Senator C. WILLIAMS. Madam President, I desire to interrogate the gentleman from Montgomery, Senator Wonderling.

The PRESIDENT. Will the gentleman from Montgomery, Senator Wonderling, permit himself to be interrogated?

Senator WONDERLING. I will, Madam President.

The PRESIDENT. He indicates he will.

Senator C. WILLIAMS. Madam President, as a cosponsor of Senate Bill No. 1000, I am strongly in support of prohibiting regulation of VoIP, Voice-over-Internet Protocol. In the gentleman's memo requesting cosponsorship, the gentleman indicated the bill would only prohibit the regulation of VoIP services. Consumer protection advocates have expressed concerns that the bill's prohibition of regulation of Internet protocol-enabled service, as well as VoIP, may open the door to deregulation of currently protected services provided by the PUC for other types of phone service. I will feel more comfortable supporting this legislation if the gentleman can verify that the intention of this legislation is to prohibit regulation of VoIP services only.

Senator WONDERLING. Madam President, in response to Senator Williams' questions of interrogation, indeed, Senate Bill No. 1000 in the definition of VoIP, or Internet telephone service, has purposely been very, very narrowly defined to only address specifically this type of information service. I think it is important for the Members and for the record to clarify what we are attempting to do today with Senate Bill No. 1000, and that is not, as some would suggest, to deregulate traditional telephone service in Pennsylvania. In fact, quite the contrary.

The intent of Senate Bill No. 1000 is to ensure that these information services, as defined by the Federal Communications Commission, are not subject to State regulation. If you allow me, Madam President, to walk through a process for a consumer to obtain this type of service. First of all, the consumer has to make the choice to leave their traditional telephone service as defined by Title 66 in Pennsylvania. Then they must have some type of dial-up, broadband, or DSL capability from which to engage this service, then choose from an array of providers that are currently offering such services in Pennsylvania. It is at that point in time, after those three choices are made, and it is technically feasible with dial-up, that the consumer then engages in that type of service as proposed in an unregulated fashion. In fact, if the consumer is not satisfied with that service, they can always return to the basic traditional telephone service as defined in Title 66 in this Commonwealth.

So to answer the Senator's questions, we believe that the definition of Internet telephone service is so narrowly defined that there should not be cause for concern as it relates to the current regulated state of traditional phone service in this Commonwealth.

Senator C. WILLIAMS. Thank you, Madam President.

The PRESIDENT. Thank you, Senator Williams and Senator Wonderling, for the additional clarification of Senate Bill No. 1000.
