## **Gaming Board Rehabilitation Package**

**HB 2001** Requires that at least one Gubernatorial appointee to the Board must possess at least 10 years of state or federal law enforcement employment experience; and at least one Gubernatorial appointee to the Board must possess at least 10 years of private business or finance employment experience. **Rep. Paul Clymer** 

**HB 2002** Creates specific statutory authority vesting the Department of the Auditor General with the responsibility for annual auditing and inspecting of the PGCB to help insure adherence to the obligations of the Gaming Act. **Rep. Gary Day** 

**HB 2003** Prohibits any appointee, designee or employee of the PGCB, the Bureau of Investigations and Enforcement or the Office of Enforcement Counsel from making a false entry or false alteration of any document belonging to the PGCB or the department for information or record; making or presenting any document that is known to be false; or intentionally or unlawfully destroying, concealing or otherwise impairing the verity or availability of any document. **Rep. Curt Schroder** 

**HB 2004** Prohibits any person from serving as a member of the Board who was an applicant for or holder of a Pennsylvania slot machine license. **Rep. Randy Vulakovich** 

**HB 2005** Requires that the Board post on the PGCB website all contracts, including contracts for legal work. This includes all aspects of the process including initial RFP, the contract applicants, and the final awardee of the contract. **Rep. Paul Clymer** 

**HB 2006** Creates regulatory clarity about the role and function of BIE; clarifies that all information uncovered by BIE about a vendor or applicant must be contained in their report to the Board. **Rep. Mike Vereb** 

**HB 2007** Requires the Board to submit an annual report listing the number of executive sessions conducted by the Board, including an agenda for each executive session. **Rep. Karen Boback** 

**HB 2008** Prohibits members of the Board from meeting in executive session for the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations involving slot machine license applications, except for the limited circumstance of consideration of actual confidential information. **Rep. Rosemarie Swanger** 

**HB 2009** Requires the Board to list on the PGCB website a description of all Right-to-Know requests, the number approved, the number rejected, the number of appeals filed as a result of the Board's rejection, and the outcome of each appeal. **Rep. John Lawrence** 

**HB 2010** Prohibits any PGCB employee from obtaining employment with a gaming entity or any firm that represents or conducts business with any gaming entity for 2 years from the date of termination of employment. **Rep. Paul Clymer** 

**HB 2011** Prohibits the following from becoming a PGCB board member: the Governor, Auditor General, Attorney General, and state legislator for a period of 2 years following the end of their term; and prohibits the following from becoming a PGCB board member: senior management of any licensee (current and any that have held a license within the past 4 years) for a period of 2 years following termination of employment. **Rep. Gary Day** 

**HB 2012** Prohibits the following from holding slot license(s): any PGCB Board member, PGCB employee, Governor, Auditor General, Attorney General, and state legislator for a period of 2 years following end of term or employment; and prohibits the following from obtaining employment with a gaming entity or firm which represents a gaming entity: any PGCB Board member, PGCB employee, Governor, Auditor General, Attorney General, and/ state legislator for a period of 2 years from the date of termination of employment. **Rep. Gary Day** 

**HB 2013** Prohibits any vendor or licensee from obtaining a contract or commencing work at a casino without the completion of a background investigation. **Rep. Mike Vereb** 

**HB 2014** Establishes and makes public the budgetary guidelines for the PGCB, including the establishment of a salary matrix for all employees and Board members, and requires publication on the PGCB website. **Rep. George Dunbar**
