The PRESIDENT pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Allegheny, Senator Costa.

Senator COSTA. Mr. President, I submit remarks on behalf of Senator Tartaglione.

The PRESIDENT pro tempore. The remarks will be spread upon the record.

(The following prepared remarks were made part of the record at the request of the gentleman from Allegheny, Senator COSTA, on behalf of the gentlewoman from Philadelphia, Senator TARTAGLIONE:)

Mr. President, today marks 5,020 days since the Pennsylvania legislature last raised the minimum wage. That is more than 13 ½ years, and it is far too long.

Mr. President, we are living in a very challenging time, to say the least. The global coronavirus pandemic is unprecedented in our lifetime and harkens back to the era before modern medicine. So it is ironic, frustrating, and sad that only now, with the recent adoption of the Federal CARES Act, will allow many of Pennsylvania's lowest-wage workers to finally be able to collect a family-sustaining income. It is even more ironic and disturbing that the \$600 per week Federal stipend promised to workers in the Federal legislation will only be available to those who have lost their jobs because of the coronavirus, and even then, the relief will only be temporary, it will expire on July 31. Nonetheless, only the unemployed will be eligible to collect that income. Meanwhile, thousands of low-wage Pennsylvanians who now serve as essential workers and who remain on the job will continue to make less than \$15 an hour unless we raise our minimum wage. Many will make less than \$12 an hour, and some will make as little as \$7.25 an hour. That is unfair, unacceptable, and unsustainable.

In addition to the Federal unemployment payments I have mentioned, Pennsylvania's displaced workers will also be able to apply for State benefits. Yet, for low-wage workers in Pennsylvania, those State benefits will not amount to much. Using the same 40-hour workweek as the standard, a full-time minimum wage worker in the Commonwealth collects just \$290 a week in wages. If the worker gets laid off, he or she collects just \$145 a week in State unemployment benefits. Mr. President, that is not even enough money to fill a shopping cart at the grocery store, let alone pay for rent, healthcare, and childcare.

In trying times like now, when more than a million Pennsylvania workers have filed new unemployment claims since March 15, it is appalling that Members of the General Assembly have been so willing for so long to leave so many of our fellow Pennsylvanians without adequate wages and, by extension, without adequate unemployment benefits. It is long overdue for Pennsylvania to adopt a reasonable, living wage as its minimum wage.
