

**EMPLOYERS MANUFACTURING CLOTHING, CIGARS, CIGARETTES, HEALTH-SAFETY
PROVIDING FOR**

Act of May 5, 1897, P.L. 42, No. 37

AN ACT

To regulate the employment and provide for the health and safety of persons employed where clothing, cigarettes, cigars and certain other articles are made or partially made, and that said articles be made under clean and healthful conditions.

Section 4. Seizure of clothing made in violation of act
And it shall also be lawful for the factory inspector or any of his deputies, and each and every one of them are hereby authorized and empowered to seize, take charge of, condemn and destroy any or all clothing found that is being made, or partially made, or manufactured in unhealthy or unsanitary places, or where there are contagious or infectious diseases, in violation of the provisions of this Act of Assembly. 1897, May 5, P.L. 42, Sec. 4; 1901, may 11, P.L. 178, Sec. 1.
