On June 26, 1989, the revised Public Official and Employee Ethics Law was enacted which re-authorized the State Ethics Commission. The State Ethics Commission is responsible for issuing various types of rulings on matters within its mandated jurisdiction. Pursuant to the law, the Commission is mandated to forward, quarterly, a copy of every Opinion, Advice of Counsel, and Order issued to one law library in each county, one public library in each county, the State Library, the State Senate Library, each authority appointing a Commission member, the Pennsylvania Association of County Commissioners, the Pennsylvania Association of Boroughs, the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors, the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Commissioners, the Pennsylvania State School Boards Association, and the Pennsylvania League of Cities. Your agency is either specifically identified in the above requirement or has been selected as a library to which this mailing will be made pursuant to the above authority. As such, enclosed please find decisions of the State Ethics Commission from October 1, 2022, to December 31, 2022. Due to budgetary restraints, a CD containing said rulings will replace paper copies that were previously sent.

For your information, the Commission generally issues these types of decisions as follows:

Commission Opinions - Opinions are advisory rulings issued by the State Ethics Commission regarding the duties and responsibilities of public officials and employees under the Public Official and Employee Ethics Law. Opinions are catalogued by year of issuance followed by the sequential number of the opinion during that year. As such, opinions relating to 2022 will begin with the number 22-001 and proceed there from as decisions are rendered.

Advice of Counsel - The Commission's Chief Counsel is authorized to issue similar advisory letters. Such letters are issued generally when there is prior precedent for counsel to rely upon in issuing a decision or when the provisions of the State Ethics Act directly provide the answer to the question posed. Advice of Counsel letters are numbered with the year and a 500 series number that progresses in order therefrom as rulings are issued. If more than 100 such letters are issued, a 600 series number will then be used.

Orders - Commission orders are issued at the end of an investigation and are determinations as to whether or not there has been a violation of the State Ethics Act. Commission orders are categorized numerically from the date of the first order in 1979. That is, the first Order issued was Order No. 1. All orders proceed there from.

It is recommended that Opinions, Advices of Counsel and Orders be maintained separately (in numerical order) so as to afford better retrievability.

The enclosed items are being forwarded for retention, cataloging and for the purpose of being publicly available for review by citizens of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania who may have an interest therein. Honoring the life and achievements of former Attorney General William C. Sennett and expressing condolences on his passing.

WHEREAS, William C. Sennett was born June 1, 1930, the son of B. Walker Sennett and Rosanna Cooney Sennett, in Erie; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Sennett graduated from Cathedral Preparatory School in Erie in 1948 and was subsequently inducted into the Cathedral Preparatory School Hall of Fame in 2002; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Sennett graduated cum laude from Holy Cross College in 1952 and Georgetown Law School, where he was an editor of the Georgetown Law Review; and

WHEREAS, Following his graduation from Georgetown Law School in 1955, Mr. Sennett clerked in Washington, DC, in the United States Court of Appeals, District of Columbia Circuit, for the Honorable John A. Danaher, Judge; and

WHEREAS, After his clerkship, Mr. Sennett practiced law in Erie for over 50 years with his father, B. Walker Sennett, and with Knox McLaughlin Gornall & Sennett, where he was president from 1985 to 1994; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Sennett practiced in the areas of government, municipal law and industrial and corporate finance, including acting as bond counsel on numerous bond issues throughout the northwestern region of this Commonwealth and acting as solicitor for the Erie Sewer Authority, Erie-Western Pennsylvania Port Authority, North East School District, the Millcreek Township Water Authority and the Automotive Association of Erie County; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Sennett was a member of the National Association of Bond Lawyers, and also a founder of the Pennsylvania Association of Bond Lawyers, for which he served on the board of directors and as president from 1989 to 1990; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Sennett served as the youngest Attorney General in the history of this Commonwealth in the administration of Governor Raymond P. Shafer from 1967 to 1970, where he represented this Commonwealth before the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania and the United States Supreme Court in numerous cases; and

WHEREAS, In 1979, Mr. Sennett was appointed to the Pennsylvania Appellate Court Nominating Commission; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Sennett was a fellow of the American Bar Foundation and also a member of the Erie County Bar Association, where he was recognized as the chancellor; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Sennett served as a trustee of Mercyhurst University for four decades, including 13 years as chairman; and

WHEREAS, In recognition of this commitment, Mr. Sennett was granted trustee emeritus status in 2014, and the Sennett Board Room in the Hammermill Library was named in his honor; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Sennett was also a member of the board of trustees at the Jefferson Educational Society; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Sennett served in various lay positions at St. George Church and Parish in Erie from the 1960s to the 1990s; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Sennett passed away on January 23, 2023, at 92 years of age, while surrounded by family in Erie; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Sennett is survived by his wife Marlene L. Braham and his six children, William Sennett, Timothy Sennett, Patrick Sennett, Mark Sennett, Kathleen Broadbent and Carolyn Sennett, as well as numerous grandchildren, nieces and nephews; therefore be it

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Erie, Senator Laughlin.

Senator LAUGHLIN. Mr. President, former Pennsylvania Attorney General and Erie native son William Sennett passed away on January 23 at the age of 92. Born June 1, 1930, William Sennett became the youngest serving State Attorney General in 1967 as part of the administration of Governor Raymond P. Shafer--at that time, it was an appointed office. He held that position until 1970, and during that time represented the Commonwealth before both the Supreme Courts of Pennsylvania and the United States in numerous cases.

Before and after his time as State Attorney General, William Sennett practiced law in the areas of government, municipal law, and industrial and corporate finance. After clerking in the U.S. Court of Appeals following his graduation from Georgetown Law School in 1955, he practiced law in Erie for over 50 years with his father, Walker Sennett, and with Knox McLaughlin Gornall & Sennett, where he was president from 1985 to 1994. In 1979, he was appointed to the Pennsylvania Appellate Court Nominating Commission, and he was a fellow of the American Bar Foundation. He was also a member of the Erie County Bar Association and was recognized as the chancellor of the bar.

His legal work included acting as bond counsel on numerous bond issues throughout northwestern Pennsylvania. He served as solicitor for the Erie Sewer Authority, Erie Western Pennsylvania Port Authority, the North East School District, Millcreek Township Water Authority, and the Automotive Association of Erie County. He was a member of the National Association of Bond Lawyers and the founder of the Pennsylvania Association of Bond Lawyers, serving on the association's board of directors, including as president from 1989 to 1990.

Additionally, William Sennett served as a trustee of Erie's Mercyhurst University for four decades, including 13 years as chairman. In recognition of his commitment, he was granted trustee emeritus status in 2014, and the Sennett Board Room in the Hammermill Library was named in his honor. He also was a member of the board of trustees at the Jefferson Educational Society, and he served in various lay positions at Erie's St. George Church and Parish in the 1960s through the 1990s.

Beyond his professional and political life, he had a wide range of interests including gardening, traveling, Civil War history, collecting antiques, and photography. He was a scholar, mentor, leader, and most importantly, husband, father, and grandfather. He was preceded by his first wife and mother of his children, Pauline Wuenschel Sennett, whom he married in 1954 and who died in 2005. He is survived by his current wife, Marlene Braham; and his six children, William, Timothy, Patrick, Mark, Kathleen, and Carolyn; and eight grandchildren, Christopher, Caryn, Katie, Emily, Alison, Morgan, Nora, and Jamie. William Sennett was highly respected for not only his legal experience and lifelong record of achievement, but also for his considerate, humble, and generous nature. It was truly an honor to know him throughout his many accomplishments, and he will be deeply missed. Always a gentleman, he inspired others to live by his example.

Honoring the life and service of McKeesport Police Officer Sean L. Sluganski.

WHEREAS, McKeesport Police Officer Sean L. Sluganski was shot and killed in the line of duty on February 6, 2023; and

WHEREAS, Officer Sluganski was 32 years of age and is remembered for his sincere passion for serving the public and his positivity; and

WHEREAS, Officer Sluganski sadly leaves behind a fiancée, their young daughter, his mother, two sisters, nieces, aunts, uncles and two dogs; and

WHEREAS, Officer Sluganski was a graduate of Baldwin-Whitehall School District and a hockey player; and

WHEREAS, Officer Sluganski graduated with a bachelor's degree from PennWest California; and

WHEREAS, Officer Sluganski served with the McKeesport Police Department for two years and previously worked in Charleroi and Whitaker; and

WHEREAS, His PennWest California professor and Charleroi Police Officer, Dr. Mike Hummel, said Officer Sluganski was a good police officer with a deep desire to use his education to work with the public better and defuse situations with a kind heart; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Hummel said, "You won't be able to replace a guy of that caliber, of that quality"; and

WHEREAS, McKeesport Mayor Michael Cherepko offered a statement: "On Tuesday, February 14, we said goodbye to Officer Sluganski. Law enforcement agencies, fire departments, emergency medical services, our city residents, and supporters from communities far and wide, lined McKeesport's streets in support of Officer Sluganski, his family, and his brothers and sisters in the McKeesport Police Department who laid him to rest"; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Cherepko recognized that "Officer Sluganski loved serving this city and being a part of our community"; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Cherepko declared, "The members of the Sluganski family are now honorary McKeesporters, by their own description; they have McKeesport in their hearts, just as we have them in ours"; and

WHEREAS, There has been an outpouring of support through vigils and memorials as Officer Sluganski's family, friends and fellow officers mourn the loss of a beloved member of their community; and

WHEREAS, Officer Sluganski made the ultimate sacrifice protecting his community and the residents of this Commonwealth; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Senate honor the life and service of McKeesport Police Officer Sean L. Sluganski; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Senate extend condolences to the family, friends, loved ones and the entire community as they honor the life and sacrifice of Officer Sean L. Sluganski.

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Allegheny, Senator Brewster.

Senator BREWSTER. Mr. President, the event of February 6 was not the first experience I have had in my district. Sean was the fourth officer who was killed in the line of duty under my watch as a councilman and also as a Senator. This particular event, Sean was about 1 minute from my house and about 1 minute from our Honorable Lieutenant Governor's home. So, we share the grief with the family. It is a route that I take to Monroeville every day. Had I been 45 minutes later, I would have been there possibly. Who knows what? Maybe to help. Without getting into the details because the case is pending, it was an unusual event, a violent event. Another officer, Chuck Thomas--McKeesport officer--was shot and is healing as we speak, and it took a third officer to come upon the scene to make the arrest. And for those of you who have gone to any of these events, it is a stark reminder of how difficult and dangerous it is to be in law enforcement. It is a reminder why we have difficulty getting policemen and women to our communities. Many of you have the same problem that I have: communities just cannot get law enforcement anymore. These events do not help that cause, and what is even worse is the grief it leaves on the family and the community. A 12-hour event at the burial brought cars from every State, Canada. It brought elected officials from every community. The procession was close to 10 miles long, and to see the people line the streets of multiple communities who did not know Sean was beyond impressive. But as we stood at the cemetery at the final closing, I could not help looking at the mother and her grief, the fiancée and her grief. And when you looked at the young baby knowing that that child will never see her father, it is a reminder how fragile life can be.

But I will tell you, the family was beyond thankful for the showing. They were beyond thankful for those folks who came to the funeral home. Our Lieutenant Governor, our Governor attended, and many, many other elected officials, friends, police departments from all over. And as we rode through the procession--and I think it was about 10 different communities, might have been more--to see young children, seniors, lining the streets was something that you do not ever forget. And having gone through this in New Kensington with Officer Shaw and Lower Burrell with Officer Kotecki, similar receptions were held. And I guess, on behalf of the family, the most important thing that I think they want to express is that Sean entered the law enforcement because he wanted to be a law enforcement officer, and in his honor, we should do everything in this room and across the building to ensure that these kinds of things do not happen. Now, I do not have the answer, but we may have the answer. And I say that because we are starting a new Session, and we need to be mindful: this is not political. This is about doing the right thing and helping everybody. And if we sit back and hope that these things will not happen again, that would be a poor choice.

So, on behalf of Sean's family and his friends and McKeesport Police Department, the people of McKeesport and Baldwin, where he went to high school, I want to ask you in his memory to think about what we have talked about today in the resolution to ensure that none of us have to stand here and again, in the near future, an experience such as this. So, thank you, Mr. President, and I would ask for a moment of silence at your pleasure.

The PRESIDENT. Thank you, Senator. Before we vote on this condolence resolution, will the Members, as well as the staff and guests, please rise for a moment of silence.

[Whereupon, the Senate en bloc stood in a moment of silence in solemn respect to the memory of Officer SEAN L. SLUGANSKI.]

And the question recurring,

Will the Senate adopt the resolution?

A voice vote having been taken, the question was determined in the affirmative.

The PRESIDENT. The resolution is unanimously adopted.

SPECIAL ORDER OF BUSINESS LINCOLN DAY ADDRESS

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentlewoman from Montgomery, Senator Pennycuick.

Senator PENNYCUICK. Mr. President, it is an honor to present the annual Lincoln Day Address. More has been written and spoken about Abraham Lincoln than perhaps any other President, or any politician for that matter. I believe we can still find wisdom in his words and deeds to help us guide us in our work in 2023. Most know that Lincoln lost his first run for the legislature. He ran in 1832 as a Whig. He was 23 years old and an outspoken advocate of a strong infrastructure of roads, canals, and harbors to create opportunities for his rural district to expand their markets. He came in 8th in a field of 13 candidates. His style was different. He spoke in a high-pitched voice that became his trademark; but when he spoke, he exuded thoughtfulness and common sense. He was a master storyteller and could use this talent to demonstrate the fallacy of an opponent's position without resorting to ridicule or harsh criticism.

In 1834, he ran again, and this time he won. He served four terms in the Illinois legislature. At the time Lincoln entered the statehouse, party lines were beginning to solidify nationally, but at the county level, party lines blurred. Personal magnanimous attitude and tactical maneuvering were most likely to produce winning candidates, and Lincoln exercised both. He was soon recognized as a master at drafting bills for others and forging proposals that could garner support from both sides of the aisle. Carl Sandburg, the poet and biographer, said that evolving conditions of rural living intensified Lincoln's natural bent for philosophical thinking. Popular argument and discussion were the backbones of grassroots democracy, and he seemed made for such times. People came together in their homes and around potbellied stoves in stores such as Lincoln and Berry--in which Lincoln was, for a short period of time, a partner--and in legislative bodies in mutual respect to voice their opinions. Lincoln listened to those people and respected them. In those simpler times, there was no PCN, no internet, and no social media. While public debates were vigorous and sometimes even violent, people were more removed from the seats of government. There were no public opinion polls.

Legislators could, if they chose, go about their business in relative obscurity, and for a while, Lincoln did. He was sometimes a silent observer in the proceedings, but he was exceptionally faithful in his attendance. He never stopped talking to the people or listening to them.

Today, we are called upon daily to communicate our feelings, our reasoning, and our opinions to the people we represent. It is critical that the people know that we will listen to their views, and when we disagree, we must explain our reasoning. That is especially important now, when the fault lines seem so deep. Of course, they are nothing like Lincoln faced. I sit in this beautiful Chamber and look every day at the mural of Lincoln giving his Gettysburg Address. His head is bent, and you can feel the weight of his sadness. It is the low point in the Civil War, but still, the weather-beaten faces of the soldiers and the hopeful faces of the women and children look to Lincoln for reassurance that the sacrifices are worth it and life will be better. The words around the painting say, "it is rather [sic] for us the living, [rather], to be dedicated to the unfinished work." The people of this great Commonwealth have placed their trust in the people sitting in this Chamber. Let us rededicate ourselves to the unfinished work of today and to honor Abe Lincoln, the legislator and consensus builder.

Thank you, Mr. President.

PETITIONS AND REMONSTRANCES

The PRESIDENT pro tempore. The Chair recognizes the gentlewoman from Philadelphia, Senator Tartaglione.

Senator TARTAGLIONE. Madam President, I rise because today marks 6,077 days since this Commonwealth's legislature last passed an increase in our minimum wage. This year, 23 States

and Washington, DC, raised their minimum wages in January; 4 more States are scheduled to raise their minimum wage later this year. The new wages range anywhere from \$9.95 per hour in Montana, to \$16.10 an hour in DC. As we all know, Madam President, unfortunately, our minimum wage here in Pennsylvania has not moved since the Federal government raised the minimum wage to \$7.25 more than a decade and a half ago. But as we continue to allow a failure of government in action to dictate the wages our lowest earners make, we have new tools to show just how much disparity exists between our minimum wage and a livable wage across Pennsylvania.

The PRESIDENT (Lieutenant Governor Austin A. Davis) in the Chair.

Recently, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, MIT, released its living wage calculator, which takes a market-based approach that draws upon geographically-specific expenditure data related to a family's likely minimum food, childcare, health insurance, housing, transportation, and other basic necessities like clothing and personal care items. According to their numbers for the entire State of Pennsylvania, a single adult with no children's living wage is \$16.41 an hour. Mr. President, if you just add one child to a single working adult's household, the living wage more than doubles to \$34.45 an hour. And the numbers do not begin to reflect our Commonwealth's minimum wage even as you add more adults to the household. If you have two adults in the household with one working and zero children, the living wage for that worker is \$26.40. If you add one child to that two adults, one worker household living wage, according to MIT, jumps to \$32.83 an hour. Even if you have a household with two adult workers, the living wage with zero children is \$13.20 per hour and jumps to \$19.23 per worker when you add one child into the mix. When you look at cities around Pennsylvania like Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Allentown, and State College, what a worker needs to earn to make a minimum living wage can rise as much as a few dollars an hour in each category. Having this information is great, Mr. President, but what is more important is that we use it to guide our decision-making processes here in Harrisburg. We can see clear as day, our poverty-level wages do not work for our lowest-wage earners. We need to step up and provide relief for Pennsylvanians who are failing to survive off the embarrassingly low wages we subject our workers to. That is why I introduced legislation to raise Pennsylvania's minimum wage. We need to act quickly and decisively to raise Pennsylvania's minimum wage.

Senator SCHWANK. Mr. President, I am here today to talk about Pennsylvania 2-1-1 Day. Too often, we hear from constituents who are facing a variety of personal, financial, and medical crises to which we do not always have a solution. Luckily, we

have a resource to turn to: PA 211. Thanks to the tireless work and dedication to our communities, earlier this month, I introduced a resolution recognizing February 11, 2023, as 2-1-1 Day in Pennsylvania. For several years, PA 211 has provided high-quality, courteous, humane, and professional service to Pennsylvanians in their most desperate moments of need. Thanks to our investments, the most recent being a onetime \$4 million investment in this vital database and hotline, every person in the Commonwealth can dial the 3-digit number for help locating support for their health and human service needs. In addition to voice services, PA 211 is also available statewide by text and web search 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Supported and promoted by our local United Ways across the Commonwealth, PA 211 specialists are committed to their work and particularly committed to the six E's: excellent, efficient, everywhere, every day, every way, engagement. These highly-trained individuals connect people with the information and resources they need to build healthy and safe communities. As a proud member of the Pennsylvania State United Way board, Mr. President, I am honored to be able to make people aware of PA 211, and I urge my colleagues, both here in the Senate and the House, as well as our constituents, people who are working in public service, anyone who sees someone in need and does not know where to turn: tell them about PA 211. Thank you very much.

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Delaware, Senator Kearney.

Senator KEARNEY. Mr. President, I rise today because our body can finally bring justice for survivors of childhood sexual assault through final passage of both the constitutional and legislative 2-year windows for survivors of childhood sexual assault to bring civil suits against their attackers. Last week, the House passed both versions of the 2-year window in their Special Session, and yet, we are here today taking no action on this issue and with no sense of when this body will vote on these pieces of legislation. This is senseless and heartless, Mr. President.

When I was first elected to the Senate, I was elected in part because of the failure of the legislature to take action on this issue. And yet here I am--here we are--another 4 years later, still talking about the same issue. We need to stop the partisan tactics around the statutory window. Yesterday was not the time, today is not the time. We must move the statutory issue forward. We must provide justice for victims. We had the opportunity last Session to pass House Bill No. 951 to provide for a legislative fix, but instead it sat on our Calendar for 2 years with no vote; 2 years. We can provide justice now. We can pass the legislative fix. We have seen other States take this action. There is no reason to wait. The legal consensus has been that the legislature has the authority to open a retroactive window, and yet, here we are time and time again listening to the opposition delaying and delaying and denying justice for survivors and putting partisan interest over the interest of victims. Let us turn this tragedy around. Let us do the right thing. Let us reopen the Special Session and vote on these pieces of legislation and end this dark chapter in our history.

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Bucks, Senator Santarsiero.

Senator SANTARSIERO. Mr. President, I rise today to recognize February 27 through March 5, 2023, as Eating Disorders Awareness Week in Pennsylvania. The goal of Eating Disorders

Awareness Week is to shine a spotlight on eating disorders by educating the public, spreading a message of hope, and putting life-saving resources into the hands of those in need. Eating disorders exist across the broad spectrum of age, race, ethnicity, gender, and socio economics and are marred by misunderstandings and misconceptions.

Today, we recognize an issue that has escaped our attention for far too long. In the United States, 20 million women and 10 million men suffer from a clinically-significant eating disorder at some point in their lives. In 2023, the theme of Eating Disorders Awareness Week is "It's Time for Change," which focuses on the message that now is the time for more. More equity, inclusion, access, outreach, early intervention, education, representation, advocacy, and awareness. Eating Disorders Awareness Week is a collaborative effort consisting of eating disorders organizations; volunteers, including eating disorder professionals, healthcare providers, students, educators, social workers, and individuals committed to raising awareness of the dangers surrounding eating disorders and the need for early intervention and treatment. Mr. President, it is my hope that Eating Disorders Awareness Week will encourage people to share their stories and experiences with disordered eating and body image struggles and highlight the importance of screenings for early detection and interventions. I ask the Members of our Senate to reflect on the challenges of those with eating disorders during this week, as we move forward, hopefully, with meaningful legislation to follow this resolution.

Thank you, Mr. President. Mr. President, if I may, I would like to speak on a separate topic.

The PRESIDENT. The Chair recognizes, for a second time, the gentleman from Bucks, Senator Santarsiero.

Senator SANTARSIERO. Mr. President, to echo the comments of my colleague and friend, the gentleman from Delaware County, we are now well past the time when the victims of child sex abuse should have had access to justice and their day in court. As the gentleman noted, there are two ways that we can do this. We can pass House Bill No. 2, which would give immediate statutory relief that the Governor would sign and make it possible for these individuals to go to court right away. Alternatively, if the Majority party continues to hold the view that we do not share, that that route is unconstitutional under our State law, we could pass House Bill No. 1, which is a proposed amendment to the State Constitution in exactly the same form as passed this Chamber in the last Session. I want to underscore that last point, Mr. President, that House Bill No. 1 is in exactly the same form as the proposed amendment that passed this Session, that passed this legislature, and this Senate in particular, in the last Session. Why is that significant? Because if we are going to confine ourselves to amending the State Constitution, the best way to be able to address that issue is to pass House Bill No. 1.

The Senate bill that was sent to the House back in January, which has two other issues conflated in it that have nothing to do with a 2-year statutory lookback, will not move in the House. And it will not move in the House for a good reason: the reasons that we stated when we discussed it and debated it here on the floor of the Senate. One, the issue that deals with voter ID is written in so vague and ambiguous a manner, that even the authors of the legislation are unable to describe its meaning. And two, the issue that deals with undoing, or enabling the legislature to undo, legally-enacted regulatory rules that the executive branch

promulgates under enabling legislation is a clear overreach of our separation of powers here in Pennsylvania.

So, that being the case, and since we have passed the amendment merely on the issue of the statute of limitations and the 2-year lookback previously in this Senate, we should do the same thing again, and we should do it in all without any further delay. We can do it this week. We can do it next week. We have 2 Session weeks ahead of us without the need for a Special Session. There is no reason, Mr. President, that we are still waiting to pass this legislation. But there is a crying need by the victims to get this done. These victims who have waited far too long. These victims, who have been told time and time again that the day for finally obtaining justice is at hand, only to have their hopes dashed. It is time, Mr. President, that all of us here in the State Senate look ourselves in the mirror and look at the faces of those victims and say with one clear voice that we are with you, and we are giving you this chance to open wide that door, to have access to the courts, and ultimately to the justice that has been denied them for far too many years.
