REGULATING THE IMPORTING OF CORN AND SALT Act of Apr. 12, 1867, P.L. 74, No. 53 A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act regulating the measurement of corn and salt imported into the port of Philadelphia, approved the twenty-second day of September, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-five.

Section 1. Account of grain weighed to be kept

The head measurer and his deputies, when weighing grain, shall keep true and accurate accounts of the same, and furnish to buyer and seller a certificate of the weight; and whenever their services may be required by buyer or seller, to weigh grain, the charges therefor shall be no greater than for measuring; and for all grain that a deputy may either measure or weigh, he shall make return to the head measurer. 1867, April 12, P.L. 74, Sec. 1.
