As directed in Act 100 of 2014, attached is the Final Plan of Disposition for DGS Annex (former Harrisburg State Hospital Campus) as prepared by RGS Associates, Inc.

The DGS Annex is comprised of 295 +/- acres and over 1 million square feet of building area on four separate lots. DGS's operating costs exceed \$5 million per year. Many of these buildings are nearing the end of their useful life and would require significant financial investment for continued use. The sale of the DGS Annex gives the Commonwealth the opportunity to reduce significant expenses while generating revenue and enabling development that will benefit the local economy. DGS projects that Department of Human Services (DHS) employees currently on the campus will be able to be successfully transitioned into another building of approximately 150,000 square feet. The Marketing Recommendation within the "Findings and Conclusions" section on Page 143 of the Final Plan recommends the competitive bid of all four lots (13, 14, 15 and 16) together for maximum value and efficiency.

The Department of General Services supports the marketing recommendation to dispose of the 4 parcels together put forth within the DGS Annex Final Plan of Disposition.

Senator HUTCHINSON. Mr. President, I rise today to ask my colleagues for an affirmative vote on this resolution which recognizes the week of March 19 as "Maple Producers Week" here in

Pennsylvania. Mr. President, the maple syrup industry has a rich and long tradition in Pennsylvania. Native American tribes in North America were the first to have produced maple syrup and maple sugar. When Europeans came to America, they learned from the Native Americans how to farm the syrup from the trees and then they began to harvest it themselves. Over the next 250 years, the harvesting grew into the industry that we have today.

Mr. President, today the northeast region of the United States is one of the top maple syrup producing regions in the entire world, and Pennsylvania has contributed significantly to this production. As a Commonwealth, we produced more than 140,000 gallons of maple syrup from over 650,000 taps in the year 2016. The sap that is tapped from these trees is then used in Pennsylvania to make numerous food products and, most importantly, to make maple syrup. Mr. President, adoption of this resolution raises awareness and knowledge of this crucial industry here in Pennsylvania which, in turn, helps to grow and strengthen the industry's presence here in our State. I ask my colleagues for their support.

Senator BAKER. Mr. President, it is my pleasure today to introduce this resolution and the one that will follow on behalf of the American Association of Cardiovascular and Pulmonary Rehabilitation, a multidisciplinary team of professionals who work tirelessly to improve the health of those who are suffering from decreased heart and lung function. "Cardiac Rehabilitation Week" and "Pulmonary Rehabilitation Week" are being observed to bring attention to both coronary heart disease and pulmonary disease, which are leading public health issues here in our Commonwealth and across the nation. Cardiac and pulmonary rehab specialists educate patients about risk factors, such as smoking, high blood pressure, high cholesterol, physical inactivity, diabetes, and obesity, all which increase the chances of future problems, and help to improve a patient's physical, psychological, and social functioning by using supervised exercise, risk factor and behavior modification, and counseling to promote a healthy lifestyle. Besides increasing heart and lung function to slow progression of the disease, studies show that cardiac and pulmonary

rehab reduce stress and anxiety and improve the quality and overall well-being and decrease mortality. So I rise to ask for an affirmative vote on this resolution and the one to follow.

Will the Senate adopt the resolution?

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Montgomery, Senator Rafferty.

Senator RAFFERTY. Mr. President, I, along with the gentleman from Blair County, my friend and colleague Senator Eichelberger, offer this resolution to recognize today, March 20, as a day of remembrance for all highway workers employed by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation, the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission, and, of course, contractors who sacrificed their lives in service to this Commonwealth. This day is particularly significant as a somber reminder of the two Pennsylvania Turnpike employees who were murdered at the Fort Littleton Interchange in an apparent robbery on the Pennsylvania Turnpike on this very day, one year ago. Due to this tragic event that occurred on this day, I thought it would be appropriate to recognize those highway workers who have lost their lives while also recognizing the service of the current highway workers and the level of danger they face daily while working on our roadways.

Since 1940, more than 30 Turnpike employees have lost their lives while performing their duties along the nation's first super-highway. Mr. President, I lost a very dear friend of mine a few

years ago in an incident where a driver who was not paying attention hit a Turnpike truck, which then hit my friend and killed him. Since 1970, 86 Pennsylvania Department of Transportation employees have died in the line of duty. The duties and responsibilities of highway workers in construction work zones, maintenance work zones, inspection work zones, and toll plazas are critical to providing our safe, reliable, and interconnected transportation system for this Commonwealth. Data suggest that over the past decade, Pennsylvania has averaged a total of almost 1,900 work zone crashes. In that same period, Pennsylvania has averaged more than 22 fatal work zone crashes and more than 24 work zone fatalities per year. Speeding and driving too fast for conditions are the leading causes of crashes in our work zones. Overall, driving too fast for conditions is the most common driver action related to these fatal accidents.

In an effort to improve both driver and worker safety in our work zones, Senator Argall, myself, and many of my colleagues have introduced Senate Bill No. 172. Senate Bill No. 172 is a 5-year pilot program to allow for automotive speed enforcement cameras on interstates and freeways throughout this Commonwealth focusing solely on highway safety. These cameras have proven time and time again in other States to reduce speeding, reduce work zone intrusions, and, most importantly, reduce fatalities and injuries. Data collected from the studies in other States who utilize these cameras in work zones have shown that the automated speed enforcement cameras have demonstrated a noticeable improvement in driver behavior, and a reduction in vehicle speed and crash-related injuries in work zones compared to States that had no camera enforcement in place.

Mr. President, Senate Bill No. 172 was one of the first bills to be moved out of the Senate Committee on Transportation. We had it last year on the floor and it got to the House a little bit too late. I am urging a speedy passage of Senate Bill No. 172 in the Senate of Pennsylvania in the spirit of which it was intended, get it through the Senate, to the House, and to the Governor in time to insure the safety and welfare of our workers. Finally, I urge all drivers in this Commonwealth to consider the lives of highway workers while they are traveling, and to remember all of those workers and their families who have sacrificed so much in their service to this Commonwealth.

Mr. President, I thank you and ask for an affirmative vote on today's resolution.

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Philadelphia, Senator Sabatina.

Senator SABATINA. Mr. President, very briefly, I echo the comments of my colleague and fellow chairman of the Senate Committee on Transportation. I take a moment to honor these men and women who went to work every day to improve our State roadways, only to pay the ultimate price. So often we see these billboards on the Turnpike with a child's face that reads, slow down, my mommy and daddy work here, but we never really appreciate who these individuals are. This resolution is meant to honor those who tragically lost their lives due to accidents on our Commonwealth roadways. We need to be more mindful of those who work in construction or on a road crew as we drive down the road. These are parents, sons, daughters, and even grandparents for people who love them very much. I stand with my colleagues today to honor those highway workers who are no longer with us.
