REPORT OF STATE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE Act of May 24, 1878, P.L. 132, No. 165 AN ACT

To authorize the printing and binding of the reports of the state board of agriculture, and other state agricultural reports.

Section 1. Contents of report

There (shall) be published annually hereafter thirty-one thousand five hundred and ten copies of a work entitled the , Agriculture of Pennsylvania," which shall contain the annual reports of the State Board of Agriculture, the State Agricultural Society, the State Dairyman's Association, the State Fruit Growers' Association, and the State College. 1878, May 24, P.L. 132, Sec. 1.

Section 2. Apportionment of matter of report

The matter for said volume shall be proportioned to the several organizations, as follows: to the state board of agriculture, two hundred and fifty pages; to the state agricultural society, two hundred pages; to the state dairyman's association, one hundred pages; to the state fruit grower's association, eighty pages, and to the state college twenty pages, the whole volume not to contain more than six hundred and fifty pages: provided, that each organization shall compile and arrange its own matter, and that no matter shall be used by either which is not original and legitimate to the organization offering the same. 1878, May 24, P.L.132, Sec. 2.

Section 3. Appropriation for compilation

For the compilation, arranging and indexing of said matter the sum of seven hundred and thirty dollars is hereby annually appropriated, to be paid out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, upon the presentation of the receipt of the superintendent of public printing and binding and that all the matter has been delivered to him; said sums to be divided as follows: To the State Agricultural Society, two hundred and fifty dollars; to the state dairyman's association, three hundred and fifty dollars, and to the state fruit growers' association, one hundred and thirty dollars; and that each organization shall deliver the whole of its report in manuscript to the superintendent of public printing on or before the first day of November of each year. 1878, May 24, P.L. 132, Sec. 3.

Section 4. Quarterly reports

The state board is hereby authorized to publish, in pamphlet form, quarterly reports of not more than one hundred and fifty pages, and not more than six thousand copies, of which two thousand shall be for the use of the members of the senate, three thousand copies for the use of the members of the house of representatives, and one thousand copies for the use of the state board. 1878, May 24, P.L.132, Sec. 4; 1887, April 1, P.L. 17, Sec. 1.
