The Senate met at 1:00 p.m., Eastern Daylight Saving Time.

THE PRESIDENT (Lieutenant Governor William W. Scranton III) in the Chair.

#### SENATE RESOLUTION

#### DIRECTING JOINT STATE GOVERNMENT COMMISSION INVESTIGATE INCREASE IN LOCAL SCHOOL REAL ESTATE TAXES

Senator BELL offered the following resolution (Serial No. 48), which was read and referred to the Committee on Rules and Executive Nominations:

In the Senate, June 23, 1981.

WHEREAS, The funding of public schools is a serious problem in the State of Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, There has been an increase in local school real estate taxes in almost every part of the State; and

WHEREAS, There is a decrease in student enrollment in the public schools: and

WHEREAS, Teachers are continuously being laid off in great numbers; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Senate of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania direct the Joint State Government Commission to investigate the subject of why with fewer students, teacher layoffs and many closed schools, there is an increase in local real estate taxes and related financial problems; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission may hold hearings, take testimony and make its investigation at such places as it deems necessary within the Commonwealth; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission publish a report of its findings, including recommendations, within ninety days; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission shall report to the Senate as soon as possible its findings and recommendations.

Senator ANDREZESKI. Mr. President, when the Public Utility Commission testified before the Senate Committee on Appropriations several months ago, Chairman Susan Shanaman talked with pride about the PUC's obligation to be accessible and responsive to the needs of the public. We were told the regional offices across the Commonwealth are the first interface that the PUC has with the general public.

Mr. President, these amendments would hold Chairman Shanaman to her words and provide for the extremely important operations of the Erie regional office of the Consumer Service Division. It is, indeed, a cruel contradiction to deny the utility customers in northwestern Pennsylvania any recourse against rate increases and service complaints, except a phone call to Pittsburgh, especially during the harsh winter when many families must literally choose in my district between heat and eat. Where, then, is that important first interface between the PUC and the general public? We will not find it in the Senate bill before us today, just as we will not find it in Erie and northwestern Pennsylvania. At a time when these people need it the most, to close this regional office would now make the PUC more cost effective, it will save a few thousand dollars out of a multimillion dollar budget. But at what expense, Mr. President? Only at the expense of those families who must make ends meet on much, much less.

Mr. President, what I am asking for in these amendments is that \$46,000 be identified in the present budget not as an increase but just identified as money for the regional office of the Public Utility Commission. I hope my colleagues will view this as a nonpartisan issue. We are dealing with people's abilities to meet their utility bills, with people being faced with shutoffs every spring and with the availability of the Public Utility Commission to be responsive not only to the utility companies in perpetually granting their rate increases, but also to the ratepayers, the people that must pay these bills.

Senator JUBELIRER. Mr. President, by virtue of the fact that we are making some corrections to the amendments, may we go over Senate Bill No. 681 temporarily and keep moving so as to keep the Members of the Senate voting on bills? The PRESIDENT. Will the gentleman from Erie withdraw his amendments at least temporarily?

#### AMENDMENTS WITHDRAWN

Senator O'CONNELL. Mr. President, what these amendments do, in fact, are delete \$2 million from the State mental centers and provides that \$2 million to the community programs. These are very important amendments. The department and the agencies are phasing out the State mental institutions. They are providing that these people should go back into community living arrangements. On the other hand, they are not now taking admissions. They are very restrictive about it. They have caused a very severe problem in the communities by not properly providing facilities for these people in need of them. I would ask support of that.

In addition to that, Mr. President, another portion of these amendments provide the \$350,000 for maternal health which would then again attract about \$3.5 million of Federal monies.

Mr. President, I would ask support for the amendments.

Senator LEWIS. Mr. President, I desire to interrogate the gentleman from Luzerne, Senator O'Connell.

The PRESIDENT. Will the gentleman from Luzerne, Senator O'Connell, permit himself to be interrogated? Senator O'CONNELL. I will, Mr. President.

Senator O'CONNELL. Mr. President, I am not sure I understand that. The \$2 million is a transfer from one agency or one area to another. It is not an increase of \$2 million. The net effect of the total amendments is a \$350,000 increase.

Will the Senate agree to the amendments?

Senator STREET. Mr. President, these amendments simply add \$500,000 for the community legal services which would change its allocation to \$1,750,000.

Senator LEWIS. Mr. President, I desire to interrogate the gentleman from Philadelphia, Senator Street.

The PRESIDENT. Will the gentleman from Philadelphia, Senator Street, permit himself to be interrogated?

Senator STREET. I will, Mr. President.

Senator LEWIS. Mr. President, do the gentleman's proposed amendments restore the funding for community legal services to the amount initially recommended by the Governor?

Senator STREET. Mr. President, will the gentleman repeat the question.

Senator LEWIS. Mr. President, in fact I may now be able to add more factual information to it. It is my understanding that the Governor's initial recommendation for funding of community legal services was \$2,223,000. If I understand the gentleman's amendments, he is only proposing that agency be funded to the extent of \$1,750,000. Is that correct?

Senator STREET. Mr. President, that is correct.

Senator LEWIS. Mr. President, if I understand the gentleman's amendments, the funding level as requested by the Governor for community legal services, as compared to that proposed by the gentleman from Philadelphia, Senator Street, will be about \$473,000 in difference. Is that correct?

Senator STREET. Mr. President, that is correct.

Senator LEWIS. Mr. President, would the gentleman be kind enough to explain to us why he has proposed a funding level that will be \$473,000 less than that recommended by the Governor?

Senator STREET. Mr. President, I am just being politically realistic.

Senator LEWIS. Mr. President, would the gentleman elaborate on that political realism and why he believes the full funding cannot be achieved?

Senator STREET. Mr. President, I do not wish to elaborate.

Senator LEWIS. Mr. President, certainly the addition of the \$500,000 as proposed in the amendments by the gentleman from Philadelphia, Senator Street, is a significant improvement over the funding level that now exists for community legal services. For those who are concerned about those services, I would certainly recommend they cast an affirmative vote. However, we should all be aware of the fact that the failure to provide the funding level as requested by the Governor means we not only will be underfunding the needs of this vital community agency by something slightly less then a half million dollars but we will lose Federal matching funds that will be in excess of \$1.25 million. The net impact of this underfunding will have a much more significant and dramatic effect than just the dollars within this appropriation would indicate. Notwithstanding that, and I would hope the political realities as they may in fact exist, or as the gentleman may see them, will be such that we can fully fund the needs of this agency in the very near future.

And the question recurring, Will the Senate agree to the amendments?

Will the Senate agree to the amendments?

Senator SINGEL. Mr. President, just a few minutes ago we debated amendments that would increase funding for community living arrangements for the mentally retarded. Mr. President, there is also an additional population of individuals who are not mentally retarded and yet are housed in community living arrangement programs that have been funded by the Developmentally Disabled Planning Council for the past two years. There are currently seventy-six of these individuals throughout the State, six of whom are located in apartment dwellings in my own Senatorial District.

Mr. President, I think it is only fair and humane for us to attempt to continue the funding for these individuals. Without these amendments and without the commitment on the part of the Department of Public Welfare to continue funding for this program, these seventy-six individuals will be turned out of their community living arrangement programs back to a corner of their childhood homes or into mental institutions, which is both unfair and twice as expensive as the current arrangement.

Mr. President, this bill would simply add \$1,000,000 for the continuation of the CLA program that is currently operated by the Developmentally Disabled Planning Council. The reason for this is, currently the funding is provided by Federal sources. This funding is drying up and there are currently negotiations underway to determine who, in fact, will pay for the CLA program.

Mr. President, these amendments will remove that doubt by giving \$1,000,000 to the Department of Public Welfare and making it clear that it is our responsibility to be humane and compassionate to the individuals who are participating in this program. I implore my colleagues to give me an "aye" vote on these amendments.

Senator STAUFFER. Mr. President, I have just learned it is our understanding this program will be funded through a different mechanism, that funding through a special Federal program is being made available to continue this program

and, therefore, these amendments, as proposed by the gentleman from Cambria, Senator Singel, is unnecessary, as these people will be taken care of under this other arrangement. Therefore, Mr. President, I would ask for a "no" vote on these amendments because they are not necessary.

Senator SINGEL. Mr. President, would that were true, I think what the gentleman is talking about is the fact that the planning council will be discussing at its upcoming meeting the possibility of temporarily carrying the program for a period of three months. They have at their disposal between \$200,000 and \$300,000 at best, at which time the funding will absolutely run out and the money from the Federal sources will no longer be there because it is no longer a demonstration program which is the criterion by which money for this type of program is available.

What we are talking about is interim funding and what I am talking about is ongoing funding for the next fiscal year. I do not believe there is sufficient funds available but if I could receive some assurances to that effect, I would be more than happy to hear about them.

Senator STAUFFER. Mr. President, I gave the gentleman the information I had regarding the continuation and his statement may be correct, I am not sure. I cannot investigate that at this point. I would, however, in addition, point out to the Members the problem they are faced with with amendments of this type, they are one of a number we are going to see. A number of those we have dealt with previously. Fine programs, they cost money we do not have. The gentleman's amendments as I look at them, do not propose a reduction of a million dollars anywhere else in the budget to take care of funding the program. We just do not have the million dollars. Unless we can fund it through the Federal program, as I have been advised can be done, we do not have the money to do it and we would have to ask for a "no" vote on the amendments.

Senator SINGEL. Mr. President, I appreciate the gentleman's comment and if, in fact, the funding would be available from the Federal government, I would not have offered the amendments. It is my contention, however, that that funding is questionable at best, given the uncertain nature of the Federal funds, first of all. Secondly, given the Federal regulations that govern money that is allocated to planning councils, this is a debate that is currently going on between departments in this Administration and one that will be addressed in the next couple months.

More important than that, Mr. President, we have initiated a program that has been running for a number of years that has given for the first time these seventy-six individuals some semblance of hope, some reason to believe they can be productive in society. It is now our obligation to make sure those hopes are not dashed. I still insist, Mr. President, these are necessary amendments to assure the possibility of these individuals functioning properly in society.

Senator BELL. Mr. President, I did not break in on the previous speaker, but since we spent long, long hours in here yesterday and I do not intend to put twelve-hour days in every day this week, I will insist we follow the Senate Rules and the speaker be restricted to two speeches.

The PRESIDENT. At the request of Senator Bell, no Senator shall be able to speak more than twice on a question without, of course, the leave of the Senate.

Senator LEWIS. Mr. President, very simply these are amendments that would merely add the language for accountability of expenses for the appellate judiciary. I spoke at some length about this in the earlier debate on the budget. As I explained, there is currently no requirement for accountability for the expenses for our appellate judiciary. These amendments would require them to submit receipts and vouchers as all of the Members of the Legislature must do in order to substantiate their expenses while on appropriate business.

Senator STAUFFER. Mr. President, I would rise in opposition to the gentleman's amendments, pointing out they are the subject of separate legislation and I would be very supportive of the gentleman introducing this as a bill. We do not believe legislation of this type should be written into the General Appropriations bill. On that basis, Mr. President, I would ask for a negative vote.

Will the Senate agree to the amendments?

. Will the Senate agree to the amendments?

Senator LEWIS. Mr. President, these amendments propose to return for community colleges the full level of funding as requested by the Governor. As my colleagues may recollect, the Committee of Conference report on House Bill No. 686 cut by \$2 million the amount recommended by the Governor for funding of community colleges.

Mr. President, I might point out we have statutory obligations for providing our appropriate share of funding for these colleges. Last year we did not meet those obligations and, as a result, not only do we find increasing numbers of students this year in the community colleges, but also a rollover of reimbursements that are to be made to them. This \$2 million increase as I said will merely return us to the level of funding recommended by the Governor and which I believe is absolutely essential as a minimum to forestall significant tuition increases at our community colleges.

Mr. President, I would ask for an affirmative vote on these amendments.

Senator HOWARD. Mr. President, I would like to tell the Members of the Senate that a bill to replace the \$3 million cut from the community college program has already been reintroduced. Discussions have been held with the House Leadership and with the Governor's Office and it is generally agreed that bill, which will raise the appropriation from \$58 million to \$61 million, will be acted upon as a first order of business in September. Many of the people in the community college system who were meeting in Hershey last Friday and Saturday were advised of that plan. I think this appropriation measure, while commendable, is unnecessary at this time and I would suggest it be defeated.

## The PRESIDENT pro tempore (Henry G. Hager) in the Chair.

Senator STAUFFER. Mr. President, in addition to the remarks of the gentleman from Bucks, Senator Howard, I would like to point out this is a mandate and the only way we can tell the true need is when we get the actual student count. We do not have those figures yet. When those figures come in later in the year, then we will be able to make any adjustment if indeed one is necessary. But it is based on the actual count of the students.

For that reason, Mr. President, I would ask for a "no" vote on the amendments.

Will the Senate agree to the amendments?

Will the Senate agree to the amendments?

Senator LEWIS. Mr. President, these amendments propose to restore the funding for PHÉAA to the level recommended by the Governor. We may recall the Committee of Conference report adopted at a funding level that was \$2 million below that recommended by the Governor for making this student aid money available. I might point out, unlike the community college situation, this is not an item that can wait until September. These loan applications are being processed and this money will have to be determined for availability prior to the beginning of school in September.

Mr. President, I would certainly hope that all of us are cognizant of the fact expenses are increasing and college should not be something available simply for those who can afford it. It is not an elitist situation but rather we need to recognize the thousands of students who rely upon this money and who may well not be able to afford to go to college or to return to college this fall if their student grants are not available.

Mr. President, I would ask for an affirmative vote on these amendments.

Senator STAUFFER. Mr. President, these are the same amendments the gentleman offered a few weeks ago. We have been through this issue before.

We funded PHEAA at the same level as last year because that is the kind of funding that was available. We do not have the money to increase it and for that reason, I would ask for a negative vote.

Senator LEWIS. Mr. President, the initial debate to which the gentleman from Chester, Senator Stauffer, refers occurred about three weeks ago. Since that time I might point out more than \$20 million has been added to the appropriations which have been approved by this General Assembly notwithstanding the negative votes by every Member from that side of the aisle on that event three weeks ago.

Mr. President, I do not need to delineate the many items which have now found their way into the budget which were rejected in the original amendments offered. Certainly to merely attempt to suggest there is no more money available now as there was not three weeks ago, belies the reality of the more than \$20 million in increases that have already been added. Certainly there is \$2 million more there someplace. If there is not, then the Governor can make the judgments and the changes as he sees fit. We all know he cannot add money to any of the appropriations. By not at least funding the PHEAA grants at the level requested, we do not give him any of those options.

Mr. President, again I would repeat my request for an affirmative vote. In the event this plea and this argument does not have any more success in convincing my colleagues on the other side of the aisle that they should join with us in an affirmative vote on the prior arguments, we would not object to taking the same roll call if there is no one else who would object to that either.

And the question recurring, Will the Senate agree to the amendments?

able revenues, my staff has just minutes ago, because of the concern expressed by the gentleman, reviewed the June update of Commonwealth finances which brings us through May 31st of this year and which has just become available. The gentleman may be delighted and interested to know that report shows there is \$37 million more available for next year than the Governor had anticipated in his budget because of increased revenues which have been flowing at a rate that was much greater than that anticipated.

Although we have spent some \$20 million more than the Governor anticipated, we still have a comfortable \$17 million with which to work. Three million dollars of that will hopefully go for community colleges and certainly the proper funding of the Department of Corrections should receive high priority for the dollars that are available.

On the question,

Will the Senate agree to the amendments?

Senator LEWIS. Mr. President, these amendments propose to restore to the level requested by the Governor the funding for our mental retardation programs in this Commonwealth. Again I discussed this at some length on the floor three weeks ago. Very briefly let me explain, without these dollars it will not be possible to appropriately expand the community living arrangements which are absolutely necessary if we are going to be able to reduce overcrowding in our institutions and thereby avoid a loss of certification from the Federal government, which will most certainly occur if we cannot remove the overcrowding situation that now exists. In the short run what this means, very simply, is by the prudent expenditure of approximately \$4 million today, we are likely to save ourselves something in the neighborhood of about \$25 million in Federal funding by 1982.

Mr. President, I would ask for an affirmative vote.

Senator HOWARD. Mr. President, in my judgment, the funds that were cut from the mental retardation program are not enough. That department of government is bureaucratic to a degree that is almost impossible to describe. The funds have been asked for for a program which is an ICMFR program which is a Federally-aided program. It does not even

have Federal approval as yet. They have conducted a series of circuses around the State where the MR Department has asked providers to come in and feed at that trough. I do not think they could spend the money wisely if we gave it to them. I think this is one area we can cut with satisfaction because we are not depriving needed services to anybody but we are trying to put government on notice that they better start using responsible judgment when they start spending taxpayers' money.

Mr. President, I think these amendments, particularly, should be defeated.

Senator LEWIS. Mr. President, I have no quarrel with the comments made by the gentleman. In fact, the budget as approved by this Senate reduced the ICFMR funding by some \$3 million and I have not offered an amendment to attempt to restore it. The gentleman ought to be aware of the fact that is a totally separate line item and has nothing to do with these particular amendments or this funding category which deals exclusively with the community living arrangements and not with the funding he has expressed a concern about. That is an entirely separately funded item and a totally different line item in the budget.

Senator HOWARD. Not to belabor the issue, Mr. President, but the CLA program suffers from a lot of the same problems. They cannot get zoning variances. They cannot find trained personnel. The law requires that CLA be administered only by trained personnel. They cannot find enough people that will last. The average stay of a house mother or father in the CLA program is less than two years. It is a program that has never realized the promise that was made to us by the professionals in it. I think we better have another look at the people we are trying to push into a program, over the objections I might add of their parents in many instances. I do not think this cut is going to damage the constructive use of that program at all.

Senator STAUFFER. Mr. President, I would just point out these are amendments that we have previously dealt with and would ask for a negative vote.

And the question recurring, Will the Senate agree to the amendments?

Senator LEWIS. Mr. President, these amendments deal with the Council on Drug and Alcohol Abuse. I am sure my colleagues will recall there was a substantial decrease in the funding proposed for that Council this year by the Governor's Office basically because it was merged with the Department of Health. Last year that Council received about \$2.2 million. The Governor proposed a reduction to about \$1.6 million. This Senate approved that number notwithstanding an amendment offered by me to increase it to the previous level of funding.

Again, Mr. President, doing what I do not think it should have done or it had to do, the Committee of Conference in my opinion arbitrarily slashed \$664,000 from the administration funds for that Council and shifted them down to some other line item that has absolutely nothing to do with the administration of the Council on Drug and Alcohol Abuse. The very simple bottom line, Mr. President, is that this Council is effectively out of business if we do not change this arbitrary and petty rearrangement of dollars which have no relationship in my opinion to the funding needs of that Council or the programs that have been so dependent upon them. All these amendments do, and they do not call for the expenditure of ten cents worth of additional money, is reinstitute and reestablish that \$664,000 back with the Council on Drug and Alcohol Abuse where it should be and where it was when the Senate approved House Bill No. 712.

Mr. President, I would ask for an affirmative vote on these amendments.

Senator STAUFFER. Mr. President, the money is not available to fund these amendments. I would ask for a negative vote.

Senator LEWIS. Mr. President, although I understand it is at the risk of using up my second opportunity for speaking, I thought I had made it very clear, for the information of the gentleman from Chester, Senator Stauffer, that these amendments do not require the expenditure of any additional money but simply calls for the transfer back to the Council.
