CHARITABLE INSTITUTIONS REQUIRED TO SUBMIT PLANS BEFORE ERECTING BUILDINGS Act of Jun. 20, 1919, P.L. 505, No. 247 Cl. 10 AN ACT

Requiring certain private hospitals and other charitable institutions to submit plans for the erection of new buildings to the Board of Public Charities for approval, and upon failure so to do to be prohibited from receiving State appropriations, except for maintenance.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the officials in charge of any private hospital or other private charitable institution, except as now provided by law, shall submit the plans, in duplicate, for the erection of any new buildings in connection therewith to the Board of Public Charities for the approval of such board.

Section 2. The said board, upon being satisfied with the aforesaid plans, shall cause the secretary of the board to certify on the plans the approval of the board, one copy of which plans shall be filed in the office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth, and the other copy to be returned to the officials of the institution.

Section 3. Any private hospital or other private charitable institution erecting new buildings, except as otherwise provided by law, without first submitting the plans therefor to the Board of Public Charities for the approval of such plans by the board as herein provided shall not receive any State appropriation, except for maintenance.
