




Office of Outdoor Recreation

- Outdoor recreation adds \$14 billion of value to PA annually and directly supports 152,000 jobs
- In 2022, DCNR hired Nathan Reigner as the first PA Director of Outdoor Recreation
- Proposed budget includes funding to create PA Office of Outdoor Recreation
 - 18 other states have created offices—PA would be largest state with office
- Office would unite, strengthen, and grow outdoor rec economy







Community Grants





Grants Overview

- Huge year for C2P2 grants in 2022: \$92 million for 335 projects
 - 162 community park projects
 - 43 trail projects
 - Preservation of 7,000+ acres of open space
- \$11.8 million granted for forest buffers and street trees
- Grants leverage local match dollars
- Regional advisors across the state can help grant applicants







Priority Communities Analysis

- Groundbreaking data analysis to identify communities of need, advancing goal of ensuring every Pennsylvanian lives within 10 minutes of park or trail
- Examines entire state at census block group level
- Layers park and trail access with demographic, health, socioeconomic, and other factors
- Communities of need located in urban and rural areas





State Parks and Forests

- 124 state parks and 2.2 million acres of state forests
- 37.9 million state park visits in 2022 compared to 42.2 million in 2021
 - 2022 totals were .1% higher than average of 2017-2019
- Overnight reservations remain much higher than before pandemic
