Dear Governor Rendell:

As state representative for the 45th Legislative District, I am writing to you on behalf of the residents of Robinson Township.

Robinson Township is a prosperous community that offers its citizens a quality of life that has attracted many new residents and businesses over the past decade. Its dynamic growth is envied by other communities struggling to keep pace with the level of service and amenities offered to the township residents.

But recent developments regarding a high speed transportation system known as Maglev threatens this community with an uncertain future and a grave threat to the quality of life of its citizens.

Magley will split Robinson Township in two with disastrous results for property values and undermined environmental problems for the Township.

Attempts to pacify the residents by proponents of Magley have not been generally well received. I, personally, am disappointed with the role of the Port Authority of Allegheny County in this project. From my perspective they seem to have undertaken the role of advocate for Maglev rather than an independent objective participant in the deliberative process prescribed by the Federal Railroad Administration.

Based on their role in this matter, I do not feel that comprehensive and detailed information was shared with township officials and citizens that truly justified the rejection of the alternate routes.
