SB 300, PN 1986

Mr. VITALI. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Just a basic question that applies to this in particular but to the previous nonpreferreds and perhaps future ones. For example, on this one we are spending \$8 million more for this particular nonpreferred. I believe a previous one might have been about \$15 million more, and I have not looked at the entire list, but I am wondering if that pattern is going to continue, and if so, why, why are the nonpreferreds being increased sizable amounts in this process?

Mr. FEESE. Mr. Speaker, in response to the gentleman's question, each nonpreferred received an increase of about 4 1/2 percent, if we are talking about the State-relateds, and other line items within the particular nonpreferreds were increased based on needs that were presented by that institution to the four caucuses and to the Governor's Office, and as a result of which, some of those needs were addressed in those line items, and the amounts varied as a result of that.
