Dear Governor Rendell, Senator Jubelirer and Representative Perzel:

In accordance with the requirements of Section 6 of Act 181 of 1988, 73 P.S. §391.41 *et seq.*, and Section 610 of the Administrative Code of 1929, I am submitting the enclosed Budget Request of the Office of Small Business Advocate ("OSBA") for Fiscal Year 2007-2008. Copies are also being delivered today to the Secretary of the Budget and the Administration, the Secretary of Community and Economic Development, and the Insurance Commissioner.

As explained in detail in the enclosed Budget Request, the total expenses that the OSBA estimates it will incur in Fiscal Year 2007-2008 for both its utility and insurance regulatory activities are \$1,159,000. None of the money used to support the OSBA comes from the general funds of the Commonwealth. The OSBA's utility regulatory activities are funded by assessments on public utilities, while the money to support OSBA's activities concerning workers' compensation insurance rates come from assessments on the insurance companies that issue such policies in Pennsylvania.
