In accordance with the provisions of Act 34 of 2013, the Department of Labor and Industry is providing an accounting of the Service and Infrastructure Improvement Fund (SIIF), including contributions, expenditures, and use of funds, for the prior year.

In response to significant declines in federal funding for Pennsylvania's unemployment compensation program, the General Assembly approved Act 34 of 2013 to provide additional revenue and enable the department to maintain reasonable levels of services for claimants and employers. Specifically, Act 34 added section 301.9 to the Unemployment Compensation Law to establish the SIIF as a restricted account within the State Treasury. It amended section 301.4(e)(2) of the act to provide for deposits from existing employee contributions.

Act 60 of 2017 substantially amended these sections of the act to extend funding through 2021 as well as establishing the General Assembly's intent to reduce the department's reliance on SIIF. Under this act, SIIF revenue must be expended to maintain and modernize the operations of the unemployment compensation system during the implementation and initial deployment of technological upgrades to the delivery system for unemployment compensation payments. Separate transfers are required for the purposes of expenses related to personnel and operations and of expenses related to technology upgrades.

Specifically, moneys in the SIIF are appropriated on a continuing basis, upon approval of the Governor, to the department for the following purposes:

- To improve the quality, efficiency and timeliness of services provided by the service center system to individuals claiming compensation under this act, including claim filing, claim administration, adjudication services, and staffing and training of system employees.
- Expenditures for information management technology, communications technology, and other infrastructure components that the secretary determines are likely to result in significant and lasting improvements to the unemployment compensation system.
- To pay the costs of collecting the contributions deposited into the SIIF pursuant to section 301.4(e)(2).
- To pay for any costs related to the preparation of the unemployment compensation system to end its reliance on transfers to the SIIF.

On June 26, 1989, the revised Public Official and Employee Ethics Law was enacted which re-authorized the State Ethics Commission. The State Ethics Commission is responsible for issuing various types of rulings on matters within its mandated jurisdiction. Pursuant to the law, the Commission is mandated to forward, quarterly, a copy of every Opinion, Advice of Counsel, and Order issued to one law library in each county, one public library in each county, the State Library, the State Senate Library, each authority appointing a Commission member, the Pennsylvania Association of County Commissioners, the Pennsylvania Association of Boroughs, the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors, the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Commissioners, the Pennsylvania State School Boards Association, and the Pennsylvania League of Cities. Your agency is either specifically identified in the above requirement or has been selected as a library to which this mailing will be made pursuant to the above authority. As such, enclosed please find decisions of the State Ethics Commission from April 1, 2018 to June 30, 2018. Due to budgetary restraints, a CD containing said rulings will replace paper copies that were previously sent.

For your information, the Commission generally issues these types of decisions as follows:

Commission Opinions - Opinions are advisory rulings issued by the State Ethics Commission regarding the duties and responsibilities of public officials and employees under the Public Official and Employee Ethics Law. Opinions are catalogued by year of issuance followed by the sequential number of the opinion during that year. As such, opinions relating to 2018 will begin with the number 18-001 and proceed there from as decisions are rendered.

Advice of Counsel - The Commission's Chief Counsel is authorized to issue similar advisory letters. Such letters are issued generally when there is prior precedent for counsel to rely upon in issuing a decision or when the provisions of the State Ethics Act directly provide the answer to the question posed. Advice of Counsel letters are numbered with the year and a 500 series number that progresses in order therefrom as rulings are issued. If more than 100 such letters are issued, a 600 series number will then be used.

Orders - Commission orders are issued at the end of an investigation and are determinations as to whether or not there has been a violation of the State Ethics Act. Commission orders are categorized numerically from the date of the first order in 1979. That is, the first Order issued was Order No. 1. All orders proceed there from.

It is recommended that Opinions, Advices of Counsel and Orders be maintained separately (in numerical order) so as to afford better retrievability.

The enclosed items are being forwarded for retention, cataloging and for the purpose of being publicly available for review by citizens of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania who may have an interest therein. Additional mailings will be made on a quarterly basis henceforth. If you

(b) The model curriculum and guidelines shall:

(1) be posted in the department's publicly accessible Internet website;

(2) be age-appropriate;

(3) be revised regularly to remain current with national standards;

(4) provide guidance for integration into health courses or other appropriate curriculum requirement as listed in 22 Pa. Code § 4.23 (relating to high school education);

(5) be made available to all school entities;

(6) include compilation of recommended guidelines and educational materials from organizations with expertise in CPR and emergency care;

(7) incorporate psychomotor skills training, including hands-only CPR technique;

(8) include information on the purpose of an automated external defibrillator.

(c) (1) A school entity that offers instruction in CPR may utilize the model curriculum developed by the department under subsection (a) or develop the school entity's own curriculum in accordance with academic standards and consistent with guidelines developed under subsection (a). A school entity may utilize appropriate publicly or privately available materials, personnel and other resources in developing and implementing this instruction, subject to the requirements of section 111 and 23 Pa.C.S. § 6344 (relating to employees having contact with children; adoptive and foster parents).

(2) A teacher, instructor or community volunteer may provide, facilitate or oversee the instruction offered by a school entity under this section and need not be a certified CPR trainer.

(d) An individual who in good faith provides instruction in CPR to a student under this section shall not be liable for any civil damages as a result of any act or omission relating to the instruction, except for an act or omission intentionally designed to harm or a grossly negligent act or omission that results in harm to an individual to whom the student administers CPR.

(e) As used in this section, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

"Automated external defibrillator." A portable defibrillator designed to be automated for use by a person without substantial medical training who responds to a cardiac emergency.

"Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation" or "CPR." A first aid technique utilizing hands-only compressions of the chest used to revive an individual whose heart has stopped beating.

"Department." The Department of Education of the Commonwealth.

"Psychomotor skills." The use of hands-on practice to support cognitive learning.

"School entity." A school district, joint school district, charter school, regional charter school, cyber charter school, intermediate unit or area vocational-technical school.

Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

Sepsis is a potentially life-threatening complication of an infection. Sepsis occurs when chemicals released into the bloodstream to fight the infection trigger inflammatory responses throughout the body. Mr. President, sepsis is the leading reason for hospital re-admissions. According to the Mayo Clinic, anyone can develop sepsis, but it is most common and most dangerous in older adults or those with weakened immune systems. Early treatment, usually with antibiotics and large amounts of intravenous fluids, improves chances for survival.

Earlier this month, sepsis researchers and experts, as well as clinical staff from across the State, met in Harrisburg for the 2018 sepsis conference hosted by the Hospital and Healthsystem Association of Pennsylvania. The statewide conference attracted more than 200 attendees for a day of presentations and discussions about the latest research and collaborative solutions to prevent, detect, and treat sepsis. Let us help those who want to help patients avoid going back to the hospital and suffering needlessly. Early treatment is vital, and it means patients need to be able to identify symptoms and speak up before it is too late. Designating September as Sepsis Awareness Month would help get the word out and prevent suffering.

This year, over 10,000 children will be diagnosed with pediatric cancer, which remains the leading cause of death from disease for those under the age of 15.

God willing, these efforts will help provide much-needed funding for pediatric research so that no child and no family has to face the monster that is cancer. There is more we can do. We must do more for the parents who, on top of the suffering of the unimaginable pain of having a sick child, face losing their jobs and their health coverage to attend appointments and treatments. We must do more for the families who have sold everything and done things even they never imagined to pay for their child's care. And, most importantly, we must do more for our children fighting the battle for their lives.

Mr. President, this fight is not over. Pediatric cancer has an army coming for it and it should be scared. It is an army of doctors and nurses, researchers, advocates, family, survivors, and angels, and we will not hold back. We will be relentless and we will be victorious.

I know that my granddaughter has inspired me, so it is my hope that by designating Childhood Cancer Awareness Month we can all help raise awareness for those patients, their families, and their healthcare providers who have dedicated their lives to helping these children, and as an acknowledgement of appreciation, Mr. President, to all the doctors, nurses, staff, and volunteers who are there every day to help these children and their families deal with childhood cancer.

September 17, 2018, marks the 231st anniversary of the framing of the Constitution by the Constitutional Convention. This is why it is appropriate to accord official recognition to this

historic document, its memorable anniversary, and to the patriotic celebrations which will commemorate it.

The importance of honoring our United States Constitution rings especially true to me as my sixth great-grandfather fought in the American Revolution, which led to the establishment of our Constitution. Together, we need to urge all Pennsylvanians to reaffirm the ideals that the Framers of the Constitution had in 1787 by protecting the freedoms guaranteed to us through this guardian of our liberties. I ask my colleagues to join me in recognizing Constitution Week in Pennsylvania.

Senator TARTAGLIONE. Mr. President, today I rise to speak about an observance that celebrates the rich cultural history and meaningful contributions of Hispanic Americans. I ask you to support my resolution designating September 15 through October 15 as "Hispanic Heritage Month" in Pennsylvania. The United States began commemorating Hispanic heritage formally in 1968 when President Lyndon Johnson created Hispanic Heritage Week. Twenty years later, President Ronald Reagan proclaimed the first national Hispanic Heritage Month starting on September 15 of that year. That date is significant in the Spanish-speaking world because it marks Independence Day for Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua. In addition, Mexico and Chile celebrate their independence on September 16 and 18 respectively. In my home city of Philadelphia, the annual Puerto Rican Day Parade and Festival is held this month. It has been a community tradition for over 50 years, and will take place on September 30. I invite you to visit the city for colorful and spectacular music, dancing, and floats.

Indeed, Hispanic Heritage Month is a great time to indulge in cultural fiestas, but it is also a wonderful educational opportunity. You can learn how some of the nation's earliest settlers brought Hispanic traditions and customs to Pennsylvania during the 1400s and how Hispanic Americans constitute the nation's largest and fastest-growing ethnic group. We can also learn about individuals whose dedication and contributions have enabled the nation to become a global leader and an emblem of liberty, justice, and innovation. I am talking about people like Supreme Court Justice Sonia Sotomayor, astronaut Ellen Ochoa, labor

organizer Cesar Chavez, Rock and Roll Hall of Fame inductee Carlos Santana, and Oscar-winning performer Rita Moreno, who has also won the Grammy, Tony, and Emmy Awards during her illustrious career. The contributions of Hispanic people continue to enrich the American melting pot. I am proud to say that chef Douglas Rodriguez, known as the Godfather of Nuevo Latino cuisine, oversees one of the highest-rated Hispanic-influenced restaurants in the country, Alma de Cuba, in downtown Philadelphia.

For these reasons, I ask my Senate colleagues to please join me in recognizing Hispanic Heritage Month in Pennsylvania. I encourage all residents of the Commonwealth to learn more about Hispanic culture and celebrate its presence in our daily lives.

Our utilities provide thousands of good-paying, family-sustaining community jobs with an average salary of nearly twice the jobs of other sectors. Because of our aging workforce and the growth of new technologies and systems, there is a strong need for additional skilled workers to fill these available jobs in the utility industry, which has seen job increases more than 11 percent in the last 5 years.

Mr. President, you do not have to go any further than watching the results of Hurricane Florence that hit the North Carolina coast. These individuals worked tirelessly and are dedicated as they provide vital services in times of disasters. When people are ordered to leave, these people working for the utilities drive into the hurricane as other people are escaping the hurricane. Their services are vital, they need to get the power, the lights, the water, and things working for people as they return.

In fact, between 3,000 and 4,500 individuals in the United States with ruptured brain aneurysms die before they even reach the hospital. Early detection has come a long way, we can save lives with that. There are a number of advancements, people have testing done to identify problems in their system, including CT scans, MRIs, cerebral arteriograms, and some other things that medical science has developed over the last several years, but there is still a lot we can do. We ask people to be cognizant of the problems that can lead to an aneurysm and help support, in many different ways, families who have suffered through this, and financially when they can, to contribute to organizations that support those families and support research on aneurysms.

So, I ask my colleagues today to support designating September as "Brain Aneurysm Awareness Month" in this great State of Pennsylvania.
