On June 26, 1989, the revised Public Official and Employee Ethics Law was enacted which re-authorized the State Ethics Commission. The State Ethics Commission is responsible for issuing various types of rulings on matters within its mandated jurisdiction. Pursuant to the law, the Commission is mandated to forward, quarterly, a copy of every Opinion, Advice of Counsel, and Order issued to one law library in each county, one public library in each county, the State Library, the State Senate Library, each authority appointing a Commission member, the Pennsylvania Association of County Commissioners, the Pennsylvania Association of Boroughs, the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors, the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Commissioners, the Pennsylvania State School Boards Association, and the Pennsylvania League of Cities. Your agency is either specifically identified in the above requirement or has been selected as a library to which this mailing will be made pursuant to the above authority. As such, enclosed please find decisions of the State Ethics Commission from October 1, 2019, to December 31, 2019. Due to budgetary restraints, a CD containing said rulings will replace paper copies that were previously sent.

For your information, the Commission generally issues these types of decisions as follows:

Commission Opinions - Opinions are advisory rulings issued by the State Ethics Commission regarding the duties and responsibilities of public officials and employees under the Public Official and Employee Ethics Law. Opinions are catalogued by year of issuance followed by the sequential number of the opinion during that year. As such, opinions relating to 2019 will begin with the number 19-001 and proceed there from as decisions are rendered.

Advice of Counsel - The Commission's Chief Counsel is authorized to issue similar advisory letters. Such letters are issued generally when there is prior precedent for counsel to rely upon in issuing a decision or when the provisions of the State Ethics Act directly provide the answer to the question posed. Advice of Counsel letters are numbered with the year and a 500 series number that progresses in order therefrom as rulings are issued. If more than 100 such letters are issued, a 600 series number will then be used.

Orders - Commission orders are issued at the end of an investigation and are determinations as to whether or not there has been a violation of the State Ethics Act. Commission orders are categorized numerically from the date of the first order in 1979. That is, the first Order issued was Order No. 1. All orders proceed there from.

It is recommended that Opinions, Advices of Counsel and Orders be maintained separately (in numerical order) so as to afford better retrievability.

The enclosed items are being forwarded for retention, cataloging and for the purpose of being publicly available for review by citizens of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania who may have an interest therein. Additional mailings will be made on a quarterly basis henceforth. (c) Determination and costs to be paid.--The individual shall pay for all costs associated with the 24/7 sobriety monitoring program, including administrative and operating costs or costs associated with any required devices or technologies. The court may authorize the county to finance costs associated with the 24/7 sobriety monitoring program if the court, at any time, determines the individual lacks the financial ability to pay all or part of costs associated with a 24/7 sobriety monitoring program.

(d) Financial inquiry.--A court determination under subsection (c) shall be based on an appropriate inquiry into the financial circumstances of the individual required to participate in a 24/7 sobriety monitoring program and an affidavit or certificate, signed by that individual, demonstrating financial inability to pay all or part of the costs associated with the 24/7 sobriety monitoring program.

(e) Prohibitions.--An individual required to participate in a 24/7 sobriety monitoring program is prohibited from all of the following for the duration of the 24/7 sobriety monitoring program:

(1) Imbibing alcohol, using controlled substances or both as determined by the court.

(2) Tampering with devices or technologies associated with the 24/7 sobriety monitoring program.

(3) Failing to comply with any other requirements ordered by the court as part of the 24/7 sobriety monitoring program.

Section 8. The Department of Transportation, in consultation with the Pennsylvania State Police and the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts, shall evaluate the effectiveness of driving under the influence courts in this Commonwealth and submit a report with findings and recommendations to the Transportation Committees of the Senate and the Transportation Committees of the House of Representatives within six months of the effective date of this section.

education throughout the United States. This year's theme is Catholic Schools: Learn, Serve, Lead, Succeed. It will be marked by Masses, assemblies, and other activities. In our Commonwealth, there are more than 141,000 students enrolled in Catholic schools at elementary and secondary levels instilling values, self-esteem, self-confidence, and leadership skills. It is important to note that Catholic schools graduate 99 percent of their high school students while saving State and local taxpayers significantly each year. On a personal note, I was fortunate to attend 12 years of Catholic education beginning with grade school at Our Lady of Fatima and high school at Cardinal O'Hara, and both of these schools led to the foundation of my success, and later on at Penn State University.

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentlewoman from Washington, Senator Bartolotta.

Senator BARTOLOTTA. Mr. President, human trafficking is a pervasive worldwide problem that impacts nearly every community across our nation, including communities right here in this Commonwealth. It is a form of modern-day slavery in which human beings are controlled and exploited for profit. Perpetrators use force, fraud, or coercion to manipulate and establish control over individuals who are being trafficked for labor and sex every single day. Many victims of human trafficking are subjected to psychological manipulation until they develop loyalty to their traffickers. In other cases, victims may have children or loved ones whose lives are threatened if they do not comply with the traffickers' demands. Everyone is familiar with the drug trafficking epidemic, but in instances of drug dealing, dealers must constantly procure their product. However, in sex trafficking, a victim is a never-ending supply for profit to the trafficker. Just last week, Federal authorities announced racketeering charges against 13 members of a sex trafficking enterprise accused of using violence to force women, including some minors, to work as sex slaves in a Reading boarding house only 2 blocks from Penn Square.

Human trafficking continues to be one of the fastest-growing criminal enterprises in the world. According to the National Human Trafficking Hotline, nearly 11,000 cases were reported in

2018, including both labor and sex trafficking. During this time, 275 cases were reported in Pennsylvania, ranking our Commonwealth 11th in the nation. Additionally, it is estimated that there are over 40 million victims of trafficking worldwide, with hundreds of thousands of individuals being victimized across the country.

Just 2 years ago at this time, I was able to bring to our State Capitol Lance Tracy from Los Angeles, who was the writer and director for the film *Relentless*. Many of my colleagues joined us to see that film at that time. This film tells the story of a mother who discovers a trafficking ring while looking for her kidnapped daughter. With the group, Dawn Adams of Abolish Slavery also joined us for the private showing of the film to help raise awareness of human trafficking right here in Pennsylvania. Thankfully, efforts are underway to dismantle trafficking networks and help survivors rebuild their lives. In recent days, a package of bills was advanced to the House to tighten Pennsylvania's human trafficking laws. I applaud my colleagues, particularly in this Chamber, who have been working to draw awareness to this issue and who are fighting to stop human trafficking which is plaguing innocent victims. For these reasons, I stand here today to recognize the month of January 2020 as "National Human Trafficking Awareness and Prevention Month," and I ask my colleagues to join me in support of this resolution.

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentlewoman from Luzerne, Senator Baker.

Senator BAKER. Mr. President, despite advances in medical technology, research, drugs, screening, and other crucial aspects of our healthcare system, we are still challenged by some very basic problems. This resolution calling for a designated day is meant to raise awareness of the women, too many women, who die from complications experienced during pregnancy and childbirth. It is meant to encourage involvement by professionals and patients in seeking to find answers. While the maternal mortality numbers in many parts of the world are dropping, the story here in America is just the opposite. For three decades, the numbers here have been on the rise. We have taken action here in the Commonwealth through the creation of a maternal mortality review committee. That is a necessary beginning, as the numbers

show we have more to do in determining risk factors, figuring out when problems are most likely to occur and why, and implementing prevention and intervention policies to curtail tragic losses. This is a cause that should unite everyone in order to save lives and bring new lives into the world.

I ask for support for this important resolution designating "Maternal Health Awareness Day" here in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in January.

A Resolution commemorating the decommissioning of USS Pittsburgh (SSN 720) in Pennsylvania.

On the question,
Will the Senate adopt the resolution?

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentlewoman from Allegheny, Senator Iovino.

Senator IOVINO. Mr. President, on January 17, 2020, the Los Angeles-class fast-attack submarine USS *Pittsburgh*, SSN-720, was inactivated and decommissioned at Puget Sound Naval Shipyard in Bremerton, Washington. This marked the end of a proud 35-year history of protecting American freedom, strengthening partnerships with U.S. allies, and advancing international security, all under the namesake of our Commonwealth's great city of Pittsburgh.

The nuclear-powered SSN-720 was the fourth vessel to be named after the Steel City in U.S. history, which included an ironclad gunboat commissioned in 1861, which served during the American Civil War; an armored cruiser commissioned in 1905, which served during World War I; and a Baltimore-class cruiser commissioned in 1944, which served during World War II. The last USS *Pittsburgh* also was deployed in wartime and peacetime, completing over 1,000 dives under the course of its service, a rare milestone in U.S. Navy history. It also served in both Operation Desert Storm and Operation Iraqi Freedom. USS *Pittsburgh* completed deployments in the Mediterranean, the Middle East, Africa, and the Caribbean all while staying true to the submarine force call Run Silent, Run Deep.

Under the *Pittsburgh's* final commanding officer, Commander Jason Deichler, a native of the Pittsburgh area who graduated from Chartiers Valley School District, which spans both Senator Fontana's and my districts, USS *Pittsburgh* and its crew of 150 sailors completed their final deployment on February 25, 2019, traveling under the ice in an unprecedented Arctic deployment for the sub. Its recent decommissioning on January 17 represents the end of a chapter of U.S. Naval history that includes historic stories of war and peace, human stories of perseverance and grit,

and sea stories of duty and honor. It is my honor to ask that we recognize that history and those stories.

Mr. President, I ask for an affirmative vote on the resolution commemorating the decommissioning of Los Angeles-class fast-attack submarine USS *Pittsburgh*. Thank you.

And the question recurring,
Will the Senate adopt the resolution?

A voice vote having been taken, the question was determined in the affirmative.

PETITIONS AND REMONSTRANCES

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentlewoman from Philadelphia, Senator Tartaglione.

Senator TARTAGLIONE. Mr. President, today marks 4,950 days since the Pennsylvania legislature last raised the minimum wage. Mr. President, that is more than 13 1/2 years, and it is far too long. Mr. President, there are many different reasons why that statistic is so troubling. As I have stated many times before, all six of Pennsylvania's bordering States and 29 States across the nation have a higher minimum wage than our own. Seventeen States have a minimum wage of or at least \$10 an hour. Earlier this month, 21 States celebrated the new year by raising the minimum wage. In 2019, 18 States began the year with a higher minimum wage. In 2018, 18 States did it. In 2017, 19 States did it.

Meanwhile, Pennsylvania has fallen far behind. Perhaps most troubling is that we already have carefully crafted bipartisan legislation right here in this building that would, once again, at long last, raise the minimum wage. Unfortunately, Senate Bill No. 79 has met obstruction in the House, where certain Members seem intent on dismissing the prevailing economic data and academic research, ignoring the authentic examples of many other States, and defying the will of the vast majority of Pennsylvanians. The House Committee on Labor and Industry has refused to act on Senate Bill No. 79. Under the current leadership, it is abundantly clear that Senate Bill No. 79 will not even be considered.

Mr. President, at this point, I enter for the record a quote attributed to the sitting chairman of the committee. On January 13, after the committee adopted a resolution by party-line vote opposing Governor Wolf's proposed changes to the State's overtime regulation, the chairman reportedly said this to accredited members of the Capitol press corps, and this is a direct quote: The Governor basically put a gun to our head, and he basically said, you choose your ammunition. I am going to pull the trigger, and you are going to end up with either overreaching overtime rules or you are going to end up with a damaging minimum wage increase that is going to hamper your business. You decide what ammunition you are going to use, but I am pulling the trigger. There are a lot of my colleagues that really resent this kind of negotiations. End quote.

Mr. President, first let me say, if this quote is accurate, or even close to accurate, it is appalling. According to the National Center for Health Statistics, we had more than 1,600 firearm related deaths in Pennsylvania in 2017, and almost 40,000 nationwide. That is the most recent year available, but we all know that the epidemic of gun violence continues. For a public official to use such an analogy, even as hyperbole, is egregiously irresponsible and disrespectful to the victims of violence, their loved ones, and to the elected officials from both parties who worked very hard in good faith to find a viable compromise on minimum wage.

That said, the analogy is also patently false. Pennsylvania has not updated its overtime regulation in more than 40 years. Let me

say that again, in more than 40 years. In other words, that is about twice as long as the aforementioned committee chairman has been a resident of this State. Small businesses, mid-size businesses, and big businesses have had the benefit of the 1970s era overtime rules for more than four decades, and they have had that long to prepare for the inevitable effects of inflation. Likewise, a \$9.50 minimum wage poses no existential threat. Time and again in States and cities across the country, the record shows that measured consistent minimum wage increases actually helped workers and businesses by putting more money into consumers' hands and elevating the local economy. Personally, I support the new overtime rules, and I favor a much larger increase in minimum wage, but I realize others do not see things the way I do. That is why we must compromise.

Whether it is with new overtime rules or a modest increase to minimum wage, we now have the opportunity to help hundreds of thousands of Pennsylvanians. We have the opportunity to literally save countless lives by insuring that people have more income to pay for food, shelter, healthcare, child care, and education. So I urge the House to adopt Senate Bill No. 79 and deliver it to the Governor's desk for his signature.
