PUBLIC ROADS, LAYING OUT AND VACATING Act of Apr. 23, 1909, P.L. 142, No. 93

AN ACT

Requiring all petitions for the laying out or vacation of a public road to fix definitely the points of beginning and ending, and requiring the clerk of the court of quarter sessions, in any county, to certify the report of the jury of view to the State Highway Department.

Whereas, The State Highway Department has been authorized to make "a complete survey of all the roads in the State, and shall cause to be made and kept for the State Highway Department a general highway plan of the State"; and

Whereas, In order to have the complete records, it is necessary to show on such plan all roads opened or vacated since the surveys were made; therefore,--

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That hereafter all petitions for the laying out or for the vacation of a public road, in any county of the Commonwealth, shall fix definitely the point of beginning and the point of ending, mentioned in said petition, by giving the exact distance from an intersecting public road, street, or railroad, already opened.
