COMMUNICATION FROM GOVERNOR

VETO OF HOUSE BILL

The Speaker laid before the House a communication in writing from the office of His Excellency, the Governor of the Commonwealth, advising that the following House bill had been vetoed by the Governor:

HB 1696.

Said bill having been returned with the following message:

Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
Office of the Governor
Harrisburg

July 8, 2011

To the Honorable House of Representatives
of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania:

I am returning, without my approval, House Bill 1696, Printer's No. 2260. I regret having to do so. However, I have concluded that the bill, as it is written, is Constitutionally infirm.

Specifically, Article III, Section 32 of our Constitution states, in pertinent part,

The General Assembly shall pass no local or special law in any case which has been or can be provided for by general law and specifically the General Assembly shall not pass any local or special law.

1. Regulating the affairs of counties, cities, townships, wards, boroughs, or school districts...

By limiting a property tax moratorium to counties of the fourth class, with a population between 185,000 and 210,000 as of the 2010

United States Census, the bill has restricted its application to one county – Washington County.

After consulting with legal counsel, including the Office of Attorney General, there is no question in my mind that the bill, as worded, would violate the State Constitution.

Consequently, pursuant to Article IV, Section 15, I am returning House Bill 1696, Printer's No. 2260 with my noted objection.

NORTHERN HIGH SCHOOL BOYS BASEBALL TEAM PRESENTED

The SPEAKER. The Speaker invites Representative Perry to the rostrum for the purpose of presenting a citation to the Northern High School PIAA Class AAA State Champion Baseball Team.

Mr. PERRY. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Perry, may proceed.

Mr. PERRY. I am here to tell you a little story. In the recently held – and I say recently, this spring – PIAA Class AAA baseball final, my alma mater, Northern High School Polar Bears, which went 23 and 5, defeated the Tunkhannock Tigers, which were 19 and 3, by a score of 6 to 3 in State College.

Now, Northern High School was playing for their first team State championship in the school's history. In their run to the title, Northern defeated Somerset by 11 to nothing, Punxsutawney by 6 to 1, and an undefeated Elizabeth Forward 6 to 4 in the semifinals, and then Tunkhannock. This was the first time the Northern Polar Bears played for a State baseball title in the school's history. Now, previously Northern had never made it past the semifinal round, which they reached back in 2006. Northern was the third-place finisher in the District 3 AAA tournament and champion of the Mid-Penn Colonial Division for the third consecutive year.

Manager Brian Robison's squad was led by center fielder Joe Tuschak, who was drafted in the sixth round of the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft a few months ago, who crushed his ninth home run for the season, a grand slam to center field to cap off a six-run fourth inning, and which proved more than enough runs for their southpaw ace, Vince Apicella. Apicella, who finished the season 12 and 1 and was the winning pitcher in the championship game, led our area with a 0.84 ERA (earned run average) and strikeouts of 126 for the year. He pitched all seven innings in the title game, with eight strikeouts, no walks, six hits, and one earned run. Catcher Jon Mayer, only a junior but who was also piquing the interests of Major League Baseball teams, batted a sizzling 500, 12 for 24, in the district and State playoffs. And Dylan Tamecki led the team in the season with 10 doubles and was tied for first in our area with 34 RBIs (runs batted in). Now, Northern won 11 out of its last

12 games. They won 10 games via mercy rule with 8 shutouts, and scored at least 15 runs in 15 games.

And with that, I ask for your congratulations for an impressive victory and a first for Northern High School. Our town is very, very proud of these folks.

While none of us can understand the bravery and fear that was going through the minds and seen in the acts of those who perished during the terrible attacks on September 11, 10 years ago, what we can do is we can observe and understand the lessons that they gave us and what happened subsequent to those events, especially in some of our areas, like mine, where the attacks actually hit home.

I, of course, represent Somerset County that encompasses Shanksville. My home is about 4 miles from the crash site, and I would like to tell you a little bit about what happened that day

in Somerset County, and I think that everyone who perished on that day would be proud of the people of Pennsylvania and what they did subsequent to that attack.

If I take you back 10 years, I think all of us can remember the confusion of that morning. No one really knew what was happening. We, at least, in Berlin or Somerset who had watched the attacks on the towers in New York were confused about what was happening, and then suddenly the earth shook – literally for us – and Flight 93 crashed into an old abandoned strip job in Somerset County. We thought the sky was falling. No one knew what was going on, but we knew and we were darn sure we were going to hold the line against whatever it was.

After it happened, everyone got their children out of school, and they got in their trucks and their SUVs, their cars; the salt of the earth, the Frosty Sons of Thunder, as my predecessor, Alexander Ogle, said we were in 1820 in Somerset County. We took to the trucks and we had our rifles – some people do not like that, but we had them because we knew that we would hold the line at Dividing Ridge, if nowhere else, because as far as we were concerned, we were under attack. It turned out we were right. That day we did not have to hold the line against anyone in particular, but afterwards every National Guardsman or civilian in Pennsylvania found a way to hold the line in their own way, and that is something that I think that we can all be proud of. We can all know that whenever push comes to shove, we will shove back, and we did. And their lives were not lost in vain, tragic as it may be, and I think that the testament that we are here 10 years later still thinking about it, still understanding, and still remembering is a great sign for America, and I know that we will succeed against any adversary no matter how great.
