DEPUTY COUNTY CORONERS APPOINTED Act of Jun. 6, 1893, P.L. 330, No. 269 Cl. 16 AN ACT

To provide for the appointment of one or more deputy coroners and defining their power and duties in the several counties of this Commonwealth.

Section 1. Appointment of deputies

From and after the passage of this act, the regularly elected and duly qualified coroner in counties of this Commonwealth may appoint one or more deputies to act in his place and stead as he may deem proper and necessary. 1893, June 6, P.L. 330, Sec. 1.

Section 2. Powers and duties of deputies

Such deputy or deputies, so appointed, shall have like power to view dead bodies, to hold inquests, to select, summon, and compel the attendance of jurors and witnesses, and to administer oaths. 1893, June 6, P.L. 330; Sec. 2; 1917, July 18, P.L. 1084, Sec. 1.
