

BOARD OF WARDENS - SUPPLEMENT
Act of May 14, 1861, P.L. 745, No. 676
A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

Cl. 74

To an act to establish a Board of Wardens for the Port of Philadelphia, and for the Regulation of Pilots and Pilotages, and for other purposes therein mentioned, passed twenty-ninth of March, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and three.

Section 1. Pilots oath to perform duty faithfully

Every person exercising the profession of a pilot in the bay or river Delaware, under a license duly granted, or may be hereafter granted by said board of wardens of the port of Philadelphia, shall, immediately after the passage of this act, take and subscribe an oath or affirmation, before the master warden of said port, who is hereby authorized and empowered to administer the same, that he will support the Constitution of the United States, and the Constitution and laws of Pennsylvania, and well and faithfully perform his duty as a pilot. 1861, May 14, P.L. 745, Sec. 1.

Section 2. Refusal to take oath forfeits license

In case any pilot licensed under the provisions of the act to which this is a supplement, and the supplements thereto, shall neglect or refuse to take and subscribe the oath or affirmation herein provided, after notice having been given by the master warden, it shall be the duty of the master warden to withdraw and cancel the license of such pilot; and it shall not be lawful for any pilot so refusing or neglecting to take and subscribe the oath of affirmation aforesaid, to perform the duties of a pilot in the bay or river Delaware. 1861, May 14, P.L. 745, Sec. 2.

Section 3. Certificate of oath to be attached to license

It shall be the duty of the master warden to give each pilot who has taken and subscribed the oath as aforesaid, a certificate of the same; which certificate shall be attached to the license, and a record of the same kept in the warden's office. 1861, May 14, P.L. 745, Sec. 3.
