**GUESTS OF SENATOR GENE YAW
PRESENTED TO THE SENATE**

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Lycoming, Senator Yaw.

Senator YAW. Mr. President, I have some very special guests here today on the floor. All of these guests are in some way associated with Little League Baseball, which, as you know, was originally formed in Williamsport, Pennsylvania. Little League Baseball is the largest organized youth sports program in the world, serving about 2.5 million players. My guests today are Mr. Stephen Keener, president and CEO of Little League Baseball; Mr. Fred Gilmour, who is the official photographer for Little League Baseball, and perhaps most importantly is Dr. Davie Jane Gilmour, who is a person who grew up just across the river in Enola, Pennsylvania. Dr. Gilmour has been the president of Pennsylvania College of Technology since 1998, but most recently was elected as the first female chairman of the board of directors of Little League Baseball International in the 74-year history of that organization. I would also like to add that today is her first official act as chairperson of the board of directors of the Little League Baseball International. I am proud to have these guests here today, and I ask that the Members of the Senate give them a warm welcome.

The PRESIDENT. Would the guests of Senator Yaw please rise so that the Senate may give you its usual warm welcome.

(Applause.)

Dr. GILMOUR. Thank you. Character, courage, and loyalty, not just the words found on the Little League International logo, but the guiding principles of the world's largest organized youth sports program. For all of you today, there should be great pride in knowing that the eyes of the world are on Pennsylvania each August. Hundreds of thousands of fans attend a free sporting event and watch literally as the Little League World Series lets dreams come true.

In my time as a member of the International Board of Directors, and now as its chairman, I can tell you that the countless times that I have met successful athletes, former U.S. Presidents, professionals, and even astronauts, with one common bond - they all played Little League baseball. Many of them can tell you the exact day and location of the game, their game, the one that got away and kept them from Williamsport in the world series. The rest of them can tell you what it was like to play on the world series field in Williamsport, Pennsylvania, during their August.

Next year, as you heard, Little League will celebrate its 75th anniversary, and later this week, on Thursday, is a celebration of the first day a Little League game was ever played in 1939. Today, Little League is played in 82 countries around the world, with over 1 million volunteers. They bring together the world's youth for sportsmanship, fair play, and teamwork. There is more than just the August world series. You may know of the girls' softball program or the challenger division. In our own home of Pennsylvania, there are 410 leagues with over 10,000 teams and 150,000 youths who participate in the Little League Baseball program.

I am honored to volunteer my time for the next 5 years as the first woman chairman of the Little League International board of directors. And, I am also honored in my professional career to work daily as the president of Penn College, a national leader in applied technology education and making a difference in the Commonwealth. With over 95 percent placement of our graduates, we currently enroll over 57,000 students in both 2-year and 4-year degrees. We have contributed significantly to the economic development of the Commonwealth, just last year, training over 10,000 individuals for work in the Marcellus Shale play.

Penn College is truly degrees that work. So whether it is with Little League youth or college students earning a degree that works, I spend most of my time being inspired by young people, and they are, in fact, our future.

So I would like to leave you today with the Little League pledge. It is said mostly on Little League baseball fields, but I would suggest to you that it would apply to all of us in our work every day. It goes like this, "I trust in God. I love my country and respect its laws. I will play fair and strive to win. But win or lose, I will always do my best."

I want to thank Lieutenant Governor Cawley, the Leaders and the Members of the Senate, and most especially Senator Yaw, and particularly Stephen Keener for being with me today. Thank you very much.

Senator GORDNER. Mr. President, on behalf of Senator Dinniman and myself, the Ben Franklin Technology Partners has been around for 30 years. Recently, the Pennsylvania Economy League issued a report which indicated that over a 12-year period, the impact of this program on the economy of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has been in excess of \$23.5 billion. The program has generated 51,000 jobs in client firms and 89,000 additional jobs as a result of increased purchasing and investment by client firms. In a recent 5-year period, the Commonwealth received \$358 million in additional State tax receipts as a direct result of these investments in client firms, and another \$144 million in State tax receipts as a result of related client services.

The new State revenue generated due to the Ben Franklin program represents a 3.6 to 1 payback ratio to the Commonwealth on its \$137.7 million investment in the Ben Franklin Technology Partners. This has truly been a national-leading program. Literally, more than a dozen States over the years have patterned a program based on our Ben Franklin program that was started some 30 years ago. So on behalf of Senator Dinniman and myself, I offer this resolution recognizing the Ben Franklin program for its 30 years and ask for its immediate consideration.

Senator DINNIMAN. Mr. President, I want to thank Senator Gordner for his leadership on this matter of knowledge-based economy and Ben Franklin. Senator Gordner has almost been there since the beginning, not quite 30 years, but he certainly represented the Senate on that body, and I look to him often as the senior representative. I represent our Caucus on that body. The two of us certainly agree that the Ben Franklin program has created tremendous economic changes for Pennsylvania. It has allowed us to compete competitively in this knowledge-based economy. I come from an area which is world-class when we are

talking about the biopharma industry, as you know well, Mr. President, as you are from that area. The Ben Franklin program has played a significant role in helping southeast Pennsylvania, as well as the entire State, become world-class in this area of technology.

I also want to take this opportunity to thank Senator Gordner because of his leadership and thank him for his kindness when I came on the board in helping me understand the issues, and it is a pleasure that we work together in a bipartisan effort to support the Ben Franklin program and to support the economic advancement of the Commonwealth.

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Lancaster, Senator Smucker.

Senator SMUCKER. Mr. President, student safety, because of some horrific and tragic shooting incidents in schools, has become a primary concentration for legislators, school officials, law enforcement officials, parents, and concerned communities. Much recent effort has been devoted to protecting against threats

from the outside. Yet, we know that more students are at risk from within the schools, whether through bullying by other students or unprofessional conduct on the part of the adults in charge.

This bill is a product of a lot of thoughtful work on the part of educators, administrators, legal experts, and others. They have constructed a modern, fair, and effective system for investigating complaints of educator misconduct and applying sanctions for wrongdoing. Experience is a tough teacher, and this work reflects too many hard lessons learned. This package is designed to erase the vestiges of a hush-hush culture that allowed abusers to operate in the shadows, hurting too many of our young. We hear too many instances where the troubling history of the offender was unknown to the current employer when reputation counted more than student welfare.

Some key provisions in this update to remedy this problem include: expanding the commission's jurisdiction to cover those holding private school certifications and those working for independent contractors and charter schools, removing the much too tight 1-year statute of limitations for filing complaints, spelling out clearly the requirements of mandatory reporting, broadening the range of available disciplinary measures, insuring that truthful references are no longer an invitation to a civil lawsuit, and setting out a hearing process less wrapped in secrecy that shelters wrongdoing. I would like to make it very clear that this is in no way an indictment of or an assault on the teaching profession. It is the system that is flawed and insufficient.

We acknowledge and commend the vast majority of our educators as capable, caring, and creative individuals of good character. By weeding out the bad actors, we enhance the reputation of the many. The value of doing this should be apparent, Mr. President, to underscore the stakes in getting this right, stop to think about the immeasurable human costs and the financial costs, the damage to lives and reputations inflicted because one individual, Jerry Sandusky, was not stopped when he should have been. Regrettably, we do not have the power to prevent every instance of misconduct, but we do have the ability to catch misconduct early, prevent its repetition, and thereby protect our students to the greatest extent possible.

Mr. President, today, the Senate is considering a resolution designating the week of June 3 through June 7, 2013, as "Juror Appreciation Week." Each year, more than 225,000 report for jury duty, and 60,000 actually serve as jurors on civil or criminal trials. Without jurors, our civil or criminal justice system cannot function and will not work. Jurors are the unsung heroes of the courts. They perform a civic duty, and an essential one in a democracy.

We each have a right to be judged by a jury of our peers. Jurors come from all walks of life, and each has a vote. It is essential democracy. As a lawyer, I know the importance of jurors and how they view their job when they sit in judgment. In a jury, all have an equal voice and an equal say, and that is the essence of our judicial system.

The jury is the finder of the truth and serves as the pivot on the scales of justice. One of our Founding Fathers and President, Thomas Jefferson, said this about juries: "I consider trial by jury as the only anchor ever yet imagined by man, by which a government can be held to the principles of its constitution."

The Bill of Rights established the system that we still use today and provided each of us with a fundamental right. That is why it is important that we honor those who serve on juries today.

PETITIONS AND REMONSTRANCES

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Philadelphia, Senator Farnese.

Senator FARNESE. Mr. President, as we know, the calendar is on June 3, and our constitutional requirement is that we have our budget done by June 30. I believe last week, and, of course, earlier today, the House Republicans moved their budget forward. Mr. President, earlier today, Senate Democrats announced their budget plan for Fiscal Year 2013-14. I think our budget plan that has been moved forward by the Senate Democratic Caucus is important for three specific reasons. Number one, it is a responsible plan that increases funding for basic education. Number two, job creation; and of course, number three, it provides much-needed assistance to our local communities without, and this is the important part, any broad-based tax increases. Now, this is a plan that Pennsylvanians have been asking for, Mr. President, year after year. It is a plan that hits on Pennsylvania's greatest priorities, and the greatest needs as a Commonwealth, without deflecting that burden back onto the taxpayer, or as we have seen so many times over the last several years with this administration, on the backs of Pennsylvania's most vulnerable folks who simply cannot bear it.

Specifically for education, our Caucus proposes a \$212 million increase above the Governor's proposal for Fiscal Year 2013-14, the first part of a 3-year reinvestment plan to get funding for our kids back on the right track. As we all know, we have seen the current administration undo the great strides in public education that have been made in the previous years and with regard to the previous administration. I think this is also another important point, Mr. President, that the Senate Democrats' plan increases funding for education without tying it to any other special interest or other legislative policy initiative. Our Caucus's plan would move back toward the funding levels we saw 3 years ago, an increased funding of some of the most valuable education appropriations, including an additional \$50 million for the Accountability Block Grant, \$39 million for distressed school districts, and \$20.5 million for special education.

Our plan also focuses heavily on job creation strategies and funding that will move Pennsylvania forward as an economic driver throughout the country. Pennsylvania, unfortunately, Mr. President, has fallen over the last 2 years from 8th in the country down to 49th in job creation. And when you think about that, from 8th to 49th in just a short amount of time, 49th is simply intolerable. Quite frankly, Mr. President, it is an embarrassment, and there is no reason for us to have hit the bottom of that list. We know that we have the talent here in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and we have driven workers here. The Senate Democrats have figured out a way to increase job funding by \$125 million, to increase opportunities for our talented, driven, committed, and dedicated workforce that is ready and willing to fill positions across the Commonwealth. As I said before, the budget plan brought out this morning by my good friends and colleagues gets the job done for Pennsylvania on many different levels, despite the difficult economy and without broad-based tax increases, by expanding Medicaid, modernizing our liquor control system, and delaying the phase-out of the capital stock and franchise tax, which has been done in previous budget years to help deal with revenue shortfalls, as well as streamlining spending within the Department of Public Welfare. We have been able to increase critical funding for many worthwhile initiatives, some of which I have described already, all without the need for increased taxes on the State or local level. I will say that again, not only on the State, but without any further burden on the local level.

Some other highlights that I have advocated for in this and previous budget cycles include an \$8 million increase in funding for the Attorney General's Office to help combat gun violence and illegal firearms within the city of Philadelphia, to catch more sexual predators, and get more gangs and drug dealers off of our streets. These critical dollars will go a long way in keeping our communities safer. And of course, Mr. President, we all know that one of the most important, if not the most important, jobs that we have as elected officials is to keep the people that we represent safe.

Our budget would also increase funding for the Council of the Arts and grants to the arts, because, especially in my district, Mr. President, in the city of Philadelphia, the arts are a massive economic driver. Arts and cultural organizations in the Philadelphia region have a \$3.3 billion impact supporting tens of thousands of jobs and bringing over \$150 million in tax revenues. A small public investment in the arts truly yields huge returns across many levels of our economy, and obviously not just in my hometown of Philadelphia, but across our good State.

I hope as we begin our final days, Mr. President, moving toward the end of the current budget cycle as we get closer and closer to that June 30 deadline, to my friends across the aisle, and across the building in the executive branch, consider the robust, sustainable, and fiscally-sound plan that Senate Democrats have put forth today, that will not only take us and allow us to move forward but will sustain Pennsylvania and its economy for years to come.

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Allegheny, Senator Costa.

Senator COSTA. Mr. President, I rise and thank my colleague, the gentleman from Philadelphia County, for bringing to the Members' attention the very important Senate budget that the

Senate Democrats put forth last week. Senator Farnese laid out, very articulately, many of the aspects of that budget which we think is an appropriate budget as we move forward. I appreciate his efforts along those lines. At the end of the day, it is a budget that is balanced, it is a budget that takes into consideration the needs and concerns of the residents of this Commonwealth in three specific areas. First and foremost, as it relates to education and the investments that we make to education. In the areas of early learning, in our K to 12, and also in our community colleges, it drives resources into the Accountability Block Grant, a program that provides significant flexibility to our school districts across this Commonwealth with a total of \$212 million investment in education, in addition to what the Governor had presented in his budget of \$90 million, representing the first year of a 3-year phase-in to allow our Commonwealth school districts to enjoy the benefit of resources from this Commonwealth that gets us back to a point in time before this administration took office.

Mr. President, we also recognize that we need to provide relief to our local school districts, nearly 80 percent of which have been forced, over the course of the past 2 years, to increase their school property taxes at the local level, but also those school districts that have seen their budget surplus or their surplus that they must maintain, their reserves diminished significantly. We think it is appropriate and important that we go back and make those investments.

The second area, job creation and job growth. Senate Democrats strongly believe we have to make investments along those lines. As Senator Farnese mentioned, there is a significant amount of tax credit programs that allow us to grow jobs. We can grow jobs in two other areas. The great work that Senator Rafferty has been doing on transportation, earlier today, we advanced a bill along those lines in a very bipartisan way, which makes a \$2.5 billion investment in transportation funding. As Secretary Schoch has stated, every billion dollars in investment we make in this Commonwealth translates into 25,000 jobs, \$2.5 billion gets you 62,500 jobs created in Pennsylvania, which we desperately need, and all across this Commonwealth. They are from engineers to laborers, bridge painters and sign painters to individuals who work on a regular basis milling the asphalt. Those are the types of jobs that will be created, as well as the spinoff jobs that are related in an ancillary way.

The second way, Mr. President, as you heard me talk a number of times, and my colleague, Senator Hughes, has talked about, is the need and the role that Medicaid expansion plays in this Commonwealth, how important it is for all of us to recognize that we must make those investments and make that decision to opt-in to the Medicaid expansion program. We have three independent studies that have indicated 35,000 to 39,000 jobs created. They talked about the revenue through the gross receipts tax, as well as our gross State product being increased. The Independent Fiscal Office has talked about both of those things. We think those are the things that need to be done.

What we also need to do, Mr. President, is modernize our Wine & Spirits shops across this Commonwealth, not privatize. We think that the measure that Senator Ferlo has put forth in Senate Bill No. 800 is a measure that represents what we think the people of the Commonwealth would like to see - greater access to alcohol, but yet at the same time, maintaining a level of control. We all agree that maybe the core function of the Com-

monwealth is not to be in the Wine & Spirits business, but we strongly believe there is a role for the Commonwealth to continue to play, and we think that is the rate and area that we need to go forward in.

Mr. President, finally, I think it is important for folks to know that our Senate Democratic Caucus plan does not raise broad-based taxes. What it also does, Mr. President, are a couple of things. Over the course of our 2-year balance sheet, for the first time in many, many years, it provides money for the Rainy Day Fund. Nearly \$64 million in year 1, and then \$24 million in year 2, for a cumulative effect of \$88 million being driven into the Rainy Day Fund, with a revenue surplus at the end of 2 years of \$75 million. So, we think our plan is a responsible, a reasonable plan that addresses the needs of many Pennsylvanians across this Commonwealth, and we are excited about what we have done. Now, we have to move forward over the next 3 1/2 to 4 weeks and adopt a General Fund Budget out of this Chamber and move it to the House so that it is reflective of the needs of Pennsylvania and that incorporates many of the ideas that we have talked about for a number of weeks here on the Senate floor and the issues that we will continue to talk over the course of the next couple of days, as well as the next couple of weeks.
