Section 604-B (a)(2) of the Administrative Code of 1929 specifies that the Independent Fiscal Office (IFO) shall "provide an assessment of the state's current fiscal condition and a projection of what the fiscal condition will be during the next five years. The assessment shall take into account the state of the economy, demographics, revenues and expenditures." In fulfillment of that obligation, the IFO submits this report to the residents of the Commonwealth and members of the General Assembly. In accordance with the mission of the office, this report does not make any policy recommendations.

The data and projections presented in this report are from various sources. Economic projections for Pennsylvania are from the IFO, while projections for the U.S. are from the Congressional Budget Office (June 2017) or IHS Economics (October 2017). Demographic projections are

from the Pennsylvania State Data Center based on tabulations from the 2016 Population Estimates by the U.S. Census Bureau. Historical revenue and expenditure data are from the Commonwealth's *Consolidated Annual Financial Report*, the *Governor's Executive Budget* and various departmental reports. All revenue and expenditure projections are from the IFO. Other data sources are noted in the relevant sections of this report.

Among many other notable accomplishments, Dr. Watson is also the director of the Multi-physics Modeling and Simulation Group, as well as system code development group leader for the Nuclear Power Safety Center at Penn State. As if all of this was not impressive enough, Dr. Watson has produced more than 25 journal publications, refereed proceedings and other papers, and has been the principal investigator on more than \$1.6 million in funded research. I had the wonderful opportunity to meet Dr. Watson and see his great work on a recent trip to Penn State's nuclear engineering program, where I gained a new appreciation for the school's contribution to American nuclear research.

Without further ado, please join me in welcoming my esteemed guest, Dr. Justin Watson, and his wife, Anna, to the Pennsylvania State Senate.

And ironically, when it comes to age-of-consent laws, we have a belief that a child has to be of a certain age to make a decision as it pertains to their own body. But here now, yet again, we are in a position to vote on a plan that will not really give a say to a child, but put that decision in the hands of a parent, trying to guess the outcome of what that child may want. To little surprise, there are cases around the world now going back as far as 2011 where children who have gone through various procedures for sex-change surgery have turned around and even sued their parents for making the wrong decision. I do not think there is a Member in this Chamber, Mr. President, who does not support healthcare for children who need it, but this goes well above and beyond. If we truly were advocating for any child who has to deal with an issue, who may be bullied or needs to make changes to their physical appearance so they are not stressed out with various mental health issues or whatever it might be, but that is not the case. We are not standing up for every single child who may need these types of services.

So, with that, Mr. President, I encourage a "no" vote on concurrence. Thank you.

An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in protection from abuse, providing for the definition of "electronic monitoring device" and further providing for relief.

SB 653 (Pr. No. 1374) (Amended) (Rereported)

An Act amending the act of December 31, 1965 (P.L.1257, No.511), known as The Local Tax Enabling Act, in local taxes, further providing for collection; in consolidated collection of local income taxes, further providing for tax collection committees and for powers and duties of tax officer; in collection of delinquent taxes, further providing for costs of collection; and making a related editorial change.

SB 796 (Pr. No. 1008) (Rereported)

An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in fees, further providing for exemptions from other fees.

SB 799 (Pr. No. 1258) (Rereported)

An Act establishing the Pennsylvania Clean Water Procurement Program; providing for powers and duties of the State Conservation Commission; and establishing the Watershed Improvement Fund.

SB 827 (Pr. No. 1290) (Rereported)

An Act amending Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, enacting the Revised Uniform Fiduciary Access to Digital Assets Act (2015); providing for user direction and agreements, for disclosure of digital assets and electronic communications, for functions of fiduciaries and for compliance and immunity for custodians of digital assets and electronic communications; making conforming amendments; and providing for functions of the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts.

HB 1175 (Pr. No. 2801) (Amended) (Rereported)

An Act amending Title 65 (Public Officers) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in lobbying disclosure, further providing for definitions, for registration, for reporting, for prohibited activities, for administration, for penalties and for registration fees, fund established, system and regulations.

HB 1231 (Pr. No. 2158) (Rereported)

An Act amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, providing for veterans registry.

HB 1234 (Pr. No. 1461) (Rereported)

An Act amending the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the Health Care Facilities Act, in licensing of health care facilities, further providing for definitions; and abrogating regulations.

HB 1448 (Pr. No. 2109) (Rereported)

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, providing for higher education accountability and transparency.

Senator WARD, from the Committee on Labor and Industry, reported the following bill:

HB 1915 (Pr. No. 2735)

An Act amending the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937 P.L.2897, No.1), known as the Unemployment Compensation Law, in contributions by employers and employees, further providing for contributions by employees and for Service and Infrastructure Improvement Fund.

Senator McILHINNEY, from the Committee on Law and Justice, reported the following bill:

HB 1902 (Pr. No. 2786)

An Act amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, in Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board, further providing for enforcement; in liquor, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages licenses and regulations, further providing for interlocking business prohibited, for breweries, for unlawful acts relative to malt or brewed beverages and licensees and for unlawful acts relative to liquor, malt and brewed beverages and licensees; and making related repeals.

Last year, 1,200,000 wreaths were placed at 1,226 locations. This is an honorable mission, one that we all need to support. These wreaths express our gratitude for the service and ultimate sacrifice made by our fellow Pennsylvanians, as well as their comrades from hometowns across our great nation. Even with this solemn service, we cannot fully repay those men and women who died in defense of our country, but we can, and must, continue to honor their memory and pay tribute to their unfailing courage. They brought us to this time in history, and their sacrifices have not been made in vain. It is also fitting during this holiday season to remember and honor those serving today at posts here and around the world. They are truly ordinary people doing extraordinary things, making extraordinary sacrifices, and we owe them our respect and prayers. As we enjoy the holidays safe and with our families, we should also remember and thank the lonely young people far away from home. They are performing their duties with fidelity. To them, on behalf of a grateful Commonwealth and nation, I say thank you and offer best wishes for a safe and happy holiday and a bountiful new year.

Finally, I thank Wreaths Across America and commend the efforts of the thousands of volunteers here and around the world insuring that we remember the sacrifices made for us. Mr. President, in this season of giving, Wreaths Across America displays the best of our society, receives no government funding with the cost of its programs paid for by individual sponsors, corporate donors, and volunteer truckers. Earlier today, the Gold Star and Blue Star Mothers organized a Wreaths Across America service in the Capitol Rotunda. It was very well done. This Saturday, another ceremony will take place at Fort Indiantown Gap National Cemetery at 12 noon.

I thank those who have helped organize these special events and ask for an affirmative vote on this resolution. I ask that God bestow blessings on all the men and women who serve, who

have served, who have made the ultimate sacrifice, and may those blessings be in the spirit of Christmas. Merry Christmas to all of those who will not be home to share this holiday with their loved ones.
