PRAYER

HON. VALERIE S. GAYDOS, member of the House of Representatives, offered the following prayer:

Thank you, Madam Speaker.

Christ is risen – or Hristos voskrese in Church Slavonic – is the Easter greeting custom among many Eastern Orthodox Christians for the 40 days after Easter in countries like Russia, Ukraine, throughout the Balkans, and in Central, South, and Eastern Europe – and that is where my ancestors came from. In response to this greeting, the person or persons being addressed typically say, "voistnu voskrese," which means "indeed He is risen."

For my Greek friend, Representative Malagari, Khristos anesti. This phrase, "Christ is risen," said in many different languages, is an expression of the joy of the resurrection. It has been shared throughout the world where more than 260 million Orthodox Christians live. It is a time Christ is risen from the dead, trampling down death by death, and to those in the tombs bestowing life.

This spring people of all faiths and beliefs have been celebrating the newness of life, the renewal of love and of hope, and the joys of looking forward to a new future. In fact, 2023 has been quite a unique year in which many faiths have celebrated their greatest feasts simultaneously. Passover was celebrated by those of the Jewish faith on April 5-13. Western Christian Easter was celebrated on April 9, with Eastern Christian Easter celebrated on April 16. The month of Ramadan was celebrated March 22 through April 20 by Muslims. And those of Bahai faith celebrate Ridvan during the 12 days from April 21 to May 2. All over Pennsylvania this spring, people of all religions have been directed by God to seek new beginnings, to bury old hurts, to reach out to the divine and to all the people of God in love.

We are all God's children, so let us pray:

Dear God, we come before You today in this Pennsylvania State House chamber as a group of diverse individuals, a confluence of beliefs, seeking Your guidance and Your blessings. We duly recognize the uniqueness of each person present and we ask that You help each of us to celebrate and respect those differences and to focus on that which unites us, not that which divides us.

We pray that as this august Assembly begins its tasks that it will, by the grace of God, deliberate and act in the spirit of respect and freedom afforded to us in this great nation. We ask that You guide us and every individual here to work together to strengthen and aid all of the people of Pennsylvania, continuing to contribute to and help grow freedom, goodness, and an ongoing spirit of love and cooperation.

We pray that You grant us the wisdom to listen to each other with an open heart, and the courage to speak with kindness and compassion. We ask that You help us to be mindful of our actions, our words, and our deeds, and that each may reflect the love and grace that You have shown us.

We ask that You bless this gathering and all gatherings for the good of the people, and to guide us gracefully to help us perform this work which we are about to begin in union with You and with the totality and fullness of everything that is good.

We ask that You fill our souls with gladness, and save us, for You alone are most merciful. God, grant us this so that we may glorify You, our creator, in our efforts and in our labors. Encompass us with Thy holy angels, that guided and guarded by them, we may attain to the unity of faith and to the knowledge of Thine unapproachable glory, for Thou art blessed unto ages of ages.

May the peace of God shine upon all. In Your holy name we pray. Amen.

The SPEAKER. For the information of the members, House rule 20 was amended at the start of this session to provide that "No joint resolution originating in the House which proposes amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania shall be passed containing more than one subject."

HB 1 provides for a 2-year window for victims of childhood sexual abuse to file previously time-barred claims. The Chair rules that the following amendments are out of order for being violative of House rule 20's requirement that House-originating joint resolutions proposing amendments to the Constitution contain a single subject. The amendments are as follows: Amendment No. 00154, which seeks to insert language allowing the General Assembly to disapprove of regulations; amendment 00155, which seeks to insert voter ID language; amendment 00156, which seeks to insert voter ID language and language to allow the General Assembly to disapprove of regulations; amendment 00157 seeks to insert language allowing the General Assembly to disapprove of regulations; amendment 00158, which seeks to also insert voter identification language; amendment 00159, which seeks to insert voter ID language and language allowing the General Assembly to disapprove of regulations.

RULING OF CHAIR APPEALED

The SPEAKER. For what purpose does the gentleman rise?

Mr. ECKER. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

I make a motion to approve the ruling of the Chair on amendment A00158. Madam Chair, correction. I ask to appeal the ruling of the Chair.

The SPEAKER. Understood. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The gentleman, Representative Ecker, appeals the ruling of the Chair that amendment 00158 is out of order for being violative of House rule 20.

The SPEAKER. On that question, the Chair recognizes the gentleman from Adams County.

Mr. ECKER. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

Madam Speaker, just recently our Commonwealth Court has made a ruling that amendments before this body do not need, are not required to have a single subject. Moreover, Madam Chair, our Constitution does not prohibit multiple subjects be contained, be prohibited from being contained in an amendment.

Amendment A00158, Madam Chair, is an important issue for this Commonwealth. It contains the provisions of voter ID, and while I know some members in here will characterize this as voter suppression, we already have a form of voter ID in this Commonwealth. This will only enhance that.

Our Constitution allows us to have multiple subjects within an amendment. This body has undertaken those actions in the past. And, Madam Speaker, this will not delay the victims' rights. This will not delay that underlying aspect of this bill. It will be contained in that amendment so that the voters of Pennsylvania can decide this issue.

Madam Chair, if we pass this today and send it to the Senate, the issue of voter ID will be sent to the people of Pennsylvania, not this body, and the people of Pennsylvania should have the opportunity to decide whether or not they would like enhanced voter ID in this Commonwealth.

Madam Speaker, I recognize our rules may require a single subject, but the laws of this Commonwealth do not, and I would ask that the motion be agreed to.

Thank you, Madam Speaker.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The Chair recognizes the minority leader on the motion to appeal the ruling of the Chair.

Mr. CUTLER. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

Madam Speaker, I think the good gentleman has provided an excellent summary of why the ruling of the Chair should be appealed. The fact is that this amendment contains an important issue. It is also consistent with the past practices of this chamber, and more importantly, it was recently upheld by our courts.

Finally, it would put these important questions, both in terms of the statute of limitations as well as, in this case, voter ID, in front of the people, and it would not impact the timing or the ability to offer them in an upcoming election because this is the same language that has passed previously.

I support the gentleman's motion and urge the members to do so as well.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.

The Chair recognizes the majority leader on the motion to appeal the ruling of the Chair.

Mr. BRADFORD. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

To the point just raised, I do not mean to be contrarian, but I think any fair reading of the recent Commonwealth Court case is actually that that court stood on the issue of ripeness for dispensing with the issue. I would also point that our rules made very clear that the days of Christmas-treeing constitutional amendments is over in this body. As you recall, in past sessions there was a habit of putting together such similar issues as abortion bans and voter ID and the selection of Lieutenant Governors all into one bill and forced members, really, in the uncomfortable position about choosing about these types of reforms that need a thoughtful process. If the minority party wants such a thoughtful process, I would encourage them to offer an amendment, put that amendment through the committee process, and at the appropriate time, have that heard.

Very briefly, again, Madam Speaker, I believe this is an opportunity for this body to advance a piece of legislation, an amendment to the people of Pennsylvania that returns some legislative oversight as it pertains to regulatory decisions that are happening in this Commonwealth. Right now the executive branch has really an unfettered power to pass regulations without being checked by this legislative branch, and this as well should be decided by the people of Pennsylvania, whether or not they want their Constitution to have a true separation of powers and allow the legislative branch an oversight over regulatory reform.

Thank you, Madam Chair.

The SPEAKER. Shall the decision of the Chair stand as the judgment of the House?

The Chair recognizes the minority leader.

Mr. CUTLER. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

Madam Speaker, the arguments for this amendment are exactly the same. The gentleman's motion is in order and should be supported because of the importance of the issues.

I know that my friend and colleague, the Democratic leader, indicated that the court was decided on the issue of ripeness. Madam Speaker, if that were true and the fact that it was solely an issue of ripeness, if it was so wrong, as we have heard from time to time here in this chamber, they could have and would have attacked the procedure as well; however, they did not, and until such time as that would happen, the reality is that this is a process that has been used previously. We used it when we worked on curbing the Governor's Executive powers during an emergency, which this chamber worked on in a bipartisan way. We also ensured racial equality in that same package.

Madam Speaker, if that process did not meet that standard, that, too, could be overruled. I would offer that the legislative branch is a strong branch of government. We have the authority to offer a variety of amendments at a singular time, and we can also put them forward into a series of different elections, which we do in the language that is contained elsewhere in the bill. We could even designate which elections it would appear in.

Madam Speaker, the truth is, this is an important issue. It is one that will impact every aspect of our lives up to and including our electric bills – which have been going through the roof – related to the regulatory process.

Madam Speaker, it is time that we put these issues in front of the people. And I understand the good gentleman has argued that the rules simply do not allow it, but I would offer that the laws, the court rulings, and the Constitution would allow consideration of multiple issues. That is, in and of itself, the process to amend the Constitution.

For that reason I believe that we should consider this. We should appeal the ruling of the Chair so that we can get to the important issues and get them before the voters here in the Commonwealth. Thank you.

The SPEAKER. The Chair thanks the gentleman.
