OATH OF OFFICE ADMINISTERED TO MEMBER-ELECT

The SPEAKER. So I am going to be bringing up at this time Magistrate Judge Susan E. Schwab, Federal judge. The oath of office required by Article VI, section 3, of the Constitution of Pennsylvania will now be administered by the Chief United States Magistrate Judge for the Middle District of Pennsylvania, Susan E. Schwab, one of our colleagues, who we are so honored has taken the time to be with us.

As you may know, she served as deputy chief of staff for administration and with the Deputy Chief Counsel for the Democratic Caucus of the Pennsylvania House of Representatives. For the benefit of the members, I wanted to highlight the process that we went through in bringing this to the floor. HR 834 originated in the Rules Committee and we distributed copies to the members, and I know that both sides have caucused it extensively. We also worked with our Democrat counterparts as we worked through this solution.

We recognize the gravity of the current situation that lays before us and we understand the issues related with social distancing and the desire to limit large gatherings; however, our current rules did not have the flexibility in them so that we could operate in that manner. So what we did was propose some temporary changes that will live for the duration of the declaration of emergency. Those changes include changes to our communications rule during the blackout about the current breakout. Additionally, it will modify the times necessary between consideration of the bills, whether it be on a concurrence or a conference report, down to 3 hours. And it would allow proxy voting for people impacted by the current situation, both for floor votes and committee votes; that way we can continue to function as a coequal branch of government.

Mr. Speaker, I think that while we had recognized the current situation for what it is, we do also need to recognize that we need to continue to function as we head into the budget season and any associated bills that the Governor may need in order to continue carrying out the response to the current issues. I would urge all of the members for their affirmative vote so that we can continue on with the business of the House.

STATEMENT BY SPEAKER

The SPEAKER. Now, given the rule, the temporary rule which we just adopted, members – and please rely on your leaders and whips for the details, they certainly have it down in more considerable detail than I am from the rostrum – but your ability to vote can be remote, and it is done through a proxy process in conjunction with your respective caucus whips. So you will be working hand in hand with your respective caucus whips. The Majority Leader's Office, of course, will be providing everybody with detailed information about what particular votes would be in front of us. For those members that do wish to be here on the floor, obviously you are not required to vote remotely, but you may vote remotely given the temporary rule that was just adopted unanimously.

Please also know that when we are doing the votes on the floor, the votes are open for, according to our rules, are open for 10 minutes. So for those that have decided to be here that we will keep the entire 10 minutes open for the period of time that – now, if everybody has voted that is voting, then we will close the vote, but we can keep it open for the 10-minute period. Also, it may take us a little longer to tabulate the votes given the rule change.

And also please understand nothing has changed in terms of the committee process other than that you can do remote voting for the committee process, but a bill still has to come out of committee to get to the floor. The bill has to be scheduled by the leader to be voted on the floor. I recognize there is language in the rule that there will be consultation between the caucuses. So just please understand that nobody will be in any way, you are – I mean, you are an elected Representative and your vote matters and has to be counted, and now there is a process for so doing.
