State Racing Fund and the ABLE Savings Program Fund to the Executive Department; to provide appropriations from the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account to the Judicial Department for the fiscal year July 1, 2016, to June 30, 2017; to provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 2016, to June 30, 2017, for the proper operation of several departments of the Commonwealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor License Fund money; to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth and for the payment of bills remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016; and to provide for the additional appropriation of Federal and State funds from the General Fund, the State Lottery Fund and the Tobacco Settlement Fund for the Executive and Legislative Departments of the Commonwealth for the fiscal year July 1, 2015, to June 30, 2016, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015.

STATEMENT BY MR. MILLER

The SPEAKER. Representative Dan Miller is recognized on unanimous consent.

Mr. D. MILLER. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I rise to congratulate the body on the passage of the bill that we just voted on. I want to recognize the work that was also done by Representative Knowles on HB 1924.

The interior light packages for firefighters are something that was incredibly important for us to update. We wanted to be sure that the chiefs' vehicles, the assistant chiefs' vehicles, and the department-owned vehicles that were being used by departments to be sure to get to scenes appropriately – today's light packages here are much safer and better designed than anything that we have had before – we had to be sure that those vehicles there were in compliance with existing law. And this bill, thankfully, was consolidated into one on some other good ideas by the good Representative from Philadelphia.

This is an important first step, and I very much appreciate the passage that was done today and working with the good Representative. Thank you.

Mr. **VITALI**. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

This is a relatively simple and straightforward amendment.

The bill itself requires, and I will quote, "The Department of Environmental Protection shall appoint a counsel to the board" – which is the Environmental Quality Board – "who shall also serve as an independent counsel to members of the board...."

So this requires independent counsel for the Environmental Quality Board, but it also requires the department to pay for that. What this amendment does is require that this independent counsel be paid independently of the Department of Environmental Protection – in fact, be paid for by the General Fund – and I think this will serve the purpose of making that counsel truly independent, because it can only be so independent if it is coming from the Department of Environmental Protection. If the counsel is being paid for by an entity who it is supposed to be independent from, there is that inherent conflict of interest, but if the money is coming from the General Fund, it can truly be independent of the Department of Environmental Protection.

So I think that this enhances the value of the bill in that it really underscores the fact that this counsel will truly be independent of the Department of Environmental Protection because the funding will be coming from a separate source. So I ask for a "yes" vote.

The SPEAKER. Does anybody else wish to be recognized on the amendment?

Representative John Maher, on the amendment.

Mr. **MAHER**. I do not think it is a bad idea, but I think the amendment lacks specificity. You cannot just say General Fund. We just completed the appropriation for the year ahead, and there was not a line item in there that is labeled "General Fund."

So despite the good intentions of the gentleman, I would ask for a "no" vote.
