

HIGHWAYS, APPROPRIATIONS FROM MUNICIPALITIES - REPEALED

Permitting counties, cities, and boroughs, singly or jointly, of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, to appropriate and expend moneys for the improvement of highways outside the limits of such cities or boroughs, for the purpose of connecting improved streets of such cities or boroughs with a State highway or State-aid highway, when the highway outside of the limits of such cities or boroughs is less than one mile in length, and will connect such cities or boroughs with the State highway or State-aid highway.

Compiler's Note: Section 1(c) of Chapter XIII of Article I of Act 192 of 1915 provided that Act 223 is repealed insofar as it relates to boroughs.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the counties, cities, and boroughs of this Commonwealth may, singly or jointly, appropriate and expend moneys for the improvement of highways outside of the limits of such cities or boroughs, for the purpose of connecting improved streets in such cities or boroughs with a State highway or State-aid highway: Provided, however, That the part of the highway to be improved to make such connection outside of the city or borough limits shall be less than one mile in length.
