**COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE GOVERNOR**

**SENATE BILL RETURNED WITHOUT APPROVAL**

The PRESIDENT pro tempore laid before the Senate the following veto communication in writing from His Excellency, the Governor of the Commonwealth, advising that the following Senate Bill had been returned without approval:

**SB 906**, entitled:

An Act amending the act of October 20, 1966 (3rd Sp.Sess., P.L.96, No.6), known as the Mental Health and Intellectual Disability Act of 1966, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions; and, in responsibilities of the State, providing for State center closure moratorium.

TO THE HONORABLE SENATE OF THE

Pursuant to Article IV, Section 15 of the Pennsylvania Constitution, I am returning herewith, without my approval, Senate Bill 906, Printer's Number 1447.

All people deserve the opportunity to live among their family and peers in integrated, supportive homes. Quality home and community-based care should be the priority for the individuals we serve.

Community care results in better outcomes for individuals with disabilities. Individuals with disabilities should be offered an everyday life as fully integrated members of our communities. My goal is to serve more individuals in the community, reduce reliance on institutional care, and improve access to home and community-based services.

This legislation does not promote this investment and transition to community-based care for individuals with a disability. Instead, this legislation continues the reliance on institutionalization and is a barrier to community living.

Specifically, this legislation is in response to the recent announcement of the closures of two state-operated centers: Polk State Center and White Haven State Center. These centers are large institutions that are costly to maintain and do not promote community living. As individuals have transitioned to the community, the need for state-operated centers has declined. It should be acknowledged that closures of state centers have always been controversial. The process that the Department of Human Services has followed for state center closure announcements was established to provide for the planful transition of residents and staff and to honor agreements with the employee unions.

The department has followed this announcement procedure for the last two decades. The Department fully understands the gravity of the decision to close a center and has extensive procedures in place for such closures.

As previously announced, my administration will continue to work with residents, their families and the employees of the state centers to provide a smooth and safe transition over the next few years. No resident will leave these state-operated centers without a destination of the resident's and the family's choosing, including the option to remain in a state center setting. Further, no resident will leave without a fully developed individualized plan for the physical, emotional, developmental, social and mental health needs of the resident.

The debate around this closure has been polarizing. I look forward to the parties coming together and shifting our focus to ensuring a thoughtful and successful transition for each resident and each employee.

For the reasons set forth above, I must withhold my signature from Senate Bill 906, Printer's Number 1447.

WHEREAS, The Rules of the Senate for the 203rd and 204th Regular Session, as adopted in Senate Resolution No. 3, Printer's No. 3 (2019), on January 1, 2019, remain in full force and effect; the only changes to those Rules are as provided in this resolution; and

WHEREAS, Printing of documents may be impaired because of remote operation of the administrative duties and proceedings of the Senate; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That, notwithstanding Rules 6 and 7 of the Senate:

in the absence of the Secretary-Parliamentarian and the Chief Clerk and subject to the direction of the President Pro Tempore, the Assistant Secretary shall attest all writs, warrants and subpoenas issued by order of the Senate and shall certify as to the passage of Senate bills and the approval of executive nominations; and

in the absence of both officers and the Assistant Secretary, the President pro tempore shall designate a signatory;

and be it further

RESOLVED, That, notwithstanding Rule 9 of the Senate, there shall be no guest introductions; and be it further

RESOLVED, That, notwithstanding Rule 9 of the Senate, there shall be no consideration of unanimous consent resolutions; and be it further

RESOLVED, That, notwithstanding Rule 12(k) of the Senate, a sponsor may electronically file with the Secretary-Parliamentarian for introduction a bill imprinted with the stamp of the Legislative Reference Bureau; and be it further

RESOLVED, That, notwithstanding Rule 14(h) of the Senate, members may remotely participate in committee meetings as follows:

remote participation means simultaneous, interactive participation in a committee meeting by committee members not physically present at the location of the meeting, through means of communication technologies designed to accommodate and facilitate such simultaneous, interactive participation;

committee members participating remotely shall be counted for the purpose of determining a quorum;

a quorum shall be established through a roll call; and

technology employed for remote committee meetings must safeguard the integrity of the legislative process and maintain the deliberative character of the meeting by providing for simultaneous, aural and verbal communication among all participants;

and be it further

RESOLVED, That, notwithstanding Rule 14 of the Senate:

the President pro tempore may appoint a senator to serve in a temporary capacity as a member of a committee, serving only for the duration of a single session day for a particular committee meeting;

the President pro tempore shall transmit this designation to the Secretary-Parliamentarian for retention during the two-year legislative session, and this record shall be available for public inspection upon request; and

the communication shall be read across the desk and printed in the Senate journal on the next legislative day of the Senate;

and be it further

RESOLVED, That, in addition to the provisions of Rule 14 of the Senate:

regulations shall be deposited with the Legislative Reference Bureau;

the bureau shall transmit the regulations to the appropriate committee for consideration within 24 hours; the bureau shall transmit notice of the transmission of the regulations to the Secretary-Parliamentarian; and

the time for consideration shall begin on the date the committee receives the regulations from the bureau;

and be it further

RESOLVED, That, in addition to the provisions of Rule 17 of the Senate:

members participating remotely may cast votes for all measures considered and brought to a vote by the committee, as if the members were physically present at the committee meeting;

the identity of the voting member must be verified by the Chair; and

a member may also vote on matters before the committee pursuant to Rule 16(3);

and be it further

RESOLVED, That, notwithstanding Rule 20 of the Senate, members may remotely participate in the session of the Senate:

members participating remotely may cast votes for all measures considered and brought to a vote during session, as if the members were physically present at the session of the Senate;

the identity of the voting member must be verified by the Presiding Officer;

technology employed for remote participation in Senate session must safeguard the integrity of the legislative process and maintain the deliberative character of the session by providing for simultaneous, aural and verbal communication among all participants; and

a member may also vote as provided in Rule 20(b)(1) and (2);

and be it further

RESOLVED, Notwithstanding Rule 23 of the Senate, the Chief Clerk may provide for remote participation technology that enables members to participate in committee meetings and Senate Session; and be it further

RESOLVED, That, notwithstanding Rule 27 of the Senate:

Senators participating remotely in the session of the Senate shall be counted for the purpose of determining a quorum; and

a quorum shall be established through a roll call if the identity of the voting member is identified by the Presiding Officer;

and be it further

RESOLVED, That this resolution shall expire July 31, 2020, or 10 days following the expiration of the emergency declaration, whichever is earlier, unless otherwise further extended in accordance with the Rules of the Senate.

On the question,

Will the Senate adopt the resolution?

The PRESIDENT pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Centre, Senator Corman.

Senator CORMAN. Mr. President, let me begin by first thanking all the Members who made it in here today so that we could hold Session. I also thank all the Members who did not make it in today and stayed home and practiced social distancing, as our President and our Governor has asked us to do. We are in unprecedented times, at least certainly in my career and my lifetime. Unfortunately, unprecedented times call for unprecedented reactions, and today we are setting up an opportunity for the Senate to convene remotely. Not remotely from the Capitol, as we already have plans in place that if, for some reason, the Capitol was uninhabitable and we had to move elsewhere, we have those plans, but this will allow us to meet remotely as far as through technology so we can continue to practice the social distancing that has been requested. It is something that we do not do lightly. Clearly, the process of governing is an open process, a process where we come and exchange ideas and we are able to

be accountable for those ideas by members of the public and members of the media being here live to watch us operate. But with the challenges that we are facing today, we felt it necessary to give us this opportunity to meet remotely if we deem it appropriate to do. I can tell you that my pledge, that if we do exercise this option that we are voting on today, we will only, at least in the near term, vote on bills and resolutions dealing with the crisis, dealing with the pandemic that we are facing today. It would not be an opportunity to go through the normal policy discussions, as we will certainly have opportunities to do down the road. That is the near term, but we do not know where we are with this. Every day there seems to be a new news story, a new issue coming up that we have to deal with. We are not too far away from a primary here in Pennsylvania, which we will have to take a look at the ability to operate that primary in April. We are not too far away from having to do a State budget. Constitutionally, we need to have a budget concluded by June 30. Hopefully, we will be back here and be able to operate in a normal circumstance, but, if not, that may be something that we will have to come back in and begin policy discussions outside the pandemic crisis that we are dealing with today.

It is also my pledge to be as transparent as absolutely possible through this process, that if we meet remotely, we will certainly not only give the members of the media an opportunity to witness it and be part of it, but also members of the public as well. We are still working through the bugs of that. To be honest, we do not have it all figured out at this point in time, but that is my pledge today, that as we all try to be part of this new normal, that we still continue to operate under the same spirit and the same guidelines that have always governed us, which allows every Member to have an opportunity to have their say, to be part of the democratic process that they are elected to do by their constituents, and just because we are meeting remotely, we would not in any way deter their ability to govern and to represent their constituents in a fashion which their constituents asked them to do.

That is my pledge here today. Hopefully, we will not have to meet remotely, that would be ideal, but we needed to put this in place today, and I thank all the Members for coming in to pass this rule change so that if it is necessary, which may likely be the case, that we can continue to govern. People look to their government during these times for help, and it is time for us all to work together with our administration, our colleagues on the other side of the aisle, and with our colleagues in the House. They are looking for us to lead and to answer questions of a very nervous time. We are looking to Washington for whatever assistance as we go down this road and deal with all of these ramifications of what is being asked of us at this period of time. So, it is a time for us to step up together and it is a time for us to lead. This is one step for us to go and be able to vote remotely, but at the same time we want to make sure that people have confidence in what we are doing and that we are acting in their best interest, which I know every man and woman in this Chamber - Republican, Democrat, urban, suburban, rural - all want to work together to try to ease this process through so we can get through this pandemic and get back to normal. So it is our pledge to do that, and I ask for a positive vote on this resolution.

Thank you, Mr. President.

The PRESIDENT pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Allegheny, Senator Costa.

Senator COSTA. Mr. President, I rise also to encourage the Members to support Senate Resolution No. 318, and I echo the comments of my colleague and friend, the gentleman from Centre County, as it relates to, first and foremost, thanking the Members who are here today to participate in today's events to make certain that we are in a position to be able to do what needs to be done to allow us to govern in this Commonwealth. As was indicated, we are in extraordinary times and it takes extraordinary measures, but measures that we do not take lightly, and I think it is totally appropriate for us to be able to exercise this Senate Resolution to be able to allow us to get together and conduct the business that needs to be done as we fight and address this COVID-19 virus. That is what is most important. I also appreciate the gentleman's comments with respect to his pledge that we work forward remotely dealing with the issues related to the virus and, if necessary, the steps we have to take to be able to govern in a variety of different matters, whether it be dealing with the election, or the State budget, or other matters that may come before us and need to come before us as a collective body for us to address. I think that is important.

At the end of the day, Mr. President, the public, our constituencies, are looking at us to see how we are going to lead, and it is important that we continue to lead in this fashion; the fashion that we are working together, reaching compromise, and understanding that we need to do the people's business first and foremost. Other things can take a back seat for right now as we move forward, but the cooperative effort among the Leadership of the Senate, along with the House, the Governor's Office, and others is what is extremely important right now. I think, today, that is what we are demonstrating here and we will continue to demonstrate as we move forward. So I, too, encourage an affirmative vote on Senate Resolution No. 318.
