# SENATE

TUESDAY, April 6, 1976.

The Senate met at 11:00 a.m., Eastern Standard Time.

The PRESIDENT (Lieutenant Governor Ernest P. Kline) in the Chair.

## PRAYER

The Chaplain, The Reverend ELWOOD L. STARK, Pastor of Zion Lutheran Church, Indiana, offered the following prayer:

#### SB 704 TAKEN FROM THE TABLE

#### SB 704 PASSED OVER GOVERNOR'S VETO

Senator NOLAN. Mr. President, I call from the table Senate Bill No. 704, Printer's No. 1562, and move the Senate proceed with the reconsideration, and agree to pass the same, the objections of the Governor to the contrary notwithstanding.

The PRESIDENT. It has been moved by Senator Nolan that the Senate proceed to reconsider Senate Bill No. 704, Printer's No. 1562, and agree to pass the same, the objections of the Governor to the contrary notwithstanding.

The vote required for this motion is two-thirds of the tion.

Senators, or thirty-four votes. The Clerk will proceed to read the veto message.

The Clerk read the Governor's veto message as follows:

March 18, 1976

To the Honorable, the Senate of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania:

I return herewith, without my approval, Senate Bill No. 704, Printer's No. 1562, entitled "An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P. L. 177, No. 175), entitled 'The Admin-istrative Code of 1929,' prohibiting the assignment of personnel to circumvent appropriation limits."

Senate Bill 704 amends the Administrative Code by restricting the assignment of employees from one department to another.

At the outset, let me state flatly that I am in full agree-ment with the intent of this bill. The Executive Branch, as well as the other branches of government, must abide by the appropriation limits set by law and should not be able to transfer employees from one agency to another solely for the purpose of avoiding appropriation limits set by the General Assembly.

This Administration has had a solid record of controlling personnel procedures and in holding down the state payroll, in line with funds appropriated by the Legislature.

Just today, Standard and Poor's announced that it is maintaining its "AA" high grade rating on the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's General Obligation Bonds.

One of the principal reasons for this action was our ability to control costs of state government and the steps we have taken to reduce the payroll at the Department of Transportation by 1,000 and by more than 1,000 posi-tions in departments covered by The General Fund during the past thirteen months.

The reversal of the previous pattern of state payroll growth is dramatic evidence of our determination to manage this government on a businesslike basis and to live within appropriations.

Therefore, in vetoing this bill, I do not wish to imply that my office, or this Administration generally, seeks the freedom to have absolute authority over the placement of state employees.

Far from it. The record clearly demonstrates the opposite.

My reasons for vetoing the bill are as follows: The Budget Office, the Office of Administration and the Department of Justice strongly contend that the language in Senate Bill 704 is vague to the point of not being understandable. It could cause severe restrictions which are not intended by the sponsors.

The consequences could be far reaching.

For example, the State Action Center, which receives toll free citizen calls for help from throughout the Commonwealth, is staffed primarily by individuals assigned to that office by the various departments.

Enactment of Senate Bill 704 into law could conceivably destroy the Action Center, dismantle the Hot Line and deprive our people of their instant access to the most successful citizens' complaint service of any state in the union.

Second, as Secretary McIntosh points out so strongly, certain circumstances demand a considerable degree of assignment flexibility. Excellent cases in point are the disasters precipitated by Hurricanes Agnes and Eloise. During these disasters, had the provisions of this act been law, the government would have been handicapped in its attempts to bring relief to flood victims throughout the Commonwealth.

The imprecise language of this bill could also affect government's ability to coordinate many programs which cross departmental lines. For example, programs for our elderly citizens, for health services and for manpower training have functions placed in various departments of state government. It is vitally necessary to have these programs coordinated. In many cases, a single individual from one department will be assigned to do this coordina-

This is authority which is essential to the efficient running of government and it is this function which Senate Bill 704, by its vague wording, would place in jeopardy. To deprive the Executive Branch of its ability to use

such a person in a coordinating capacity would damage our efforts to eliminate fragmentation and streamline services.

In short, any Administration needs a certain amount of flexibility in reassigning employees for vital functions. Senate Bill 704, as written, does not provide for such

instances.

Instead it leaves the distinct possibility that such reassignments would be prohibited.

Under the circumstances, I have no choice but to veto this bill, and to ask the members of the General Assembly to support my action, in defense of the Hot Line, the emergency needs of the Commonwealth and the provision of coordinated intra-departmental services.

Senator HESS. Mr. President, as this bill has progressed through the Legislature and in past enactment, there seems to be some confusion as to how we should deal with the commissioners. First, they were reimbursed under the old law for their expenses. Now we have a provision before us which says the Governor shall appoint a chairman, and from somewhere out of the blue came a salary of \$22,500. I do not know whether he is to be the executive director or not. If they want an executive director, maybe that is what they should have.

The bill further states that the two remaining commissioners shall be compensated at the rate of \$100 per diem.

My amendments are very simple. They set the per diem at \$44 plus mileage for all three members. As many of the Senators know, that is what is provided for the Legislature.

Senator SCANLON. Mr. President, when the Harness Racing Commission was first created, they had about twenty days of racing per year. Now it is well up over one hundred, and the job of the commissioners will become full time. Harness racing is a paying proposition and produces money for the Commonwealth, so one of the commissioners can be compensated full time for conducting the services which are required here in Harrisburg. The other commissioners certainly deserve per diem consistent with what we pay officials in other bureaus and commissions.

Mr. President, I ask everyone to oppose these amendments.

Senator SCANLON. Mr. President, I understand that Mr. Ahwesh is the present chairman. I do not know who will be appointed by the Governor. If he appoints the current chairman, it will be Mr. Ahwesh.

Senator MELLOW. Mr. President, can the gentleman tell me if the Governor has appointed Mr. Ahwesh as acting chairman?

Senator SCANLON. Mr. President, it is my understanding that he has and he will.

Senator TILGHMAN. Mr. President, this bill is in its fourth printer's number and it is difficult for me to follow where the amendment took place, but as stated on page 2, line 8, we should realize that this is not just a salary bill. When we set up the State Harness Racing Commission, it was an independent body, "administrative commission" are the words, and it is, under this bill, established as a departmental administrative commission within the Department of Agriculture. For that reason, Mr. President, I am opposed to the bill as well as the salaries that are set in this bill.

For some reason the public in my District is under the mistaken notion that we have passed this legislation. I guess I have received upwards of a dozen letters asking how it is possible that I could have voted to increase the salaries from zero to the figure mentioned in this bill, \$22,500. I think it is a precedent that we are setting which will immediately be followed by a salary bill for the thoroughbred Horse Racing Commission, which is probably one of the worst run commissions in the United States. I think that to set this up as a commission within the Department of Agriculture is wrong. I have been involved in the horse racing bills for almost ten years and can go into many reasons why it is wrong.

Mr. President, I would urge my colleagues to oppose the creating of this commission in the Department of Agriculture as well as the large salary increase. These gentlemen are not full time. They are part-time people.

I feel that limiting the functions of the Secretary of Transportation in this field is ridiculous, and I think it will impede the progress of obtaining any design work or any preengineering work.

Mr. President, I ask the Members of the Senate to support these amendments.

Senator FRAME. I regret very much that my colleagues did not have the opportunity to examine in caucus these amendments and their effect upon the bill when the bill was under consideration. I would like my colleagues to note that the effect of the adoption of these amendments is to delete Section 2 on page 3 of the bill, which was added, in my opinion, rather hastily and without sufficient thought by the House of Representatives when it had this measure, which is an essential measure, under consideration. The retention of this section in the bill, in my opinion, greatly impedes the management ability of the Secretary of the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation.

Therefore, Mr. President, I urge that this section be deleted by asking my colleagues to adopt the amendments now under consideration.

WHEREAS, This area can boast of many other positive attributes which will make it advantageous to locate here; therefore be it

RESOLVED (the House of Representatives concurring). That the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania cordially invites the United Mine Workers of America to locate their International Headquarters on one of the likely sites in southwestern Pennsylvania; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a favorable consideration of this in-

vitation will be appreciated and that serious consideration, within the jurisdiction of the Pennsylvania Legislature, will be given, to any situation that may develop relative to the headquarters being located in this area; and be it further

## HOUSE CONCURS IN SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

The Clerk of the House of Representatives being introduced, informed the Senate that the House has concurred in resolution from the Senate, entitled:

#### PETITIONS AND REMONSTRANCES

Senator JUBELIRER. Mr. President, I think it would be well to note the passage of House Bill No. 580 today which significantly changed the common law and the statutory law on the criminal charge of statutory rape and forcible rape. When this bill came over from the House to the Committee on Judiciary, there certainly was a great deal of controversy and pressure for its passage in a manner that was not in line with the thinking of some of the members of the Committee on Judiciary. There was a great deal of lobbying by those who felt that the bill should not be amended or changed in any way from the House version. I think it is commendable

that the gentleman from Philadelphia, Senator Hill, as the chairman of that committee, took the position—as the other Members of that committee did—that we would do what was best for the bill and the bill today passed nearly unanimously.

This bill, Mr. President, significantly changes the evidence that is allowed to be introduced into a trial. The evidence of a victim's prior sexual conduct is no longer a subject of proper cross examination in either statutory rape or in forcible rape. We should have, Mr. President, a situation now where the victim of the heinous crime of rape is no longer treated as the defendant and that the defendant can still receive a very fair trial under the laws of evidence as we have attempted to do here today.

Mr. President, the most controversial decision relative to this bill was whether we should accept the House version and forget the crime of statutory rape and introduce a separate statute or whether we should act in a responsible manner and place the crime of statutory rape within the bill that we had. Much discussion was held and the bill, as it finally passed, contained this: Any male eighteen or over who engages in sexual relations with a female under the age of fourteen is guilty of statutory rape, wherein there is no defense.

Prior to this, Mr. President, a male sixteen years of age or older and a female under sixteen who engaged in sexual relations, the male could be charged with statutory rape. In addition, the defense of chastity in the community where one lives was a defense wherein the victim became the defendant.

Mr. President, we have taken this crime out of the high school, where it did not belong. We have now made the crime of statutory rape for a male of eighteen or older and a female of under fourteen. In the event—and there are many possibilities—where you have one who is fifteen or sixteen or fourteen, we still have the crime of contributing to the delinquency of minors, a misdemeanor of the first degree, carrying a prison sentence of five years or more.

I think, Mr. President, that we are on the right track. I would hope that the House will concur in the amendments of the Senate and that this bill will become law as quickly as possible in order to protect all victims of society.

I question, Mr. President, whether all victims of society who were involved in crimes of this nature were, in fact, protected. I think the Senate of Pennsylvania did its duty. I look forward to the time when the House concurs in these amendments and the Governor signs this bill into law.

Senator STAUFFER. Mr. President, in early March the Administration took an action which I think should be brought to the attention of the Senate, because it seems that too little attention has been paid to this very serious move in the media. I believe it is something that can cause a very devastating effect on many people in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; and that was an order by the Governor that the various boards of professional licensure should curtail their operations for the balance of the current fiscal year.

This order, Mr. President, was based on the desire to save money to curtail the expenditure, but I think when one examines the relatively small amount of money involved and the great difficulty that is being wrought by

this decision, I think that any clear thinking person would agree that this is not a wise decision and is one that should be reconsidered and changed immediately.

For example, Mr. President, the State Board of Pharmacy has been curtailed in its operations. In discussion with some of those people, I learned this means that there will be no prosecution for drug violations for the balance of this year. It means that new pharmacies cannot be licensed and, obviously, in many areas, there is a need for new pharmacies; it means that those who have committed violations that should bring about the suspension or revocation of their licenses cannot be dealt with and it means that some 500 pharmacy school graduates, who will be completing their education within the next month or so will be unable to take the examination to become licensed in Pennsylvania and, certainly, this is a disservice to the young people of the Commonwealth who have received their training and are eager to pursue their professions.

That is just one of the boards. When we think about the nursing profession and the great problems that will be wrought there by the inability for nurses to be examined and for those who are required to take reexaminations, those reexaminations will not take place until January of 1977, so we are losing the biggest part of the year. Of course, we are also talking about cosmetology, dentistry, barbering, architecture, engineers, physicians and so forth, and I think we realize that this is a very, very serious situation.

Mr. President, I am a bit surprised at this action on the part of the Administration because, if one examines the budget, last year there was a four per cent increase for the current fiscal year given in the budget, and this was what the Administration requested. In the new budget, which is currently being considered, I note that there was a request for a thirteen per cent increase. That is exactly what has been given in the new budget up to this point, so it would appear that the budgeting process, as far as professional licensure is concerned, has not been shortchanged by the General Assembly, but the Administration has been receiving exactly what it has been requesting.

I think, Mr. President, that this is a serious matter affecting many, many people in the Commonwealth. I would urge the Administration to reconsider this policy and hope that the Members of the Senate would join in encouraging that change.
