## DEEDS - DEFECTIVE ACKNOWLEDGMENT - VALIDATION Act of Apr. 15, 1851, P.L. 661, No. 354 AN ACT

C1. 68

To incorporate the Meadville Cemetery, relative to the election of a justice of the peace in Womelsdorff, Berks county, repealing part of the ninth section of an act passed April eight, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, regulating election districts, and relating to the election of supervisors and borough officers, to deeds defectively acknowledged or proved out of this State for lands therein, and relative to the vacating of a street in Monongahela city.

Section 10. Deeds executed without the State, defectively acknowledged, but recorded thirty years

All the deeds and conveyances in due forms for lands within this State, which purport to have been executed and acknowledged or proved without the limits of this State, and which have been recorded in any county of this State in which any part of the lands conveyed lie for a period of thirty years previous to the passage of this act, notwithstanding such deeds and conveyances shall not have been acknowledged or proved at the time they may have respectively been recorded according to the requirements of the then existing laws of this Commonwealth in relation to the recording of deeds, shall be received and admitted in evidence in like manner and with effect as if the same had been duly acknowledged or proved at the time of their being respectively executed, or previous to their being recorded. 1851, April 15, P.L. 661, Sec. 10.
