Kennedy, Jr., Memorial Bridge; designating the bridge identified as Bridge Key 16385 on the portion of State Route 4016, also known as West 38th Street, between Schaper Avenue and Pittsburgh Avenue over Interstate 79 in the City of Erie as the Major Tom Carr Memorial Bridge; and making related repeals.

Amend Bill, page 2, lines 16 and 17, by striking out all of said lines and inserting:

Section 2. Senator Hal Mowery Memorial Bridge.

(a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:

(1) Harold F. Mowery, Jr., was born January 4, 1930, in Chambersburg and was raised in Mechanicsburg.

(2) As a graduate of Mechanicsburg High School and Dickinson College, Mr. Mowery was a product of the Pennsylvania education system.

(3) Mr. Mowery entered the insurance business in 1954 and earned a chartered life underwriter degree. Over several decades, Mr. Mowery founded multiple highly successful insurance businesses that employed hundreds of Pennsylvanians.

(4) Mr. Mowery was elected to the House of Representatives in 1976 and went on to serve seven terms. In the House of Representatives, Mr. Mowery achieved a reputation for expertise on fiscal and pension issues and advocated for the application of private-sector business principles to the operation of public programs and State spending. He was also instrumental in establishing the Public Employee Retirement Commission.

(5) In 1992, Mr. Mowery was elected to represent the 31st District in the Senate of Pennsylvania. He served with distinction until his retirement in 2004.

(6) During his time in the Senate, Senator Mowery enriched the lives of thousands as chairperson of the former Public Health and Welfare Committee and vice chairperson of the Education Committee. He also served as vice chairperson of the Legislative Data Processing Committee and as a rank-and-file member of numerous standing committees, including Banking and Insurance, Law and Justice and Labor and Industry.

(7) During and after his public service career, Senator Mowery was a prominent community leader. He supported the establishment of the Camp Hill Lion Foundation to enhance academic, athletic and cultural resources. He was also a supporter of the Whitaker Center for Science and the Arts, the construction of the Grace Milliman Pollock Performing Arts Center and the performing arts, including the Harrisburg Symphony Orchestra. Senator Mowery aided many charities by sponsoring and supporting benefits, galas and community fundraisers.

(8) Senator Mowery's professional achievements, extensive community involvement and the myriad of awards and accolades he received stand as strong testimony to his genuine concern for the well-being of this Commonwealth and the people of the 31st Senatorial District.

(9) By all accounts, Senator Mowery was a loving family man, a respected businessperson and a dedicated and accomplished public servant worthy of emulation for generations to come.

(b) Designation.--The bridge, identified as Bridge Key 13861, carrying State Route 1025 over State Route 1014 in East Pennsboro Township, Cumberland County, is designated as the Senator Hal Mowery Memorial Bridge.

(c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to traffic in both directions on the bridge and both directions on State Route 1014.

Section 3. U.S. Marine Captain Thomas J. Kennedy, Jr., Memorial Bridge.

(a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:

(1) Thomas J. Kennedy, Jr., was born May 18, 1930, in the City of Erie, Erie County, and served the United States in the Marine Corps, where he reached the rank of Captain.

(2) Captain Kennedy was the Senior Battalion Advisor to the Fifth Battalion, Vietnamese Marine Brigade, in the hostile area of Phu An, Quang Ngai Province, Vietnam.

(3) On June 12, 1966, Captain Kennedy was with the Fifth Battalion Command Post when the lead elements were pinned down by heavy enemy fire and the Command Post was destroyed by enemy mortar and rifle fire, killing the Battalion Commander, the Battalion Surgeon, key staff officers and numerous soldiers.

(4) Although suffering multiple shrapnel wounds, Captain Kennedy located a radio and, with his last breath, reported the situation, allowing the battalion to set up a defensive perimeter and repulse repeated enemy attacks.

(5) Despite his mortal wounds, Captain Kennedy prevented enemy forces from overrunning the remaining battalion units and valiantly gave his life protecting the lives of his fellow Marines.

(6) For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity in action, Captain Kennedy was posthumously awarded the Silver Star, the third-highest personal decoration for valor in combat.

(b) Designation.--The bridge, identified as Bridge Key 15986, on that portion of Interstate 79 northbound over West 16th Street in the City of Erie, Erie County, is designated the U.S. Marine Captain Thomas J. Kennedy, Jr., Memorial Bridge.

(c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to traffic in both directions on the bridge.

Section 4. Major Tom Carr Memorial Bridge.

(a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:

(1) Tom M. Carr was born April 17, 1961, in Wilkes-Barre.

(2) Major Carr was a 1979 graduate of Erie Tech Memorial High School.

(3) Major Carr graduated from Clemson University in 1984, earning a Bachelor of Science degree in electrical engineering.

(4) In 1986, Major Carr began a distinguished military career in the United States Air Force as an F-16 fighter pilot.

(5) Major Carr was hand-picked for the Air Force "Elite" Fighter Weapons School, where he was praised for his outstanding leadership as senior ranking officer.

(6) During his service, Major Carr was stationed in Korea, the Persian Gulf, Italy, Bahrain, Bosnia, and Iraq. He flew numerous combat missions, including during Operation Northern Watch in Iraq, and flew over 2,000 fighter sorties.

(7) After leaving active duty, Major Carr became an Air Force reservist assigned to the 93rd Fighter Squadron at Homestead Air Reserve Station in Florida, where he served as the Squadron Weapons Officer.

(8) Major Carr's outstanding professional skill, leadership and ceaseless efforts as an Air Force reservist facilitated two major overseas deployments, three live weapons deployments, one Operational Readiness Inspection and an expeditious conversion from the F-16A to the F-16C aircraft.

(9) On September 12, 1998, Major Carr sacrificed his life in defense of his nation when, during an Air Force attack-training mission, his F-16D jet went down over the Avon Bombing Range in Florida.

(10) Major Carr was posthumously awarded the Meritorious Service Medal by the President of the United States.

(b) Designation.--The bridge identified as Bridge Key 16385 on the portion of State Route 4016, also known as West 38th Street, between Schaper Avenue and Pittsburgh Avenue over Interstate 79 in the City of Erie is designated as the Major Tom Carr Memorial Bridge.

(c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to traffic in both directions on the bridge and to traffic in both directions on Interstate 79 crossing under the bridge.

Section 5. Repeals are as follows:

(1) The General Assembly declares that the repeal under paragraph (2) is necessary to effectuate the designation under section 2 of this act.

(2) The act of June 5, 2020 (P.L.244, No.31), entitled "An act designating the bridge carrying State Route 1025 over U.S. Route 11/15 in East Pennsboro Township, Cumberland County, as the Senator Hal Mowery Memorial Bridge," is repealed.

Senator BAKER. Mr. President, I rise in support of House Bill No. 11, which would name the Robert F. Kile, Sr., Memorial Highway. Today, we come together to recognize the life and service of Robert Francis Kile. The legislation before us will designate a portion of Pennsylvania Route 92 from Apple Tree Road to Rustic Lane in Exeter Township, Luzerne County, as the Robert F. Kile, Sr., Memorial Highway. Bob was tragically killed in June of 2020, leaving his family, friends, and our community distraught and shaken. Bob was a hero who held many different roles of service in our community. He was chair of the Exeter Township Board of Supervisors, a certified emergency medical technician, chief of the Franklin Township Fire Department, ambulance chief of the Dallas Fire and Ambulance, second assistant chief and vice president of the Mt. Zion Bicentennial Fire Company, and second assistant chief of the Harding/Mt. Zion Ambulance Association. In addition to his dedicated work with northeastern Pennsylvania, he served in the United States Army and the Pennsylvania National Guard. Bob also spent many years working for the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation. Prior to that, Bob worked for Kile Konstruktion, R&S Construction, and at the former Nesbitt Hospital.

His hard work and dedication within our community and Luzerne County had a positive impact upon so many people during challenging times of their lives. Friends and colleagues remember him as a fine, kind, and caring individual. While nothing we can do today can change the fact that Bob is no longer with us, we can come together to honor and remember the life of a brave hero whose legacy of committed service will live on. For years to come, as people drive this portion of the highway, they will be inspired not only by their beautiful surroundings but the meaningful tribute that this stretch represents. So, please join me in supporting House Bill No. 11 as our community comes together to remember the upstanding life of the late Robert F. Kile.

PETITIONS AND REMONSTRANCES

The PRESIDENT. Senator Tartaglione has submitted remarks for the record. Without objection, the remarks will be spread upon the record.

(The following prepared remarks were made part of the record at the request of the gentleman from Allegheny, Senator COSTA, on behalf of the gentlewoman from Philadelphia, Senator TARTAGLIONE:)

Mr. President, today marks 5,364 days since the Pennsylvania legislature last raised the minimum wage. That is more than 14 years, and it is far too long.

Mr. President, in honor of Women's History Month, I would like to speak about women in the workforce and the many gender inequities that continue to hinder the progress of working women. This morning, I joined the Honorable First Lady and Second Lady of the Commonwealth, as well as the House Democratic Leader and the distinguished Representative from the 103rd Legislative District in Dauphin County, to launch a new campaign named Women Supporting Working Women.

The goal of this effort is to advocate for legislation and policies that will advance women's equality in the workplace. We hope to achieve this by engaging working women throughout Pennsylvania and by encouraging them to speak out about the gender biases they see.

More than a century after American women gained the right to vote, and almost 50 years after Pennsylvania ratified the Equal Rights Amendment, women still make significantly less money than men for comparable work, and women are still more likely to work in lower-paying jobs with fewer hours. As a result, women are also more likely to hold multiple jobs. According to U.S. Census Bureau data from 2018, women make just \$.82 for every dollar that men make in similar jobs. The differences are even greater for women of color. Black women make just \$.62 on the dollar compared to men. Hispanic women make just \$.54. Native American women make just \$.57. A related problem is the discrepancy between women and men in the types of jobs they hold. Women tend to hold fewer high-paying jobs and an inordinate number of low-wage jobs.

In 2018, the University of Chicago reported that women hold 45 percent of the jobs at the nation's largest publicly held companies, yet they account for just 20 percent of corporate board positions and just 5 percent of the CEOs. In other words, the glass ceiling is very much a reality. Conversely, among low-wage earners, women are very much over-represented. The National Women's Law Center said in 2014 that women make up about two-thirds of the nation's low-wage workforce, even though they make up less than half of all workers. Women with children are more than three times as likely to hold a low-wage job compared to men with children.

Mr. President, raising the minimum wage, as I have proposed in Senate Bill No. 12 and as the Governor has proposed, is one way that we in the General Assembly can promote gender equality in the workforce. Sixty-one percent of the workers that would benefit from a \$15 minimum wage in Pennsylvania are women. As the Commonwealth and the nation commemorate Women's History Month, it is critical to recognize that women's history is not isolated to the past. Women continue to make history today and every day, and we still have much work to do to achieve true equality.

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Fayette, Senator Stefano.

Senator STEFANO. Mr. President, today I, along with Senator Langerholc, pay tribute to the life of Harry Milton Beal from Somerset County. As an elected official, one of our hardest tasks is to find the words to reflect upon the life of one of our constituents, let alone a soldier or veteran. No matter how many times I have done it, I still find it difficult for me to say goodbye to those who did so much for this great country.

Although his family is not with us here today, I want to thank 1st Class Petty Officer Harry Beal for enlisting in the United States Navy. I want to thank him for being one of the first sailors to volunteer for a modern-era Navy SEAL - or Sea, Air, and Land Team, commonly referred to as a Navy "frogman." Former Navy Anti-submarine Warfare Operator Sean Spoons recently wrote: Beal is said to have been the first Navy SEAL. He is not the only SEAL to make such a claim in history, but Harry's claim is unique. He was a plank owner of SEAL Team 2, which is a Navy term for the first crew of a newly commissioned unit, squadron, or ship. Further, Harry's claims go beyond that. His last name, Beal, placed him first in the graduation book of that first SEAL team class. He would have been handed his certificate of graduation before all the others. So, in that sense, he was the first Navy SEAL on the East Coast, and perhaps the West Coast, too, since it lags 3 hours behind the East Coast.

As a member of SEAL Team 2, based out of Little Creek, Virginia, Mr. Beal's 20 years of service took him to South America, Southeast Asia, Europe, and the Caribbean Sea. While as a SEAL, Mr. Beal was part of a team that brought astronaut John

Glenn out of the space capsule after orbiting the earth. Ultimately, Harry served in the United States Navy for 20 years before retiring. I want to thank him for his service as a SEAL instructor, where he specialized in underwater demolition. I want to commend Harry Milton Beal for his service to this Commonwealth, working for the Department of Transportation for 20 years. Harry Beal lived believing in the ideals of this great nation, believing in his mission, and making a difference in the world.

Harry was 90 years young when he passed away this January 26. He was preceded in death by Marjorie, his wife of 67 years; his brothers, William and Bruce; and his sons, Wayne and Mark. He is survived by his sons, Mack and Merle; daughter-in-law, Melissa Beal; 5 grandchildren; and 9 great-grandchildren. While we cannot ease their pain, we can honor and remember Harry, much like we did in 2019 when we passed legislation, now Act 102, naming the bridge along State Route 2047 in Meyersdale Borough over the Flaugherty Creek as the Harry Beal Bridge.

I ask my colleagues to join myself and Senator Langerholc in honoring the life of 1st Class Petty Officer Harry Milton Beal with this condolence resolution.

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Cambria, Senator Langerholc.

Senator LANGERHOLC. Mr. President, I rise to join my colleague, Senator Stefano, to pay tribute to the remarkable life of Harry Milton Beal.

Harry spent his life of service dedicated to our country and Commonwealth. When President John F. Kennedy called for volunteers for a new unit called the SEALs in 1962, despite the global turmoil occurring and major conflicts looming, Harry Beal was the first to answer without hesitation. President Kennedy appointed Harry Beal as America's first United States Navy SEAL in 1962. He is credited with pulling astronaut John Glenn out of the water after his historic space flight. He also served in the United States Navy from 1948 to 1968 as he finished his career in the Navy as a SEAL instructor. Mr. Beal also worked for the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation for 20 years until his retirement in 1990. Harry epitomized what we now refer to as the greatest generation of Americans, and we are forever indebted to him for his bravery and service to this great nation.

He will most definitely be missed by the staff of The Patriot in Somerset County, and my wife, Courtney, being one, especially, who got to know him as she made her rounds there as a nurse practitioner. What always struck me is that she would tell me how he spoke daily of his wife and how he missed her so. I am certain the two are together today.

Mr. President, men like Harry Beal have set a standard that many today strive to achieve. Honor, integrity, strength, and duty are words they live by. Let us never forget how the heroic actions of one individual from Somerset changed this country. I am certain the legacy of Harry Beal will live on to inspire others. Godspeed, Harry. A grateful nation thanks you for your service.

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Schuylkill, Senator Argall.

Senator ARGALL. Mr. President, as the new chairman of the Committee on State Government, I have been asked to offer a few words in support of Sunshine Week, which we are all celebrating from March 14 to 20. Imagine, if you will, what the reac-

tion would be if State Senators and Representatives today voted in secret to approve Governor Wolf's multibillion dollar tax increase and spending increases. Or, if mayors, school directors, county commissioners, township supervisors, city and borough council members debated and voted, again, in total secret, to spend millions of taxpayer dollars on new buildings and new programs all across Pennsylvania with absolutely zero public notice. The public would be justifiably outraged.

Now, while this may seem like the Dark Ages, it was not that long ago that debates and votes did take place in the dark every day with no one from the public or the media in the room, and the public had no option other than to complain. In those days, many State and local government meetings across Pennsylvania were closed to the public and important decisions were made with no public input. One of the most important Pennsylvania laws that improved transparency is the Sunshine Act, which we celebrate this week, first passed in 1986. The Sunshine Act insures the public's right to witness decisions being made on their behalf that use public taxpayer funds.

Before this law, meetings could be, and often were, held far from the view of the public. But after its passage, all officials' actions and meetings held for the purpose of making a decision needed to take place in a public meeting. Today, every meeting of the Senate and House standing committees is required to be publicized in advance. Voting Sessions on the floor of the Senate and the House are televised all across the State every day from Erie to Philadelphia. Senators and Representatives who served in the 1950s or 1960s could never have imagined such scrutiny.

Over the years, our Sunshine Act was strengthened to allow for even greater transparency. In 1993, local governments were required to allow the public to make comments. In 1998, local governments were required to allow public comment before taking official action at a public meeting. In 2011, penalties were increased for officials who participated in a meeting in violation of the Sunshine Act.

Another important law that increased transparency is the Right to Know Law, which requires State and local governments to make public records accessible by establishing a baseline expectation that all State records should be made public, and individual agencies should have to prove why any requested record should not be made public. The law provides for a fair, simple, and no-cost method to appeal when a request is denied. If this last year of living under the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions has taught us anything, remember this: a free society can only exist as long as its institutions remain free and transparent to the public. We have made considerable progress in the last 40 years to let the sunshine in, but as we have seen within the last 12 months, there is still much work to be done.

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Lancaster, Senator Martin.

Senator MARTIN. Mr. President, I rise today to draw attention to an important movement happening across our Commonwealth, and that is the movement to sanction girls' wrestling as an official sport here in Pennsylvania. As I mentioned in my Senate Resolution No. 37, even though we here in Pennsylvania have a very rich connection to wrestling, we still are only 1 of 21 States that does not officially recognize girls' teams. Instead, our girls have to play with their male counterparts, which, in some cases, has discouraged participation in the sport.

In an effort to address this and, ultimately, encourage more young women to join the sport, the PIAA was petitioned to officially sanction the sport, and the PIAA came back with a goal. They said if 100 teams could be created across our Commonwealth, then they would officially sanction the sport and create a playoff tournament for those outstanding young athletes. That challenge was accepted, and I am proud to say that it was first accepted by my district's very own J.P. McCaskey High School. Since then, an additional eight other teams were created, giving us a total of nine in the past year alone, with more to come, thanks to the SanctionPA movement.

Mr. President, girls' wrestling has been the fastest-growing sport in America over the last 5 years. In Pennsylvania alone, there are girls on roughly 130 different teams across each of the 12 PIAA districts, and this movement has earned the support of national wrestling groups across the country. That is why I stand here echoing the message of Senate Resolution No. 37 and asking my colleagues to join me in recognizing the efforts of these female athletes, the efforts of the SanctionPA movement, and to recognize March 21 as Girls' Wrestling Day here in Pennsylvania.

Mr. President, wrestling has been a powerful influence on my own life. It has taught me so many valuable lessons and given me so many opportunities. I have a tremendous amount of great memories from my athletic careers; however, standing at the podium in Hershey receiving a gold medal is one of the fondest memories of my life and one of the greatest influencers. Our young girls deserve that same opportunity.
