This has been the tradition here in the Senate; both the Senate and the House have similar rules. This was not done in this process, so I just want to point out for future reference, it is not necessary to go through the committee for land transfers. So, future land transfers would not be required to go through the Committee on State Government. They can go directly to the floor, and the floor leader would have the prerogative of how to deal with them. So I want to state that for the record, and I would like to cast my vote in the negative on this particular amendment.

The PRESIDENT. The gentleman will be so cast in the negative.

Senator FARNESE. Mr. President, very briefly, I want to say a special thank you, of course, to Senator Vance and also some other Members in my Caucus, Senator Kitchen and Senator Hughes, on Senate Resolution No. 229, which involves mammogram screening. The issue of cancer prevention is one that is very personal to me and my family. On two occasions, my father has been through cancer treatment and cancer procedures, and I wholeheartedly believe that the reason he is still with us today is because of cancer preventive measures. That is why I am so happy to introduce Senate Resolution No. 229, which deals with the issue of breast cancer, specifically preventive mammogram screenings for women beginning at the age of 40 .

As we all know, our elected officials in Washington, D.C., recently passed sweeping reforms in healthcare management. While much change was needed, one thing we cannot afford is to have services taken away from individuals, which is what concerns me the most about the recent study by the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force. In the report, it says that women in their 40 s do not need mammograms and that self-examinations hold no value. Here are some of the facts that the report did not disclose: Breast cancer is the leading cause of death in women in Pennsylvania between the ages of 25 and 54. Breast cancer, Mr. President, when found early, has a 98 -percent survival rate. The chances of a woman developing invasive breast cancer at some time in her life is one in eight, or 12 percent. In 2009, the American Cancer Society estimated that approximately 40,000 women would die from breast cancer.

These numbers are alarming, but also an indication that we should not jeopardize funding for a critical test needed for early detection of this deadly disease. That is why I introduced this resolution, and that is why I am urging the task force to re-examine its recommendations about mammograms for women, beginning at the age of 40 . I strongly urge the task force to take into account the importance of prevention and the fact that the life-saving benefits of mammograms far outweigh the negatives and therefore should not be limited by age.

Again, I want to thank my colleagues on both sides of the aisle, and I urge them to support this very, very important and critical resolution.

Thank you, Mr. President.
