VETERANS' GRAVES, DECORATION OF Act of Apr. 23, 1923, P.L. 88, No. 62

To require counties to cause the graves of honorably discharged soldiers, sailors, and marines to be decorated with flags on Memorial Day.

Compiler's Note: Section 1051 of Act 447 of 1929 provided that Act 62 is repealed except insofar as it relates to counties of the first class.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That it shall be the duty of the county commissioners of each county to provide flags, on each Memorial Day, with which to decorate the graves of all honorably discharged soldiers, sailors, and marines buried within the county. The flags to be used for said purposes shall be of one standard size and shall be purchased at the expense of the county from moneys in the county treasury.

Section 2. The said flags shall be furnished to various veterans' organizations in such numbers as they shall require for their respective communities.

Section 3. The moneys expended by any county, under the provisions of this act, shall be in addition to moneys now required or permitted by law to be appropriated by counties for Memorial Day purposes.
