and where we are with this week's work. I have to oppose the motion to table and ask the members to proceed toward voting this on final passage.

I regretfully urge the members to oppose the motion to table. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

Those in favor of the motion to table will vote "aye"; those opposed will vote "no."

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Tangretti.

Mr. TANGRETTI. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I was wondering if the maker of the bill would stand for brief interrogation.

Mr. KENNEY. Yes, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. TANGRETTI. Mr. Speaker, I wonder if the gentleman could just clarify once again on the line of questioning that the Representative from Delaware County raised relative to paid versus volunteer. I represent a third-class city that is an all-volunteer fire service, and I just want to make sure, because to me, it is not clear in the language – as a matter of fact, I was going to support Representative Tigue's offer to postpone so I could offer an amendment to make it clear – but just for the record, this does not apply to third-class cities that have volunteer fire services. That is a question.

Mr. KENNEY. You are correct. It does not apply.

Mr. TANGRETTI. Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The gentleman from Philadelphia, Mr. Taylor.

Mr. TAYLOR. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I would ask all the members of the House to support HB 855. One of my colleagues from Pittsburgh mentioned that he was sure that local authorities would not take lightly the decision to close firehouses. Well, that may be the case in the city of Pittsburgh, but I can tell you, Mr. Speaker, that was not the case last spring in the city of Philadelphia, when in fact for purely budgetary reasons, the mayor of the city of Philadelphia announced the closing and the reconfiguration of many firehouses in that city. This bill is just a statement that says we do not want to save money and forfeit protection for the citizens of any city unless a procedure is filed. That is all we are asking here, and to the extent that the State is interfering, that is what we are doing. We are asking for a procedure. And, Mr. Speaker, we get involved. We oversee local barbers. Should we not have a role in fire departments?

We talked about not understanding the impact of this bill, but we do not understand the impact of closing firehouses, and there

is no data whatsoever to support some of the decisions that are being made. All we are asking for is notice for hearings and the people that are involved with these decisions to be consulted.

Mr. Speaker, to make matters worse, in the city of Philadelphia, we were told in the neighborhoods where the closings were to occur that this was for safety purposes, and in fact, in my particular district, a firehouse was going to change because there were not any fires. Well, 2 weeks later, Mr. Speaker, there was a fire, and then 2 weeks later after those statements, two firefighters died. All we are asking for in this legislation is that some process be followed that makes sense before a decision like that is made.

I would ask everybody to support HB 855.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Allegheny, Mr. Wheatley.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I want to begin by saying I do recognize that we have a lot of important business to handle, and I am going to keep this as brief as I can.

I was wondering if I could interrogate the prime sponsor of this bill.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman would like to interrogate the gentleman from Philadelphia, Mr. Kenney. The gentleman, Mr. Kenney, indicates he will submit to interrogation. The gentleman, Mr. Wheatley, is in order and may proceed.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, can you let me know or tell me, clarify, because there was a lot of mention to the Governor's first veto of the original bill we did that only identified cities of the first class. Can you tell me if you have had any conversation with the Governor's Office to let us know if he will veto this bill?

Mr. KENNEY. Mr. Speaker, no, I have not and do not know if he would veto—

The SPEAKER. Will the gentleman please yield.

Asking members about conversations with other governmental officials is not appropriate on the floor of the House.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Okay. Well, it is my understanding, Mr. Speaker, that the Governor's Office has indicated that they will indeed veto this bill as well. So apparently, all of the questions or concerns that the Governor had, which was made mention earlier and throughout this conversation, there are still other questions and concerns that they have that have not been addressed by this bill. So I wanted to bring that to the floor, into the record.

Also, Mr. Speaker, would it be appropriate to ask the maker of this bill if he would be amenable to actually excluding, until further information could be gathered, excluding cities of the second class out of this package or this bill?

Mr. KENNEY. Mr. Speaker, the answer is no.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Mr. Speaker, for clarity, so, no, you would not be amenable to having the city of Pittsburgh taken out of the packet of bills?

Mr. KENNEY. At this time, no.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I would just like to reiterate and make a comment toward the bill.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman is in order and may proceed.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Again, I understand what we all are trying to accomplish here, and I am generally supportive in the

nature of allowing people to have a say in what government does for them and to them. However, I just do not believe we have done enough to answer all the questions that were necessary to make this a good bill, a good law, so I would again encourage my colleagues to vote “no” on final passage.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE CANCELED

The SPEAKER. The Chair notes the presence on the floor of the House of the gentleman from Fayette, Mr. Roberts. His name will be added to the master roll.

CONSIDERATION OF HB 855 CONTINUED

The SPEAKER. The gentleman from Lycoming, Mr. Cappelli.

Mr. CAPPELLI. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, notwithstanding my respect for the prime sponsor of the bill and the chairman of the Urban Affairs Committee and their advocacy on behalf of the city of Philadelphia and its firefighting contingent, I cannot support this bill and would strongly urge my colleagues to oppose it as well.

I supported this legislation last fall when it dealt acutely with the city of Philadelphia and did so understanding the haphazard way the administration there was approaching the issue of firefighting and public safety in general. This bill, however, is far too cumbersome in what it represents to third-class cities.

I respect Representatives Frankel and Wheatley in their concerns about the city of Pittsburgh and how it will affect the Act 47 oversight committee and the Intergovernmental Cooperation Authority, but we have 53 third-class cities, Mr. Speaker. Most of them are facing incredibly expensive challenges with respect to paid fire protection, with Act 511 making it even more exacerbating. And I can tell you, from pension costs and other issues, the decisions that mayors and city councils face today are increasingly difficult, and to require them in an instance such as this to incur additional costs for consultants and studies and plans, which they cannot afford to begin with, in order to make the decisions they must make, is simply illogical and irrational.

Mr. Speaker, the Pennsylvania League of Cities and Municipalities adamantly opposes this legislation because of the way in which it will commandeer away local control and decisionmaking authority, and for those reasons, Mr. Speaker, I would urge a “no” vote and allow our local officials who have been elected to make the decisions that they have been empowered to make.

Thank you, sir.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Luzerne, Mr.—Does the minority leader wish to be recognized? Mr. DeWeese.

Mr. DeWEESE. Just 30 seconds. I hope this does not hurt anybody, but I would just like to commend the last speaker. That was the most irrefutable logic that could be asserted on the moment, and I just wanted to say that, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The gentleman from Luzerne, Mr. Blaum.

Mr. BLAUM. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I am surprised by some of the debate that I heard here on the floor of the House. I voted for this bill when it came up the last time when it pertained to the city of Philadelphia. So did every single member on the floor of the House, except two members. It then went to the Governor, and he vetoed it and mentioned that other municipalities should have been included, and it comes back to us.

In formulating this new piece of legislation, I think we all understand the fiscal challenges that the city of Pittsburgh has. When the gentleman asked a very simple question, Representative Wheatley, you know, cannot Pittsburgh be taken out, and the answer was a flat “no,” I think the gentleman and his concerns deserve a little bit more respect than that and a little bit more time.

I think the gentleman, Mr. Tigue, raised some very important questions when it concerned very large townships versus very small third-class cities: Why would very small third-class cities be included and very large townships excluded? It seems to me that I just wrote the Governor’s next veto message.

We should legislate better than this. Twenty-four or forty-eight hours to take Pittsburgh out and include other larger townships can be done very quickly and very cleanly and sent to the Governor’s desk. I support the concept, and I represent a third-class city and will vote for the bill, but these corrections should be listened to and these corrections should be made if you want to make your bill a better bill and, more importantly, the law of Pennsylvania.

I would just ask that we all have a little bit more camaraderie here in listening to the very serious concerns of the Representatives from the city of Pittsburgh. I think they are real. They do not have to be included in this. I think it raises all kinds of legal issues as to whether, because of the local governing body there now, whether it can be included in this. I think we can have a law that can go to the Governor’s desk and be signed, or certainly have an overwhelming support of both chambers so that it would be signed. But instead, we are sending a bill there that probably is going to come back to us in the same shape, because for whatever reason, we arrogantly told the city of Pittsburgh, you must be included, and we told the firemen who represent some of our larger townships, bigger than many of our third-class cities in square miles, you cannot be included. That is not fair to firemen, and it is not fair to the people who are making very, very difficult decisions in the city of Pittsburgh.

I wish, I wish that the sponsor of the bill himself might make the motion that we postpone to offer those simple amendments and get this done, you know, anytime Wednesday and accomplish, really accomplish something for the people of Pennsylvania and for the firemen of Pennsylvania.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

POINT OF ORDER

The SPEAKER. For what purpose does the gentleman, Mr. Wheatley, rise?

Mr. WHEATLEY. A point of order, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman will state his point.

Mr. WHEATLEY. I rise to make a motion to suspend the rules to offer an amendment.

The SPEAKER. We are not aware of any amendment, Mr. Wheatley.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Yes, Mr. Speaker, I have the amendment. It was drafted, and it was drafted a little late, Mr. Speaker. That is why I am asking for a suspension of the rules.

The SPEAKER. All right. That is fine with us, Mr. Wheatley. We just need to see a copy of it.

Mr. WHEATLEY. Yes, sir.

Essentially, Mr. Speaker, I am trying to do as best I can to offer some reasonable solutions, so this amendment essentially does what I asked the prime sponsor of the bill if he would support, and it pulls the city of Pittsburgh out of this grouping of cities and municipalities in this bill until we have further time to study the implications to the city of Pittsburgh. So essentially, that is what the amendment does, Mr. Speaker.

The **SPEAKER**. The gentleman has the gratitude of the entire body. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

Mr. **EACHUS** submitted the following remarks for the Legislative Journal:

This accounts for startup costs (hiring an enrollment broker, any additional State staff) based on decisions, the State's decision, to develop and implement a pilot program to integrate the financing and administration of all Medicaid-funded long-term care services for eligible individuals.

The program includes: the department contracting with at least one to three care management organizations to operate this pilot project in the designated service areas. Each care management organization shall accept a capitated payment per enrollee per month that will be negotiated upon actuarially sound principles.

The care management organizations shall demonstrate their ability: 1) to assist eligible individuals in the program with accessing long-term care services in the most appropriate and least restrictive setting, and 2) to utilize a consumer-centered care coordination model. Care management organizations shall utilize and build upon the existing aging network, including the local area agencies on aging and the aging resource centers. All eligible individuals in the service areas shall automatically be enrolled in the pilot program. The department shall monitor the program to ensure continued quality and access, consumer satisfaction, and the financial solvency of the participating care management organizations as well as providing general oversight for the pilot program. The department shall seek the necessary Federal waivers to implement this pilot project by the effective date.

Projected Savings:

The savings for one quarter (4/1/06 - 6/30/06) is: approximately \$250,000

The State will see an estimated \$1.1 million in savings after the first full 12-month period of implementation. (06-07)

Estimated additional savings of \$43 million in the second full year of implementation (07-08)

Estimated additional savings of \$75 million in the third full year

Estimated additional savings of \$103 million in the fourth full year

Ms. MANDERINO. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Thank you, Representative Fleagle, for standing for interrogation.

My reading of the analysis of the amendment is it looks like about \$22 million is being used to create a new line item to deal with placements of folks from Harrisburg State Hospital into community placements, and my concern is where the money is coming from, and I would like an explanation of what services are covered under the line items that you are reducing in order to create this new line item.

Mr. FLEAGLE. Actually, the total is \$22 million. Let us see, \$10 million from State funds and \$12 million from – excuse me; the other way around – \$12 million from State funds and \$10 million from Federal funds. We are taking – and I can give you the specific figures – we are taking \$5 million from mental health services, \$10 million from medical assistance, \$6 million from the medical assistance capitation line.

And I know, Mr. Speaker, what you are trying to get at. What I am trying to do in this amendment is get some kind of commitment in writing that the funds are going to follow the closure of Harrisburg State Hospital. I am not trying to stop that closure at this time because I think it is inevitable. I am not trying to slow it up, and I know this administration has committed to having the funds follow to community placement, but as the gentelady knows, after you have been here awhile, you do not always take – I do not want to say do not take people's word for it, but I like to see things in writing. I want this commitment in writing that those funds are going to follow those folks when they come out into my community, which we welcome them, but this thing of saying, trust me; the funds will be there, I just cannot buy. So what I am trying to do with this amendment is specifically guiding those moneys out to the communities. Now, they might have gotten there otherwise under this administration or whatever administration would have been there, but I think that this puts it in writing and makes that commitment up front.

Ms. MANDERINO. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I appreciate the maker of the amendment's explanation, and I understand his concern about what is happening in his local community, but I have a concern about what is happening in my local community as well, and to me, the tradeoff that I would be casting if I supported this amendment is not one that I am comfortable with, because taking \$5 1/2 million out of mental health services at the State level and another \$10 1/2 million out of the Federal line item means less mental health service dollars available for the great demand in my community.

In addition, taking money from the medical assistance capitation in the amount of \$6.6 million is an extremely hard hit. There are very dramatic decreases in services in this particular budget that are paid for out of the medical assistance capitation line item that deal with very ill people getting doctor's visits and prescription drug coverage, and that line item has already taken – I do not know that exact line item – a combination of those line items is taking an over almost \$300 million hit. I do not want to give another hit to it.

So I am going to vote "no" on this, and I ask other folks who are concerned about that to consider their vote on this amendment as well. Thank you.

On that question, the Chair recognizes the gentleman, Mr. O'Brien.

Mr. O'BRIEN. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

I know we are trying to move very quickly, so I will be as brief as possible.

The amendments that I am proposing, the three amendments – I believe one has already been voted on – these implement the five recommendations of the Autism Task Force that was chaired by Estelle Richman. Basically, the five recommendations that the task force recommends are creating an Office of Disability within the Department of Welfare that has a bureau or division of autism and related disorders. That is already being done by the department as we speak, so it requires no specific amendment today. They are also in the department creating a consumer-led organization that provides information about autism services and multiple systems and advocates for the needs of individuals living with autism. The third, the members of the task force are continuing to work on a Federal autism-specific waiver.

What I am asking for is funding for the fourth and fifth items and one other item. It will situate three regional centers in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The reason for that, Mr. Speaker, is that we need to create a roadmap for success, and that roadmap for success is necessary, because the average age for diagnosing individuals with autism is 4 to 6 years of age, much later than it should be when we can take advantage of the early intervention possibilities. These children develop not on an age-specific plane but on a developmental plane, and if we wait until 6 years of age, these individuals will never maximize their developmental possibilities, and hence they will be much more costly to program for in the future. What we propose is implementing the gold standard of diagnostics. That will tell you whether you have it or you do not; it will tell you where you are on the spectrum, and it will eliminate the redundancy and the necessity for multiple diagnoses. Right now you have to get one for education and one for welfare.

It also will create, it will be a medical and a nonmedical protocol, and it will have a trainers-to-trainers component attached to that so it is portable.

Mr. Speaker, we want to create these systems, these centers, across the Commonwealth so that your child, your constituent, your neighbor's child, will not have to travel more than an hour or two hours and that we will have the state-of-the-art response for those children. In order to do that, Mr. Speaker, we have to have \$2 million for each of those centers, so I am asking for an affirmative vote of \$6 million to implement that part of the report.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

For what purpose does the gentleman, Mr. Vitali, rise?

Mr. VITALI. To interrogate the maker of the amendment.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. The gentleman indicates he will stand for interrogation. You may proceed.

Mr. VITALI. I am just trying to understand this. You are taking in this amendment it looks like a half million dollars from general obligation debt service, and it looks like you took about \$6 million from general obligation debt service in the last amendment. I am just wondering, is that going to impact our ability to pay back certain debt we have already incurred? Will that impact our ability to borrow in the future? I am trying to get a sense for when you are taking this money from general obligation debt service, what does that mean? Could you

explain what it means to take money from general obligation debt service?

Mr. O'BRIEN. Basically, I am taking money that represents excess funds in the debt service obligation.

Mr. VITALI. Okay. This is in some account. The general account is used to pay off existing debt, but we have more than we need to pay off existing debts?

Mr. O'BRIEN. That is correct, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. VITALI. Okay. Thank you.
