Since she was first diagnosed with a brain tumor in 2005, Beth has had to retrain herself to walk and talk. She has battled blindness, seizures, and surgery after surgery. Now, when she runs, every step raises global awareness and raises money for children suffering from cancer. Beth's inspiring tale of triumph has made the front pages of the *Washington Post* and was featured in a documentary on the Discovery Channel. She has testified before the FDA and has participated in White House and congressional briefings. The \$1 million that she has raised is devoted to funding research supported by ABC², which is an acronym for Accelerate Brain Cancer Cure.

Beginning in January, Beth ran across Antarctica, Chile, the United States, Spain, Morocco, the United Arab Emirates, and Australia, 183 miles in total. In each of the seven nations, she found a way to push through the pain and fatigue by remembering the real enemy, which is brain cancer. She wants to be an

example of hope, which she clearly is. Along the way, she adopted hundreds of children with pediatric cancer to teach them that cancer is powerful, but they possess the power within them to go the distance. During the World Marathon, Beth ran with photographs of those children clipped to her race belt. She also wore running shoes decorated by children with pediatric cancer. Beth never expects to be the first one to cross the finish line, she says my finish line will be when these kids and adults have been cured of cancer.

Mr. President, there are no words to describe what this unbelievable woman has done for families facing the most agonizing tragedies of all. This is one woman who has never, and will never, run from a challenge. Please join me in saluting this amazing champion and survivor, BethAnn Telford.

(The following prepared remarks were made part of the record at the request of the gentlewoman from Northampton, Senator BOSCOLA:)

Mr. President, today I rise to introduce this resolution recognizing May 2017 as "Better Hearing Month." I believe it is important that we encourage all Pennsylvanians to remain in tune and aware about their

hearing capabilities and any changes in hearing throughout adulthood. Hearing loss is the third most common health problem in the nation, with more than 36 million people across this country impacted by such challenges. While hearing problems are commonly associated with the normal process of aging, more than half of all those with hearing loss are 65 years old and younger. So this issue can be unpredictable and more sudden than we assume.

Those suffering from hearing loss may experience other issues such as depression, anxiety, and even early onset dementia. It often affects participation in social activities as well as work. Therefore, Mr. President, I encourage anyone who may be experiencing early signs or trouble with hearing to seek out the qualified healthcare professionals, such as audiologists, who can best screen individuals for hearing loss. Audiologists can help plan the best course of treatment, which may include hearing aids or listening devices, as well as rehabilitation.

I thank my Senate colleagues for joining me today in educating the public about the importance of removing hearing challenge stigmas and focusing on good health practices as we designate May 2017 as Better Hearing Month in the Commonwealth.

The first resolution designates the week of May 21 through May 27 as "Emergency Medical Services Week" in Pennsylvania as we honor the network of emergency medical responders, from ambulance attendants and paramedics to firefighters, police officers, emergency room doctors, and nurses who render aid around the clock in the wake of sudden and life-threatening illness or injury.

In 1973, Gerald Ford authorized EMS Week to celebrate EMS practitioners and the important work they do in our nation's communities. Back then, EMS was a new profession and EMS practitioners had only started to be recognized as a critical component of emergency medicine and the public health safety net. Today, skilled professionals are on the front line of emergency care. First responders provide lifesaving care, often at great risk to themselves, responding to the scenes of brutal crimes, raging fires, and devastating traffic accidents. For sick and injured patients, access to high-quality emergency care significantly improves the recovery process and chances of survival. Volunteers and career members of our EMS network engage in thousands of

hours of specialized training and continuing education to enhance their lifesaving abilities. All first responders are intrinsically tied together, and when they do work together, their combined efforts make our communities stronger, and they are always there for us, 24/7, 365 days a year. As such, it is fitting that this year's theme is "EMS Strong, Always in Service."

Mr. President, I urge a positive vote on this resolution and encourage all Pennsylvanians to take time next week to honor and thank our EMS providers.

Finally, wrestler Geno Morelli earned the Big Ten's annual Wayne Duke Postgraduate Award for his intention to continue with postgraduate education while maintaining a 3.95 grade point average and achieving academic, athletic, extracurricular, and leadership successes. I ask my colleagues to join me in congratulating these young men on their outstanding efforts, both on the mat and in the classroom.

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PETITIONS AND REMONSTRANCES

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentlewoman from Northampton, Senator Boscola.

Senator BOSCOLA. Mr. President, the time has come to stop turning registered voters away from our primary elections. If we are serious about being more inclusive, bolstering voter participation, and making our elections more representative, then we need to find ways to strengthen our participation in this Democratic process. This is especially true for certain board races, especially in the school boards where individuals are permitted to cross-file. Too often, Mr. President, these races are decided after the primaries occurred, and those who are registered Independent have no say in the process. I think all of us in this Cham-

ber understand the important and impactful issues that these school board members face. Last week, only about one in six registered Pennsylvanians bothered to vote in the primary election. If you think that number is dreadful, keep in mind that only 65 percent of eligible adults are even registered to begin with. As a result, a minuscule number of citizens are choosing members of Pennsylvania's highest courts, and a severely small group is dictating who will be running our municipalities and our schools.

Last week a judge of elections in a local school board race in my district that was hotly contested--a hotly-contested school board race--turned away voters registered Independent who came to the polling place to cast a ballot for the school board race. The fact remains that whether the race is contested or not, that should make no difference. In my view, unaffiliated and Independent voters should have a voice and be able to vote for candidates who have the power to raise their yearly school taxes. They should be able to select individuals who will help determine a school's curriculum or the next superintendent. Are we saying that a parent only enjoys this right if they are registered Democrat or Republican? I say that is very unfair. Party registration should not dictate one's access to the ballot box. A school board race, where the decision is often concluded in the primary, is an excellent example of why we need more inclusive primaries. Let us let the third-largest pool of registered voters, Independents, who are increasingly registering Independent, have access, and that will improve our poor turn-out rates.

Mr. President, our democracy does not work if our citizens do not participate, and they are saying loud and clear, I do not like either party. I do not want to be a registered Democrat and I do not want to be a registered Republican because they see what is happening in Washington, and they see what is happening here in Harrisburg, the discourse and the contention. So they want to be Independent because I do not believe in both parties, but they should have the right to vote in those primaries.

We should be doing all we can to encourage voting. This includes better voter registration laws, expanding the amount of time that people can vote, and better accommodating absentee ballots. It should also include allowing more registered voters to fully participate in both the primary and general elections. We draw the line at two parties now. Let us move away from that line. Let us bring Independents into our fold and non-party voters as well. In the Lehigh Valley alone, approximately 426,000 voters are not affiliated with the Democratic or Republican Party. That is 17 percent of the voters, and it is growing across the Commonwealth and across this nation, but they are being denied a voice. Mr. President, while many eligible registered Democrats and Republicans are shirking their ability to vote, they did not vote in last Tuesday's primary. Independent voters were showing up -- so they are showing up, but they got turned away, and apathetic Democrats and Republicans did not even bother to go.

Being an Independent or No Party voter should not disqualify anyone from having a say in who their candidates will be for the November general election. They pay their taxes just like the rest of us. Many of them serve our military. If we are going to exclude these citizens from voting in party primaries, then why are we using their State tax dollars to fund those closed primary functions? If we are not going to allow registered voters to participate, then perhaps it is time for both the Democratic and Republican Parties to pay for their own party elections.

For these reasons, I have introduced Senate Bill No. 280, which would allow Independent and No Party voters to participate in primary elections. Under this bill, these non-affiliated voters could show up on election day and they would not have to be told no. They would not be turned away. They would be embraced. Let me tell you something, those Independent voters, they knew who they were coming out to support or not support. They were informed voters, intelligent, informed, and then turned away at the polls just because they are registered Independent. It is the right thing to do by allowing them to vote. It is the fair thing to do. Mr. President, if we truly want a democracy, then we need to act that way. It is funny, there are more and more people registering Independent. Those numbers are going to grow, and yet, we are disenfranchising them. That is not fair.
