## CERTAIN OFFENSES - ARREST WITHOUT WARRANT Act of Jun. 4, 1897, P.L. 121, No. 101 AN ACT

Relating to boroughs, providing a method of procedure for violations of law and borough ordinances, and for the collection of the fines and penalties imposed for said violations.

Section 1. Arrest of offenders on view
The policemen and constables of the several boroughs of this
Commonwealth, in addition to the powers already conferred upon
them, shall and may, without warrant and upon view, arrest and
commit for hearing any and all persons guilty of a breach of the
peace, vagrancy, riotous or disorderly conduct or drunkenness,
or may be engaged in the commission of any unlawful act tending
to imperil the personal security or endanger the property of the
citizens, or violating any ordinances of said borough, for the
violation of which a fine or penalty is imposed. 1897, June 4,
P.L. 121, Sec. 1.
